Raymond Moser, who is now engaged in the hatchery business at Bluffton, will probably move on the farm and take care of the Moser homestead. Mr. and Mrs. Peter N. Moser will continue to reside on their farm.

Dr. Lewis Sperry Chafer of Dallas, Texas, president of the Dallas Theological Seminary, where Mr. Losier graduated, officiated at the double-ring ceremony. Dr. Chafer conducted meetings at the Mennonite church last week.

Miss Helen Lehman, sister of the bride, and Clair Hitz, of Harrisburg, Pa. attended the couple. Ira and Clifton Lehman, brothers of the bride, also attended them.

The church was decorated with fernery, lilacs and candelabras.

Miss Sybilla Sprunger presided at the organ and played several numbers, after which Paul Beckwith played a piano solo, Liszt's "Liebestraum". Mr. Beckwith and Miss Elda Flueckiger then sang a vocal duet, "Follow Me." Miss Flueckiger also played a violin solo "At Dawning." Mr. Beckwith then sang "Because" and this was followed by another organ solo. The bridal march from
