Amos Frauhiger was taken to the Wells county jail at Bluffton, where charges of second degree burglary were filed against him. He was arraigned in court at Bluffton today where he pleaded not guilty. He was returned to the Wells county jail. Frauhiger is charged with having stolen 1 quart of blackberry wine from the home of Harry Dubach, in Wells county.

Everett Frauhiger was taken to the Decatur jail. He was arraigned today on charges of petit larceny. He appeared before Mayor Holthouse in city court at Decatur and plead guilty. He was fined \$1 and costs. Young Frauhiger is charged with having stolen a gallon of wine valued at four dollars from the home of Reuben Gerber, northwest of Berne.
