LAD HURT WHEN HIT BY CAR

Kenneth Schwartz, 9, Thrown From Bicycle in Mishap Tuesday A.M.

Kenneth Schwartz, 9-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. Joel M. Schwartz living 2 1/2 miles north and one-half mile west of Berne, was severely injured at 10:30 o'clock Tuesday forenoon when a bicycle he was riding was hit by a car, throwing him to the pavement. The accident happened on road 27, two and one-half miles north of Berne, just in front of the John J. Schwartz home. Kenneth suffered a fractured collar bone, severe bruises to his head and body, a bad gash on his left arm and abrasions all over his body.

The lad was herding cows along the east and west road where they were grazing, and spent some of his spare time in riding on the highway. He was driving north when a car going the same way and driven by a man from Cincinnati struck him. The lad evidently failed to see the car and turned right in front of the machine. The front right side of the car struck him. The boy was thrown several feet, landing on the pavement. He was unconscious for some time, and was rushed to the office of local doctors, and was then taken to his home where he is reported to be recovering nicely.

The bicycle was badly damaged, and the car also suffered damages (cut off)
