I have been "stuck" for a few years trying to track down my great grand-Mother, Mary Elizabeth, Margaret Sullivan, born July 4, 1860 in Troy, Rensselaer Co., NY. The family was Roman Catholic. I learned that I cannot order a search of Mary Elizabeth's Birth, because her Birth date is too far back.

I found a Hugh & Catherine Sullivan in the 1860 US Census, and residing in "Troy - Ward 7, Rensselaer, NY" - both parents are born in Ireland - Hugh works as a labourer and Catherine in a grocery store. Their other children are Patrick (b/ England), Dennis, Catherine and a Mary B. (born 11/12) - last 3 children born in NY State. I could not find Hugh & Catherine Sullivan in the 1870 Census for Troy, NY.

>From Mary Elizabeth's Marriage Certificate in Montreal, Qc (1881), to >Daniel

McLaughlin (St.Mary's Church), her parents are stated as Hugh and Catherine Sullivan - at the time of their daughter's wedding (1881) the parents lived in Montreal. From LDS I found a Hugh Sullivan married to Catherine Darragh.

The parents are from Ireland. Via Rootsweb Hugh Sullivan and Catherine Darragh are noted, as one daughter (the only child mentioned) is Anne Burgess Sullivan (b/1877) - she married (1893) Wilhelm/William Nolff/Nulff - I was in touch with someone from the Nulff family - they did not have anything on my Mary Elizabeth or on her parents.

I need confirmation of Mary Elizabeth's birth and her mother's maiden name. Many thanks for your help,

My great grandmother was Mary Langton O'Donohoe. She was the daughter of Mary Keefe (Keefe or O'Keefe) and James Langton. have the street address it is 83 10th Street. James was born in Ireland but I have no idea where. I did order and received his death certificate from the state of New York.

I found a James Langton on the Troy site and believe that this is my g-g grandfather James Langton -- born in approximately 1822 who emigrated from Dublin, Ireland in 1851.

>From the census it says he was a retail grocer. The handwriting on his death certificate was very messy but it looks as if his father's name was Patrick Langton and --- wait until you hear this ---- his mother was ELIZABETH BORDEN (not the Lizzie Borden!) Mary Keefe Langton --- was born in the 1830-s and her father was Richard Keefe and her mother was Annie Clark. I also have the spelling as O'Keefe and not Keefe in other documentation.

Mary and James lived at 83 10th Street. I don't know if the house is still there because on MapQuest it looks as if it's on the campus of Renssalaer Polytechnic Institute. In 1880 three of Mary Keefe's daughters worked as collar makers.

It looks as if relatives lived on both sides of James and Mary.

William Keefe -- I

assume one of Mary's brothers who had a son name Richard Keefe lived on one side and William Langton lived on the other.

Mary Langton O'Donohoe was married in Troy to Dr. James T.C. O'Donohoe of Ireland and they resided in Manhattan. They were married in the 1880s. Mary's parents are buried in St. Peter's.

I have made contact with a distant Langton cousin up there via telephone. I believe this connection was through a sibling of Mary Langton's -- James Langton.

Mary had a father, a brother, a husband and a son all with the names of James! To make matters even more confusing her husband James O'Donohoe's parents are named James and Mary (Corcoran) and of course.....James had a sister Mary.

Other names I've seen in an obituary of Mary's sister Catherine are Kennedy and Dollard -- possibly related but not sure how.

I've never visited Troy but I might possibly visit this summer to take my daughter to visit RPI this summer.

My gr-grandfather, JOHN REYNOLDS, had children MICHAEL and MARIA REYNOLDS with their mother, MARGARET MOONEY, in CO. GALWAY, 1867 and 1869 respectively.

1880 Census record shows their uncle THOMAS MOONEY and his family, including JOHN, and PATRICK MOONEY, his brothers in MANHATTAN.

I have a copy of MICHAEL REYNOLDS' naturalization record, dated Oct. 17, 1888, address is LINCOLN AVE., BRONX (?)

1900 Census finds MICHAEL REYNOLDS living with cousins named MOONEY in the BRONX.

1910 and 1920 Federal Censuses record him as living in YONKERS with his wife and children.

MARIA REYNOLDS apparently married a man named WILLIAM HAHN, and in 1896 had a daughter in BECKER"S CORNERS, BETHLEHEM. We have them on the 1900 Census and the 1905 NY State Census in COLONIE. In 1910, William is listed as a widower and there is no mention of their daughter.

