## YOUNG WOMAN SUFFERS STROKE

Miss Emma Nussbaum is Heat Prostration Victim

Miss Emma Nussbaum, daughter of Sol E. Nussbaum of Monroe twp., living several miles northwest of Berne, is the first heat prostration victim reported in this community this year. Miss Nussbaum was working in the garden Tuesday when she was suddenly stricken by the severe heat. She collapsed and became unconscious.

Miss Nussbaum was in a serious condition for several hours and a local doctor was called who gave medical attention. She is reported to be recovering from the attack.
