Hi All,

I have been tied in knots so to speak for over twenty years trying to find data on my great grandfather. And have run into many dead ends. First of all let me give you my problems and what I have run into. The death certificate of my grandfather Thomas Edward Manning, information provided by his son Harry Manning states that his father was James Manning and his mother was Jennie Blanchard and was born on 8 Apr 1863 in Troy, NY. Since about 1900 he called himself Edward Manning. Armed with this I searched the 1870 troy census and came up with only one Thomas or Edward Manning age 7.

This listing said his father was Patrick Manning. After writing for the death record found he was buried in St Mary's Cemetery. With help from a gracious member I learned the other persons of this family buried there.

But to my surprise the Thomas of this family had died in 1908 so a big setback. Figured that my Uncle was wrong on his data for the death certificate.

Looked at the 1870 census again for a Thomas or Edward Manning. Found a James Manning and a Marietta with son Thomas but he was 11 in the 1870 census as the age did not match, if the data from the DC was right, looked in other census years but no listing for a James and Jennie but no luck anywhere.

Then found my grandfather in Saratoga, NY 1900 census listing. This listing, for Edward Manning had his birth listed as April 1870.

Went back to Troy 1880 census and found a Thomas Manning age 1, parents another Patrick and Bridget Manyan. This family was in the 1880 census under Patrick and Bridget Manning with a son Thomas age 10. This Patrick died in 1809 so wrote for his death certificate which said he was buried in St Joseph's Cemetery. There was no Thomas buried in the plot after getting the listing of the persons buried in the plot, lot 22, row 92.

This family was listed with the name Mannin in 1850, Manion in 1860, Maning in 1865, Manyan in 1870, Manning in 1880 and 1900.

This is the same family as all the members names agree through the years of the census'.

Going back to my grandfathers marriage date of 2 8 Sep 1892 in Saratoga, NY. Sent a check and required papers to the NY State Archives in Jun 2004.

The said it would take 6 months to get a reply. In Oct 2004 my check cleared the bank and to this date have not received a word from them. I was hoping it would list his parents name and help me resolve Great grandfathers name. The 1900 census listing for his, Edward Manning, wife and two sons had the correct proven dates. So assumed his was correct also.

The parents name on his death certificate certificate do not check out, neither does his listed birth date. My uncle is not living to question him as are his brothers except one who is now 92 years old and suffering mental problems and not able to communicate.

My only slim thread is that some day I may get the marriage license data for my grandfather.

Any help would be greatly appreciated. Know this rather abbreviated but it has taken me over 20 years to get this far. Not much seems to check out.

If anyone would like the Patrick and Bridgett Manning family census listings from 1850 to 1900 would be glad to send them.

New Bill Will Close Records to Genealogists HR10, which was mentioned in the 13 October issue of RootsWeb Review, has passed out of the U.S. House of Representatives and is now part of S.2845. The amendments suggested by David Rencher in his letter to the bill's sponsor, Congressman J. Dennis Hastert, were NOT incorporated into this legislation. Thus, the terms of HR10 will now be considered by the Senate, as part of S.2845.

If S.2845 becomes law, as now written, family historians will face some real challenges in attempts to obtain birth records, even on long- deceased individuals. Specifically, what genealogists need to do is suggest to their lawmakers the addition of Sec. 3061(b)(1)(A)(iii) that would read: "who is alive on the date that access to their birth certificate is requested."

This addition would clarify that the legislation (soon to be law) applies ONLY to birth certificates of CURRENTLY LIVING PERSONS.

I found this among a bunch of material that I have accumulated over the years. Don't have any idea what the source was, but thought it might be of interest especially to people new to the attempt to find out who they are, and who their relatives are.

Western kinship terminology

Most Western societies employ Eskimo Kinship terminology. This kinship terminology is common in societies based on conjugal (or nuclear) families, where nuclear families must be relatively mobile.

Members of the nuclear family use descriptive kinship terms:

* Mother: the female parent
* Father: the male parent

* Son: the males born of the mother

* Daughter: the females born of the mother

* Brother: a male born of the same mother

* Sister: a female born of the same mother

It is generally assumed that the mother's husband is also the genitor. In some families, a woman may have children with more than one man or a man may have children with more than one woman. Children who share one parent but not another are called "half-brothers" or "half-sisters." Children who do not share parents, but whose parents are married, are called "step-brothers"

or "step-sisters." If a person is married to the parent of a child, but is not the parent of the child themselves, then they are the "step-parent" of the child, either the "stepmother" or "stepfather". Children who are adopted into a family are generally called by the same terms as children born into the family.

