The child was taken to the home of his grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. William Hohnhaus, 2817 South [word cut off] Street, where Miss Hohnhaus, [words cut off] became the baby's foster mother [words cut off] operation while his mother, Elsie Hohnhaus Randall, lay dying in an Oakland hospital about three months ago, the victim of her estranged husband's wrath. Horation (Ray) Randall, the father, shot his young bride after an argument over expenses of the baby's impending birth. He is serving a life sentence for murder in a California prison.
