Nicholas Stucky, Aged 80, Dies at 11 O'Clock This Forenoon

FUNERAL WILL BE WED. P. M.

Nicholas Stucky, aged 80, died at 11 o'clock a.m. today at his home on South Hendricks street. Death was caused by infirmities of old age and complications, according to his attending physician. Mr. Stucky became ill three weeks ago and failed rapidly. He became bedfast two weeks ago last Thursday and his condition had been very weak the past several days. He was widely known throughout Berne and community.

Mr. Stucky was born in French township, October 12, 1853, a son of Nicholas and Verena Schmucker-Stucky. He spent his boyhood days on his father's farm in French township and on February 24, 1876, he was united in marriage to Miss Elizabeth Augsburger. The couple celebrated their golden wedding anniversary on February 24, 1926 and in November, 1928, Mrs. Stucky passed away.

About 28 years ago, the couple moved to Berne. Mr. Stucky was the proprietor of a bicycle repair shop which was located in the rear of the former Augsburger Five and Ten cent store. He conducted this shop until three years ago when he retired, but during the time he operated the shop he made hundreds of friends.

Surviving are the following children: Rufine Stucky, Levi Stucky, Mrs. John P. Barkman, Mrs. Amos Moser, all of Berne; William Stucky of Monroe and Mrs. Rollie

Elzey of Churubusco. Nineteen grandchildren and nine great-grandchildren survive.

Two brothers and two sisters survive, Peter and Christine Stucky of Berne, Moses of Woodburn and Mrs. C. N. Stucky of French township.

Two children preceded him, Samuel Stucky who was killed in the Kingsland wreck in

1910 and Mrs. John Schindler who died recently. 4 brothers and two sisters preceded, Samuel, Daniel and two in infancy, and Barbara and Catherine.

The deceased was a faithful member of the Defenseless Mennonite Church. The funeral will be held Wednesday afternoon at 1:30 o'clock at the home here and at 2 o'clock at the Defenseless Mennonite church, Rev. H. E. Tropf, pastor of the local

Missionary church, and Rev. Eli Lantz officiating. Burial will be in the church cemetery.

Rev. and Mrs. J. P. Barkman and son Samuel had been living with Mr. Stucky for some time.
