I ALEXANDER MC VICKER OF NAPIER TOWNSHIP, BEDFORD COUNTY AND COMMONWEALTH OF PENNSYLVANIA, BEING SICK AND WEAK IN BODY AND CONSIDERING THE UNCERTAINTY OF THIS MORTAL LIFE, AND BEING OF SOUND AND PERFECT MIND AND MEMORY. BLESSED BE THE ALMIGHTY GOD FOR THE SAME. DO MAKE AND PUBLISH THIS MY LAST WILL AND TESTAMENT IN MANNER FOLLOWING. VZ: I GIVE MY SOUL TO GOD WHO GAVE IT, HOPING FOR PARDON AND REMISSION OF ALL MY SINS THROUGH JESUS CHRIST MY SAVIOR, AND MY BODY TO BE DECENTLY INTERRED IN THE GRAVE AT THE DISCRETION OF MY EXECUTORS HEREAFTER MENTIONED AND AS FOR SUCH WORLDLY PROPERTY AS IT HATH PLEASED GOD TO BLESS ME WITH, I GIVE AND BEQUEATH TO MY WELL BELOVED WIFE JANE MC VICKER AS LONG AS SHE LIVETH FOR HER TO HAVE ALL THE PROFITS AND INTEREST OF THE SAME FOR HER LIFETIME. AND MY WILL IS THAT ALL MY JUST DEBTS SHALL BE PAID IN THE FIRST PLACE OUT OF PERSONAL ESTATE AND EFFECTS. IF MY PERSONAL ESTATE WILL NOT REACH, THEN TO BE PAID OUT OF THE PROFITS OF MY REAL ESTATE, AND MY WISH IS THAT MY EXECUTORS MAY SELL AT ANY TIME MY REAL ESTATE, WITH THE CONSENT OF MY BELOVED WIFE, AND IF NOT SOLD IN HER LIFETIME TO BE SOLD AFTER HER DEATH AND TO BE DIVIDED AMONG MY THREE BELOVED CHILDREN FOR TO SHARE AND SHARE ALIKE. MY BELOVED SON JOHN MC VICKER TO HAVE ONE THIRD PART AND MY BELOVED SON DUNCAN ONE THIRD PART, AND MY BELOVED DAUGHTER MARY DANNIKER TO HAVE ONE THIRD PART AND IF MY SON DUNCAN SHOULD DEPART THIS LIFE WITHOUT HAVING ISSUE, THEN ONE THIRD PART IS TO BE DIVIDED EQUALLY BETWEEN MY SON JOHN AND MY DAUGHTER MARY. AND IF MY REAL ESTATE SHOULD BE SOLD BEFORE THE DEATH OF MY BELOVED WIFE, THE INTEREST OF THE AMOUNT OF STATE TO BE MADE SAFE TO MY BELOVED WIFE AND BY MY EXECUTORS TO HER HER LIFETIME IN THE HAND OF MY EXECUTORS TO BE PAID TO HER YEARLY, AND EVERY YEAR WHICH IS TO BE PAID TO HER YEARLY AND EVERY YEAR WHILE SHE LIVES. Be it remembered that on the eleventh day of August, Anno Domini one thousand eight hundred and thirty two Letters Testamentary were granted to Eli Miller and David May Executors in the foregoing will named they having been first duly affirmed according to the Statute in that behalf made.

In the name of God Amen I Alexander McVicker of Adams township in Bedford County and Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, being sick and weak in body and considering the uncertainty of this mortal life, and being of sound and perfect mind and memory blessed be the Almighty God for the same, do make and publish this my last Will and Testament in words following, vizt I give my soul to God who gives it, hoping for pardon and remission of all my sins through Jesus Christ my Saviour and my body to be decently buried in the grave at the discretion of my Executors hereafter mentioned, and as for such worldly property as it hath pleased God to bless me with, I give and bequeath to my well beloved wife Anne McVicker as long as she liveth you her to have all the profits and interest of the same for her lifetime. And my will is that all my just debts shall be paid in the first place out of my personal Estate and effects, if my personal Estate will not reach, then to be paid out of the profits of my Real Estate with the consent of my beloved wife, and if not sold in her lifetime to be sold after her death and to be divided among my three beloved children for to share and share alike. My beloved son John McVicker to have one third part, and my beloved son Duncan another third part. And my beloved daughter Mary Hannah to have one third part and if my son Duncan should depart this life without having paid his third part she to be divided equally between my son John and my daughter Mary. And if my Real Estate should be sold before the death of my beloved wife the interest of the amount of sale to be made safe to my beloved wife Anne by my Executors to pay her lifetime in the hands of my Executors to be paid to her yearly and every year which is to be paid to her yearly and yearly you while she liveth. And I do make and ordain James Taylor my true and trusty friend and true Duncan McVicker and Son Executors of this my last Will and Testament, nullifying all former wills by me made. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the twenty second day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty two.

