As of the day of the meeting there are 1750 Wills indexed; 21,377 Voter Registrations; 60,830 Vital Records; 4547 Funeral Home Records; 775 Naturalizations; 9996 Divorces; and 5872 Obituaries. This brings the total number of indexed records to 105,147! Trish Thompson also had month long stacks of

Chronicle newspapers for 6 volunteers to take home and index.

State Liaison's Report: Carol Elliott presented advance information about the State

Genealogical Conference to be held in September. She updated the group on the First Families project, and said that there will

probably be a 5th edition of the book.

Door Prize: One hour of Genetic Counseling provided by Bonnie Jackson was won by

Marie Melton.
