You may be right. Assisted emigrants, in particular, often were taken to Canada because it cost less. I think there were multiple paths from many points in Eastern Canada down to New England and New York. In his book, for instance, Moran points out that assisted emigrants to St. John in New Brunswick frequently traveled down to Maine and from there many went on to Vermont which had much railroad construction underway in the mid and late 1840s. Rutland became a railroad hub at that time and became tied to Troy and Albany because of the rail lines.
