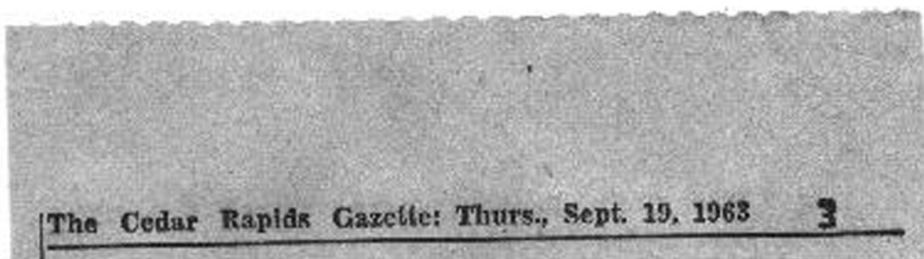

Born Oct. 30, 1878, at Lone Tree, she was married March 12, 1905, to James R. McVicker. He died last July.

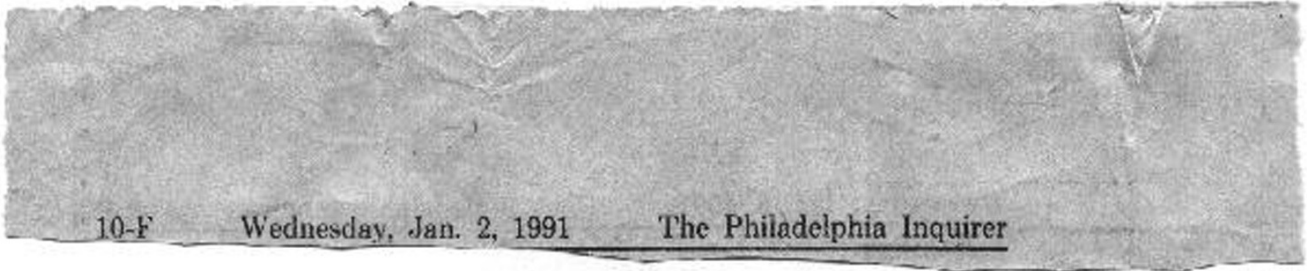

Mrs. Long, whose maiden name was Lucinda McVicker, was born near Morgan Town, West Virginia, April 15th, 1822, and died in Wilton, Iowa, Dec. 31st, 1891, aged 69 years, 8 mos. and 16 days.

On January 5th, 1842, near Woodsfield, Monroe county, Ohio. She was united in marriage to Mr. Corbly Garard. By this union Mrs. Garard became the mother of five children, three of whom are yet living.

The family left Ohio and came to Iowa in 1845 where in Muscatine or Cedar counties they have since lived.

Mr. C. Garard died in Moscow, Aug. 14 1868 aged 51 years. On Feb 14. 1880 Mrs. Garard was again united in marriage to J. E. Long who still survives her. Mrs. Long was a religious woman, she made a public profession of her faith in Christ in 1865 in the Christian church at Moscow. She has been somewhat of an invalid for a number of years, but only within the last year has she been confined to her home. She suffered a great deal, and to be released from her affliction is a thought that modifies the sorrows of those who miss her most. She has gone to that land where the "weary are at rest," where pain and sorrow never enters and where those who love the Lord shall ever dwell in eternal happiness.

Mrs. Lavenia (Clauson) Deal, 94, a widely known and highly respected citizen of Elkins, died Monday afternoon at 1 o'clock at her home at No. 20 Second St., following a serious illness of four weeks.

Mrs. Deal was the widow of the late Simon S. Deal, prominent lumberman of this vicinity for many years. His death occurred October 22, 1963.

Mrs. Deal was born January 24, 1867, in Cumberland, Md., a daughter of the late George and Laanna (Shaffer) Clauson, an old Maryland family. On her paternal side, she was a direct descendent of Capt. Duncan McVicker of the Revolutionary War, while on her maternal side she descended from George Shaffer whose family owned the land on which the city of Philadelphia was later built.

