## WESLEY S. CADY IS CALLED BY DEATH LAST FRIDAY

Again death has called another of the early pioneers of Jackson county in the passing of Wesley S. Cady at his home in this city on Tuesday evening of this week. The news of Mr. Cady's sudden death came as a great shock to his many friends in this vicinity for he had been up and around until a few hours before his death and the sudden summons was a vere blow to his family as well as his many friends for Wesley Cady had been a familiar figure in Jackson almost from the time the city was founded and his absence in the future years will be missed by all.

Wesley Samuel Cady was born in Stabin county, New York, April 6, 1853, where he spent the early part of his boyhood days, coming to Minnesota at the age of sixteen years where he has ever since resided in Des Moines township until about a month ago when Mr. and Mrs. Cady moved to this city where they expected to spend the remainder of their days in peace and plenty. On November 11, 1875 he was united in marriage in this city to Sarah J. Cooper who has been his helpmate and companion all this long space of years and who still survives him. Five children are also left to mourn the loss of a kind and indulgent father as follows: John H. Cady of Eagle Butte, So. Dak.; Burt E., Frank and William all of this county and one daughter, Mrs. Otis Kilen of Wilder, Minnesota, besides an only surviving sister who at Drumright, Oklahoma. resides

Mr. Cady was a gentleman possessed of a most pleasing disposition and the Cady home was always thrown open to friends. During the time he could spare from his farm labors he worked at the bridge carpenter trade and it was while thus engaged about thirty years ago on the big railway bridge west of this city that he fell a distance of over seventy feet and sustained numerous fractures οf body from which injuries he never fully recovered, being a cripple the remainder of his life. He was honorable, big hearted and generous to a fault and will be greatly missed by his large circle of true friends in this vicinity.

Arrangements for the funeral are not yet completed, but it is expected that it will take place from the Presbyterian church in this city on next Sunday, Rev. G. W. Root of Alpha having charge of the services.
