WEDDING AT PARSONAGE HERE EARLY SUNDAY - Miss Gladys Stauffer is Bride of Martin J. Neuenschwander - WILL MOVE TO CHARLESTON, W. VA.

Sunday morning at 8 o'clock, occurred the marriage of Miss Gladys R. Stauffer, popular local young lady, to Martin J. Neuenschwander. The wedding was solemnized at the parsonage of Rev. C. H. Suckau, pastor of the local Mennonite church. Rev. Suckau officiated at the double ring ceremony. The wedding was a simple but very impressive affair.

Mr. and Mrs. Everett Lehman attended the couple.

For the occasion the bride was charming in a gown of all-white metal cloth, full-length with Russian tunic effects and rhinestone clips. She wore long white transparent velvet gloves, and a white hat made of transparent velvet and metal cloth, in Russian toque style. She wore silver sandals and carried a corsage of Johanna Hill Roses and Baby's Breath.

The bridesmaid appeared in a ? crepe turquoise blue dress with white metallic cowl neck effects. She wore white kid footwear and gloves, and a hat made in Russian toque effects in turquoise and silver metal cloth. She carried a corsage of Premier roses.

The groom wore a suit of oxford gray and the best man a suit of navy blue.

The bride is a daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Daniel N. Stauffer of Berne. She is a graduate of the Berne high school, and has operated the Personality Hat Shoppe here for 11 years. The shop was remodeled after a disastrous fire of almost a year ago. She plans to sell the shop if a suitable buyer can be found. The bride was also employed at the Fair Store for almost three years following her graduation from high school, 3 months at the Y. W. C. A. at Fort Wayne, later at the Grand Leader, and also worked for the late Amos Hirschy for several months before purchasing the hat shoppe. She is well and favorably known throughout this community. She has for several years been very much interested in music and has served as assistant director of the Mennonite Ladies' choir, librarian of the choral society and secretary of the Berne Community Chorus.

Mr. Neuenschwander is a son of Mr. and Mrs. Jonas Neuenschwander of Vera Cruz. He has worked at the piano factory in Bluffton, then worked in a filling station for his brother, G. W. Neuenschwander. Later he served as salesman for an oil company (cut off)