Regarding the note about the grandmother expressions....my grandmother had a ton of expressions. I don't remember the one mentioned specifically but I would guess it is an "Irish Thing." My grandmother was born in NY but was of 100% Irish descent.

If ever asked her age she would reply -- "I'm as old as Ann." to which the asker would reply -- "Who's Ann and how old is she?" --- and my grandmother would reply ---"Well of course -- Ann's as old as I am." We never really did know how old she was until she died in 1990 -- 3 days before her 90th birthday.

Another name to add to the list of the hard to find is that of MARY ANN(E) GEOGHEGAN.

Born Aug. 1864 in Ireland, she was the half sister of my gr grandmother, JANE ANDERSON REYNOLDS (Ballymintan, Co. Roscommon, Moher, Ballinasloe, Co. Galway; Green Island & Colonie, N. Y.) She was listed as sponsor on a baptism register viewed on film in Dublin. The writing was faded and we couldn't read the name of the townland listed as her residence.

1900 Census.. servant for a private family at the WATERVLIET ARSENAL. Troy City Directories.. cook at the PHOENIX HOTEL in Lansingburgh, and cook at LEONARD HOSPITAL, entries around 1911. (Couldn't find her on the census .)

My father and aunts told stories about when my grandfather brought her home to live with them. (Stories complete with the brogue and an imaginary shawl held around the tellers' shoulders.)

Apparently she had some connection to VANDERHEYDEN HALL, capacity unknown;don't know how/where to inquire about those records. She died in TROY HOSPITAL Jan. 1942; have her newspaper death notice and obituary.

There was another Mary Geoghegan who worked in a collar shop about that time.

Sorry it took soooo.... long to reply. I don't really know anything about Catherine Powers other than she was born abt 1865 in Ireland. She came to the US abt 1884. She married Hugh H O'NEILL abt. 1890. She died in 1943 in Troy, NY and is buried in St. John's Cemetery.

I do know that Catherine and Hugh had 4 children I know of:

Willima F b. Oct 3, 1898

Henry J b. abt 1900

Katherine T b. abt 1891 (Married John Sherry/Sheary) Elizabeth V b. 1896 or 1898 (Married John H Vaughan)

William is my gg grandfather. Any connection with your Catherine Powers???? This has been one of my more stubborn lines to follow. Not much is known. I do know they were communicants of St. Augustine's in Troy. I wrote to St. Augustine's several years ago inquiring about this family. They never responded.

To answer an earlier question of yours, the books that I got the info from that I sent you were from the American Canadian Genealogical Society. P.O. Box 6478, Manchester, NH 03108-6478. About 10 years ago I started helping them with their "Repertories" project. They get permission from different churches to go in and photocopy their Marriage, baptismal and death registers. Then volunteers enter all the info into a computer program and then all the info is compiled into these books.

They are quite expensive, but the churches I know my relatives went to are "must haves" for me. I know the Troy library also has copies of these books.

It may be interesting to the TIGS list members to know how these records were compiled.

- 1. Burden Payroll Records TIGS members in the Troy area automated these 17,000 plus records. As the records could not be removed from the Rensselaer County Historical Society, only local TIGS volunteers were able to work on this project.
- 2. Marriage and Death Records The 2,000 plus names in the marriage data base and the 6,000 plus records in the death data base were data entered by volunteers from all across the country. As these records could be copied, we were able to use volunteers from outside the Troy area. Photocopied pages were mailed to the volunteers for data entry. There were 16 local area volunteers and nine out-of state volunteers from Utah, North Carolina, Michigan, Maryland, California, Massachusetts and Iowa who worked on the project.
- 3. The index of the Troy Police Department was compiled by TIGS member Joan Howe.

Currently, some local TIGS members are now working on extracting information on deaths published in the city directories for Troy, Watervliet, Green Island, Cohoes and Waterford. In addition to name and date of death, this data base will record occupation and/or employer, street address, name of widow, etc. Again, because of the availability of the source documents, this project can be worked on only by local people who have access to a city directory in the area libraries.

We are now in the planning and development stages for another very large project which can utilize volunteers from outside the Troy area. Our plans are to scan the pages from the source records and send the data via email to the volunteers for data entry into an excel spread sheet. This project will be announced on the TIGS list when it is ready.
