He was subsequently, in succession, Chief Justice of Grenada, of St. Lucia, first puisne judge of Trinidad, and for the last sixteen years Chief Justice of British Guiana. He served in the West Indies (with but one leave of absence) for thirty-two years. During the entire of his judicial life he sustained an unblemished reputation as a judge, and held the highest character as a lawyer. So long a career of useful and honourable service, unrewarded by any mark of distinction from the Sovereign, is totally unprecedented.
