My George EARLS and Mary Ann MCDONOUGH were both born in Ireland ca 1825. I suspect that they were from the west Galway / Clare area.

By 1848 they were married and settled in West Troy [now Watervliet] in St. Patrick's parish.

Their daughter Eliza Jane married Edward COATES, and this couple settled in Brooklyn.

We know that there were visits to Eliza's family in Watervliet and Cohoes until the early 1920s. But, we haven't been able to reconstruct after the 1880 census. Eliza's 2 sisters, Mary Margaret and Catherine, no doubt married ... and we have no idea of the married names.

Any ideas of what to investigate next would be most welcome.

FYI, the cemeteries don't have records of the parents' burials. [Mother between 1870-75, and father George after 1885.]

Most persons with the surname of Earls / Earles in the greater Troy / Albany area were from England. This Earls line is most definitely from Ireland.