Mrs. Deal is believed to be the oldest living member of the First Presbyterian Church of Cumberland, Md., as she joined that church 77 years ago and maintained her membership there.

On January 6, 1892, in Cumberland, she married Simon S. Deal. Mr. Deal came to Randolph county in 1904, and moved his family here in 1909. He was one of the better known lumbermen in Central West Virginia.

Mrs. Deal was a collector of antiques and her home on Second Street is filled with priceless pieces and articles many of which are collectors items.

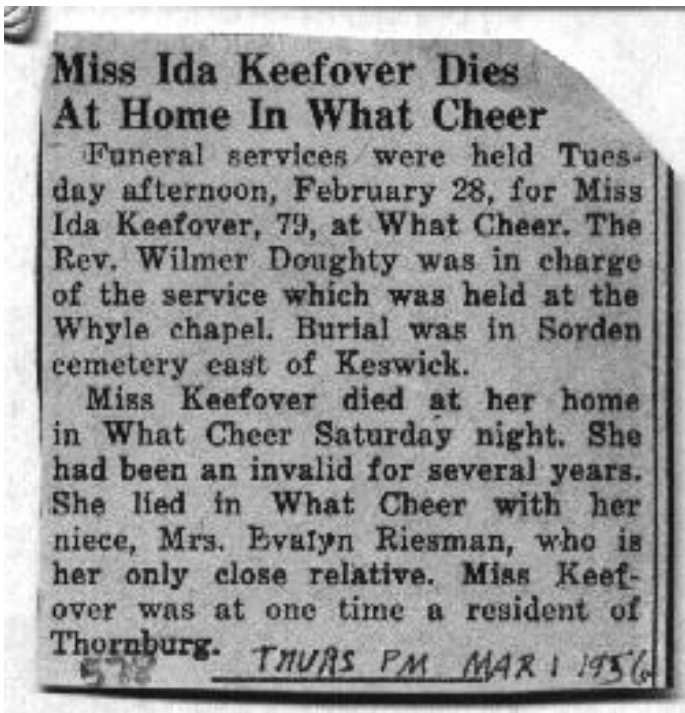

Chief O. T. Custalow, 71, Mattaponi Leader, Dies

KING WILLIAM -- Chief O. T. Custalow, 71, of the Mattaponi Indians, one of the two remaining tribes of the Powhatan Confederacy, died Saturday of a heart attack in a Richmond hospital.

Mr. Custalow, the father of 14 children, was elected chief of the tribe in 1944, succeeding his father, Chief George Custalow. He had served as acting chief eight years prior to that time.

In early 1950, he was ordained a Baptist evangelistic minister at the reservation church, Mattaponi Indian Baptist Church. The action was authorized by the ordination committee of the Dover Baptist Association, and Mr. Custalow was recommended for special evangelical work by a group association ministers who examined him.

Wearing full Indian garb, Mr. Custalow spoke at revival meetings in a number of sections of the state.

He became a familiar figure in Richmond with his annual visits at the State Capitol to present the governor with Thanksgiving gifts.

Leader of about 125 Indians, Chief Custalow made the King William Indian Reservation well known by establishing an

Chief Little Eagle was born on the Mattaponi Indian Reservation. He was the youngest of 10 siblings. He resided on the Mattaponi Reservation until his death.

Chief Little Eagle is survived by five daughters, Eleanor Pocahontas Cannada and husband Alton, Edith White Feather Kuhns and husband Raymond, Dolores Little White Dove Salmons and husband Ralph, Shirley Little Dove McGowan and husband Olsson, and Debra White Dove Perreco and husband Louis; four sons, Dr. Linwood Little Bear Custalow and wife Barbara, assistant chief Carl Lone Eagle Custalow, Ryland Little Beaver Custalow, and Leon Two Feathers Custalow and wife Helen; 24 grandchildren; and 32 great-grandchildren.
