Mrs. Susan Inniger Kreichbaum, aged 76, wife of Peter Kreichbaum, living 8 miles east of Bluffton, O., died at her home Tuesday afternoon, according to word received by relatives here. Mrs. Kreichbaum had been ill for more than two months, suffering from heart disease. Pneumonia set in recently.

Mrs. Kreichbaum's aged husband who has been an invalid for 12 years, is also critically ill and his death is expected any time.

Mrs. Kreichbaum was born in Switzerland, a daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Chris Inniger. She resided in this community for many years, but moved with her family to Ohio around 1900.

Surviving are the husband and three daughters. Two sons and all her brothers and sisters are deceased.

Mrs. Kreichbaum was an aunt of Abe Inniger of north of town, being a sister to Mr. Inniger's father. The funeral will be held Saturday afternoon at 2 o'clock at the Jenera, Ohio Lutheran Church.
