Rollie Elzey at Churubusco, Rev. Elzey officiating at the single ring ceremony. Mrs. Elzey was the only witness.

For the occasion the bride appeared in a gown of blue crepe and white footwear. The groom wore a brown suit.

Following the wedding the couple went to South Bend to visit with the groom's sister, Mrs. Wm. Bixler.

The bride is a daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Levi Stucky of this place and has a host of friends here. She has been engaged as telephone operator at the local exchange of the Citizen's Telephone Co. for the past several years and will continue her work for the present.

The groom is a son of Mr. and Mrs. Ralph Stout of Bryant and is engaged in business with his father. They operate a filling station at Bryant.

For the present the couple will be at home at the bride's parents.
