Genealogy Gems welcomes guests from all genealogical and historical societies to speak on a topic, provide information on the research resources they have available and promote their organization and events.

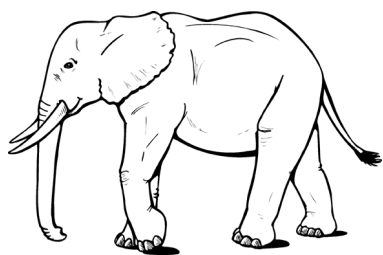

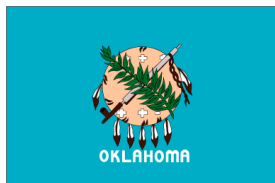

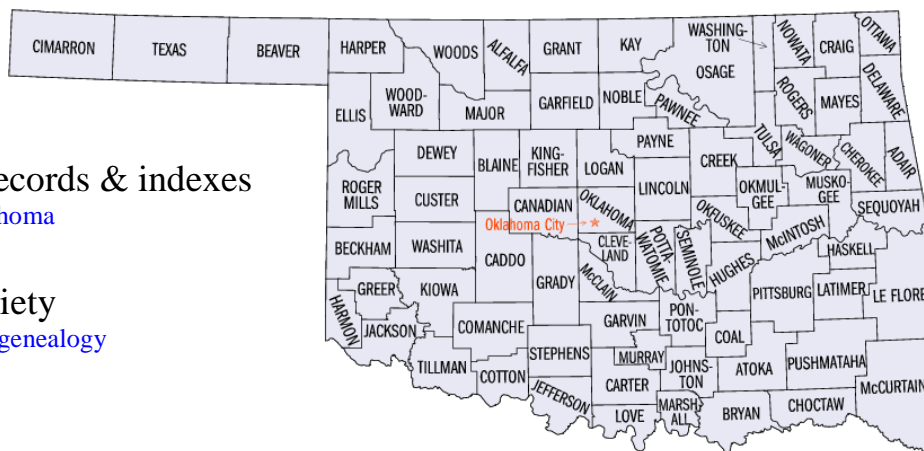