And that they subscribed their names thereto as witnesses in presence of the Testator and at his request and the said John Taylor further deposes and saith that he was personally present and saw the Testator subscribe his name to the foregoing paper and the seal thereto.

Witnessed some day before me, John Taylor, James McVicker, Notary Public. Be it remembered, that on the eighteenth day of August Anno Domini one thousand eight hundred and thirty two, Letters Testamentary were granted to James Taylor and Duncan McVicker Executors in the foregoing will named, they having been first duly sworn according to Law. Notary Public.

In the name of God, I Peter O'Neal of Providence Township Bedford County being sound in mind, memory and understanding do make and publish this my last will and testament, as follows. I desire after my decease all my just debts to be paid and my body decent buried and my wife, if she survive me, to have out my apparel, both real and personal during her natural life. And after the decease of myself and my wife, Sarah I give all my real estate and personal estate to be equally divided amongst all my children, except Solomon O'Neal my son, I give him nothing as he has been otherwise provided for. And my son South O'Neal, I give him an equal share with the rest of my children of the tract of land I live on and my personal estate, but any of my other lands more than any of my other children, except one of them, as they have continued to live with me. I desire my Executors hereafter mentioned to sell out my real estate to the best advantage and as soon as convenient after my decease and wife's decease, and convey the same in fee simple. As I have sold a tract of land to my son William, if I should die before I convey the same to him, I hereby empower my Executors to convey the same to him agreeable to the agreement between us. I appoint my two sons John and James O'Neal Executors of this my last will and testament, to carry the same in effect. Witness my hand and seal the 11th day of April 1832.

Note that the above are from the original County Records, made for me.
 The absence of the name CLAY McVICKER may be because as the Will of JOHN McVICKER
 was made on Feb 15, 1886, and that CLAY had been killed in the Civil War, that his
 name was thus not mentioned in the Will as he probably left no descendants and thus
 there would have been no occasion for the mention of his name in the Will.

Note that Official Copy of JOHN McVICKER'S will issued by Probate Court
 to DUNCAN McVICKER as Executor came to me from Dr. Winters Duncan Hamaker among
 papers donated to me from his family--and that the official copy of said Will also
 confirms all of the above entries from the Original Probate Court Records.

I am informed through correspondence from Mendham, Morris County, N. J., that you are a descendant of the McVicker family, three of whom are buried in the Mendham Hill Top Cemetery, as follows:

James McVicker,	b. _____ 1720,	d. Aug. 11, 1800,	80 years old;
Daniel McVicker,	b. _____ 1787,	d. Jan. 30, 1864;	
Mary Reed McVicker, his wife,	b. _____ 1798,	d. Jan. 13, 1840.	

Your report for Mr. Wilbur E. Hagans, 4859 Dorchester Ave., Chicago, Ill., through the kindness of Mr. C. H. Day, of Mendham, has been sent to me (copy) by Mr. Hagans who is interested with me in tracing our early families. He is a descendant of a family, a member of whom, Nancy McCollum, is said to have married my great grandfather, Duncan McVicker (1739-1818). Your report (Jan. 18, 1937) was as follows:

"Daniel McVicker must have had 5 children--if more, I do not know--Ann, Harriet, Catherine, Daniel, and James McVicker.

"The Losays are descendants of Ann, my family of Harriet.

"The Whites of Catherine and there are two children of James McVicker living in Newark--Fred McVicker and Kate Perry--10 White Terrace, Newark."

As above stated, I am a great grandson of Duncan McVicker (1739-1818) and in tracing him I have come to think that he may have been a brother of your ancestor, James McVicker (1720-1800), first above named. Duncan McVicker (1739-1818) as tradition has it came from Glasgow Scotland by the way of North Ireland with three older brothers about 1750 and settled in the North of New Jersey in the Scotch-Irish settlement just South of the Holland settlement.

