My Dear Uncle

Your let of the third instant came duly to hand. Have heard from Joseph several times since I last wrote you. At present he seems determined to reside at Palmyra. I fear no exertion can prevent the connection you alluded to in your letter. Mr Weston of Canaan, a few days since informed me that Joseph was published. What may be the result I cannot conjecture.

Mr Town of Winslow, the joint agent with Shepard to make the Palmyra Clinton Road, says arrangements are making to proceed instantly to the work. The distance to be cleared is about fourteen miles. He with Shepard had divided the north. Shepard to take the part next Palmyra and himself the Clinton. That he was engaging people to begin immediately. The agents are active, good men and no doubt their doings will be correct.

I have heard nothing respecting the trespass of Mr Kenney. It will I suspect be extremely difficult to discover the real facts in the case.

There are now several executions against Joseph, whom some one of these he will probably be soon committed, should this be the case I shall not interfere without directions from you.

If I can at any time, be of service to you I will most cheerfully obey your commands.
