name at the foot or bottom of the said will in manner and form as the same now appears and that such signature was made by the said testator in the presence of this depositor and the said Henry William Burgess and that the said testator then declared the same to be his will and requested this depositor and the said Henry William Burgess to sign their names thereto as witnesses which they accordingly did in manner and form as the same now respectively appear in the presence of the said testator and of each other the before recited words having been first written and intimated as aforesaid and this depositor having also with care and attention more particularly observed the following clause written in and forming part of the sixth part of the said will to wit "Provided always and I do hereby direct and declare that my summe of money or roulterd certain pcamary or other buckles unto upon or for the benefit of my said daughter Elizabeth Dibertine Swift and my said sons Peter Dibertine Burgess and Thomas Burgess the amounts or values whereof I have entered in certain Books of account usually kept by me or by my son George and as I may probably hereafter make other advancements expences or provisions in my lifetime unto or for the benefit of my same or my other Children and my wife also as I am desirous of preserving as far as possible an equality between my said Children in these provisions made by me for them in my lifetime and at my death I do write that view direct that all summes of money amounts or values as shall be in the said Books appear to have been advanced expended or roulterd by me unto upon or for the benefit of any of my said Children respectively as shall be taken and considered in part satisfaction of their said respective parts or shares of and in the said account before mentioned shall remaine a trust money and premises and shall on such division of the said remainder trust money and premises as aforesaid be brought into one pot and accounted for accordingly" the lastly made Date that neither the Books of account or statement referred to or any other Books or memorandum were produced to Depositor and the aforesaid fellow subscribers by the testator or any other person whatsoever at the time of the extraction of the said will & that the said will is now in every respect in the same plight and condition as when extracted and attested as aforesaid — *Wm Thompson* — On Tuesday the twenty-first day of April 1841 the said William Thompson was duly sworn to the truth of the aforesaid affidavit before me *S. Cottages now in the occupation of John Crabb and John Burgess also
give and bequeath unto my daughter Elizabeth Deards and also two other