The James McVicker family (1720-1800), of Mendham, is in the locality where I think that my ancestor may have settled. I am very much interested in learning from you any of the early history, traditions, records, or even your impressions relating to the early settlement of your family or ancestors.

The search is difficult and your points may assist me to localize my efforts so as to have a more intensive research made. I am trying to find the locality of settlement of Duncan McVicker, the records of his marriages, and if possible the records of births of his children. Shortly after the Revolutionary War in which he served in the 2d Regiment of Sussex County New Jersey Militia, he went with his 7 sons and two or three daughters from New Jersey to Bedford County Pennsylvania.

I am also sending you copies of data that may be suggestive and helpful in the search. Briefly commenting on this data:

Page 1 is about my great grandfather, Duncan McVicker (1739-1818).

Page 2 shows that there were several Duncan McVickers, especially in Pennsylvania, and is to illustrate my idea that there may have been more than one Duncan McVicker in early days in New Jersey, so that the Duncan McVicker who married Jean McConnell may have been a different Duncan McVicker than the one who was my ancestor. Duncan was a very common given name among the Scotch, like John and James.

Page 3 is self-explanatory and has some questions right after the list of the three burials of McVickers in the Mendham Hill Top Cemetery.

Page 4 except the first item about a William McVicker of Northampton County Pennsylvania adjacent to Warren County New Jersey, is general and not especially relevant unless as to the item in the 6th item about ARCHIBALD McVICKER and a CATHARINE McVICKER referred to. Archibald McVicker may have been one of the three brothers of Duncan McVicker (1739-1818). However, I enclose this sheet because I think that it will be interesting to you anyway.

Page 5 is a list of New Jersey Sources, some of which have been published and are probably available in New Jersey Libraries. The Offices of the County Clerk and the County Probate Court of Morris probably contain old records of Wills, Land Deeds, Administration, Marriages, etc.

I was interested in your description of the Daniel McVicker homestead which may also have been the homestead of James McVicker (1720-1800). I would like to see this place and the McVicker Brook which you mention. I served as a Scoutmaster in Wisconsin formerly, and I consider that it is a great work. I have principally been engaged in teaching.

I thank you for your good letter and appreciate the former information which you furnished last year through Mr. C. H. Day of Mendham, N.J. Mr. Day sent some valued data received from Miss Nettie Allen, of Basking Ridge, N.J., and from yourself. Mr. Wilbur E. Hagans, 4939 Dorchester Ave., Chicago, Ill., is a descendant of the same McCollum family as the one from whom I believe that I am descended through Nancy McCollum, and his is very much interested with me in the search I have been making from time to time. We would like to find this Nancy McCollum, and she can only be found in New Jersey. She was evidently collaterally related to Mr. Hagans' ancestor, James McCollum (1725-1800), who for a time lived in New Jersey, then in York County, Pa., and settled in Monongalia County, Va. (now W. Va.) Duncan McVicker (1739-1818) lived in New Jersey until he had a family of seven sons and two or three daughters, and then moved probably in the early 1780's to Bedford County, Pa. No trace of his wife has been found there and she probably died in New Jersey before the removal.

514 Record of Wills (Department of State of New Jersey)

Will of THOMAS McCONNELL

In the name of God Amen, the 15 day of January 1777, I, Thomas McConnell, of Bernards Town and County and Province of Essex (Somerset?), New Jersey. Being sick and weak in body but of perfect mind and memory thanks be given unto God, therefore calling to mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament. Principally and first of all I give and recommend my Soul to God who gave it to me. And my body I recommend it to the earth, to be buried in a Christian like and decent manner at the discretion of my Executors, nothing doubting but that I shall receive the same again at the General Resurrection through the mighty power of God, and as touching such worldly estate as it hath pleased God to bless me with in this life I give and dispose of the same in the following manner and form.

Imprimis. It is my will, in the first place, all my just debts and funeral charge to be paid.

Item. I give and bequeath unto Susannah, my beloved wife, the use and profits of the house and plantation on which I now live upon, during her natural life, or so long as she remains my widow, upon the condition of her maintaining my daughter Susannah who has not the exercise of her reason, and also to bring up my daughter Catherine.
