Dr. Des Norton of UC Dublin to Speak at Ballykilcline Society Reunion '05

The Dublin professor who is analyzing the archive of records from Ireland's Famine-time land agents Stewart and Kincaid will be the keynote speaker at the Ballykilcline Reunion in Strokestown and Kilglass on June 23-25. Dr. Des Norton will speak at the dinner on June 24.

The Society's third Reunion in Roscommon since 1999 will begin with registration at the Percy French Hotel in Strokestown at 2 pm on Thursday, June 23. The informal opening session will begin at 2:30. Nollaig McKeon of the Roscommon County Council will describe the county's heritage efforts. A buffet dinner that evening will take place at 6 pm at the Percy French Hotel.

On Friday, participants will be free to visit the Famine Museum or county heritage center (both an easy walk from the hotel), the county library in Roscommon town, local cemeteries, or pursue private interests. A hosted research discussion will take place at 3 pm at the hotel.

Dinner on Friday will take place at the Percy French at 6 pm. Dr. Norton will speak. Reunion-goers will convene for breakfast on Saturday at 9:30 am at the hotel. The meal is the closing session of the Reunion, which will end by noontime.

Other invited speakers include James Callery and John O'Driscoll, owner and curator respectively of the Famine Museum, and a representative of the Roscommon county library.

The Reunion registration fee, which is non-refundable, is \$100 per person. It will cover two dinners, Saturday breakfast, and the speakers' program. Participants must make their own travel and lodging arrangements for the event.

This is the first Reunion in Ireland since '02 when the Discovery Channel program about Ballykilcline, Famine to Freedom: The Great Irish Journey, was filmed there. The program premiered in September 2003 on the show Moments in Time. We will screen the program during the Reunion if equipment is available to do so

The deadline for registration for the Reunion is April 10. While Society members receive priority for making reservations for several weeks, registration will be opened after March 10 to non-member researchers. If response is extraordinarily high, registration may be limited.

Contact Mary Lee Dunn at MaryLDunn@aol.com for the registration form which has instructions for payment and mailing. The Reunion program has been set so that participation does not require a rental car.

The Society, organized in 1999, is a non-profit organization dedicated to learning about the Famine-time history of eastern Roscommon and tracing members' family lines and histories in several countries. Past Reunions have been held in Strokestown (1999 and 2002); Lowell, Massachusetts (2000); Vancouver, BC, Canada (2001); and Butte, Montana (2004). Members live in the U.S., Canada, Ireland, and England.

The membership dues are \$15 a year, entitling members to two newsletters a year. The Society's Research Committee is acquiring records related to members' ancestry, and to the local history from many sources, including the National Library of Ireland, the National

Archives of Ireland, and local newspapers. The Society has an Internet list-serve through Rootsweb.

Hi Donna, In regards to the THOMPSON,s; in the 1850 census, George was 52 & Catherine was 48. So GEORGE was b.1798 and CATHERINE was b.1802. If they came over in 1833, GEORGE would have been 35 and CATHERINE was 31.

In the 1855 census, GEORGE was b.1799 and CATHERINE was b.1804. If they came over in 1833, GEORGE would have been; 34 and CATHERINE 29.

According to my father; GEORGE THOMPSON was a drummer in the ENGLISH ARMY and was stationed in Ireland, where he met ANNA CATHERINE MURPHY . I would think their parents would have insisted they marry before coming to America. I don't know if it was in ENGLAND or IRELAND. I do know that CATHERINE dropped the ANNA part of her name because it does not appear on either of the census.

I am trying to figure out why my gggrandfather was "out of town" from approx 7/1853 to 6/1854. Wondered if there was some type of work project (RR building, etc.) in the area that would have pulled men away from home. Here is the situation:

In 1850 census, John and his parents were living in West Troy. John, born in Scotland, is an 18yo weaver and is not naturalized.

In July 1853 he married a West Troy girl and they apparently lived in that area.

In the 1855 census, John is living in Watervliet, and it indicates that he has lived in town for 11 months. His wife is listed as having lived in town for 4 years. At the time of the census, they have a 2 month old child (born 3/1855), so apparently he came back around mid-1854, and I assume the reunion was happy as they had several more children in quick succession. He is an axemaker in the 1855 census.

Just can't figure out why he left his new bride for a while unless it had to do with earning a living. (or maybe incarceration?)

Any ideas??

Wow - that is great - All my father's family were buried by the Purcell Funeral Home. From my grandmother's obituary - and the 1880 census I know the Purcell family came over sometime around 1860. This is what I know:

Head of the family: John C. Purcell b. 1832 Ireland Wife Joanna Williams Purcell b. 1835 Ireland Children b. 1856 Thomas Ireland John J. b. 1858 died after 3.10.23 Ireland Alice (my grandmother) b. 9.5.61 d. 3.10.23 Trov b. 1862 Frank Trov b. 1865 Maggie died after 3.10.23 b. 1867 Mary Troy James M. b. 1871 Troy b. 1873 Philip M. Troy William W. b. 1876 Troy

I say 1860 as an approximate arrival date because my grandmother was the first American born child.

The Philip J. Purcell who knew my parents and my father's sisters in Troy was a grandchild of John and Joanna. I know this from a grave marker that was erected in memory of John & Joanna by their grandchildren one of whom was Philip J. Purcell. His grave marker says January 23.1915 to December 20, 1975.

His sister was Mary Purcell Wood, whose husband Charles R. Wood has a marker with dates of October 22, 1912 - March 27, 1956.

At this point I don't know which of the "kids" listed above were the parents of Phil and Mary, but I think Phil and Mary were siblings. Also - the family listed above lived on 4th Street in the 1880 census.

This is probably more information than you ever wanted - but since your daughter is now a Purcell - it may be helpful to someone.
