"A"

This is the last will and testament of me Lewis Stanton of
 Kermit in the colony of Victoria former. I revoke all previous wills and
 testamentary dispositions made heretofore by me. I appoint James
 Francis Duffus of Kermit approved James Dredgell and James Downey the
 younger of Kermit approved James (hereinafter called my trustees) executors
 and trustees of this my will. After payment of all my just debts funeral
 and other expenses I direct that my trustees shall pay to my son
 Michael James Stanton the sum of one hundred pounds of lawful money to
 be paid within twelve months of my death. I direct that my trustees shall
 hold in trust for the benefit of my wife Mary Stanton and my daughter
 Catherine Stanton to permit them to have the full use and enjoyment
 and to receive the rents and profits thereof during their lives of all that free
 of land containing somewhat more or less situated in the parish
 of Kermit and known as the homestead and Birrell's paddock and
 occupied by me together with the dwelling and other buildings thereon
 and the household furniture and other effects contained therein with all stock
 machinery and implements thereon and upon the death of my wife
 Mary Stanton then the said with the dwelling furniture and effects stock
 machinery and implements shall become the absolute property of my
 daughter Catherine Stanton, but should my daughter die before my wife
 and leave no children then I direct that the said property be divided equally
 between my daughter Mary Jane and Margaret both survivors of them at the
 death of my wife Mary Stanton. I give devise and bequeath all that piece
 of land containing somewhat more or less in the parish of Kermit
 part of my farm and being the two town paddocks thereof unto my daughter
 Mary Jane Stanton for her absolute use and benefit and I give devise
 and bequeath all that piece of land in the parish of Kermit situated
 on the banks of the Snowy Hill Lake and containing sixteen acres more
 or less to my daughter Margaret Stanton for her absolute use and
 benefit and I further direct that my trustees shall hold in trust for
 my wife Mary Stanton to permit her to have the full use and enjoyment
 and to receive the rents and profits thereof during her life of all that
 free of land containing somewhat more or less in the parish of Kermit and
 known as the tank paddock

the Younger of the same place Farmer jointly and
severally make oath and say

1. That we are seeking to obtain Probate of the Will
of the above named Miles Staunton deceased
2. The said deceased died on the twenty eighth day
of July One thousand eight hundred and ninety
eight at Koroit aforesaid
3. The said deceased left a Will bearing date the
Seventeenth day of December One thousand eight
hundred and ninety four which is as we believe the
last Will and Testament of the said deceased and which
is unrevoked.
4. By his said Will the testator appointed us the said
James Francis Duffus and James Downey the Younger
executors thereof
5. The paper writing hereunto annexed marked "A" is the
true last Will and Testament of the said deceased
as we verily believe
6. The said Will was executed in the presence of George
Swanson Taylor of Koroit aforesaid Bank Manager
and Edwin Randolph Morris of the same place clerk

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with all stocks and improvements thereon and upon the death
of my wife Mary Stanton the said land and
improvements shall become the absolute possession of my daughter
Catherine Mary Jane and Margaret should they be then living or
to the children, if any, of either of my daughters who shall be then
deceased such children to have their mother's share divided equally
between them, and with respect to the remainder of my real and
personal estate I direct that it be divided amongst my daughters
Catherine Mary Jane and Margaret or their survivors or survivors
of them in equal shares. In witness whereof I have hereunto
set my hand this seventeenth day of September 1898

his marks here to as aforesaid the said will was fully read over and
explained to him when he appeared to perfectly understand the same.
