LEVI MOSER DIES AT HOME EARLY TODAY

Prominent Business Man Dies After 6-Week Illness; Rites Sunday

Levi Moser, aged 75, prominent business man and retired farmer, died at his home on Van Buren street here at 3:15 o'clock this morning, following an illness of six weeks.

Mr. Moser became sick with pneumonia several weeks ago. He.. ill for some time, then apparently was well on his way to recovery. However, complications set in and he was never able to ...his bed, gradually growing weaker again the past two weeks.