Typically, societies with conjugal families also favor neolocal residence; thus upon marriage a person separates from the nuclear family of their childhood (family of orientation) and forms a new nuclear family (family of procreation). This practice means that members of one's own nuclear family were once members of another nuclear family, or may one day become members of another nuclear family.

Members of the nuclear families of members of one's own nuclear family may be lineal or collateral. When they are lineal, they are referred to in terms that build on the terms used within the nuclear family:

* Grandfather: a parent's father

* Grandmother: a parent's mother

* Grandson: a child's son

* Granddaughter: a child's daughter

When they are collateral, they are referred to in more classificatory terms that do not build on the terms used within the nuclear family:

- * Uncle: father's brother, father's sister's husband, mother's brother, mother's sister's husband
- * Aunt: father's sister, father's brother's wife, mother's sister, mother's brother's wife
 - * Nephew: sister's sons, brother's sons
 - * Niece: sister's daughters, brother's daughters

When separated by additional generations (in other words, when one's collateral relatives belong to the same generation as one's grandparents or grandchildren), these terms are modified by the prefix "great".

Most collateral relatives were never members of the nuclear family of the members of one's own nuclear family.

* Cousin: the most classificatory term; the children of aunts or uncles. Cousins may be further distinguished by degree of collaterality and generation. Two persons of the same generation who share a grandparent are "first cousins" (one degree of collaterality); if they share a great-grandparent they are "second cousins" (two degrees of collaterality) and so on. If the shared ancestor is the grandparent of one individual and the great-grandparent of the other, the individuals are said to be "first cousins once removed" (removed by one generation); if the shared ancestor is the grandparent of one individual and the great-grandparent of the other, the individuals are said to be "first cousins twice removed" (removed by two generation), and so on.

Distant cousins of an older generation (in other words, one's parents' first cousins) are technically first cousins once removed, but are often classified with "aunts" and "uncles".

Similarly, a person may refer to close friends of one's parents as "aunt" or "uncle," or may refer to close friends as "brother" or "sister". This practice is called fictive kinship.

Relationships by marriage, except for wife/husband, are qualified by the term "-in-law". The mother and father of one's spouse are one's mother-in-law and father-in-law; the spouse of one's son or daughter is one's son-in-law or daughter-in-law.

The term "sister-in-law" refers to three essentially different relationships, either the wife of one's brother, of the sister of one's spouse, or the wife of one's spouse's sibling. "Brother-in-law" is similarly ambiguous. There are no special terms for the rest of one's spouse's family.

Specific distinctions vary among Western societies. For instance, in French, the prefix beauor belle- is used for both "-in-law" and "step-"; in other words, one's belle-soeur could be the sister of one's spouse, the wife of one's sibling, the wife of one's spouse's sibling, or the daughter of one's parent's spouse. In Spanish, each of the roles that English creates with the suffix "-in-law" has a different word (suegros- parents-in-law, yerno-son-in-law, nuera-daughter-in-law, cuñados-siblings-in-law), but there is a suffix -astro or -astra that is equivalent to "step-".

Another bit of info that may prove useful. As I find these and get around to putting them into the computer I will share them, in the hope that they might help someone get a little further into this fascination study of who we are.

An Ahnentafel (or Ahnenreihe) is a list of a person's ancestors in a particular order. It is a construct used in genealogy to display a person's ancestry compactly, without the need for a diagram such as a family tree, which is particularly useful in situations where one may be restricted to using plain text, for example in e-mails or newsgroup articles.

It is effectively a traversal of the family tree.

After listing the person as #1, you list their father as #2 and their mother as #3, then their grandparents as #4 to #7, and so on back through the generations. In this scheme, any person's father has double that person's number, and a person's mother has double the person's number plus one. Apart from #1, who can be male or female, all even-numbered persons are male, and all odd-numbered persons are female.

As many members of the list know, 29 volunteers from the Troy Irish Genealogy List and the Rensselaer County list have been data entering death records clipped from Troy, NY newspapers that were found in a folder with the Burden Iron Company records collection housed in the Rensselaer County Historical Society.

These records cover the period March 1890 through April 1895.

An update on the project, as of today is as follows:

Out of the 73 pages of records:

- 1. 31 pages, with 2,719 names, have been data entered, proofread and compiled into a data base.
- 2. 6 pages have been data entered and are now being proofread by 3 volunteers.
- 3. 20 pages have been data entered and are now ready for proof reading.
- 4. 16 pages of data are currently being data entered by 10 different volunteers.

The death records contain a wealth of information and should be of great value to researchers. A few random examples are copied below to show you the kinds of information in the death notices and the various locations covered. When this project is done, we may have 5,000 plus records in the data base.
