I read Joan Howes article on collar workers with interest.

Until at least the middle 1950's Midshipmen at the US Naval Academy still were wearing detachable collars held on the shirt with a gold colored stud. Our ironed shirts came back from the laundry with a wooden or white metal stud to hold them in place. Plebes, as a form of punishment for misbehavior, would be fined in "rasputniks", as the studs were called. One metal one, being rarer, was worth five or ten wooden ones. Since plebes tended to hoard them against future troubles, this required one to beg them from upper classmen. That resulted in further humiliation in the form of push-ups or squats, or similar, since the upper class knew one was collecting them for a "fine." A fine in rasputniuks was considered light compared to some other alternatives.

I don't know when they stopped wearing separate collars.

I was interested in his origin in Ireland to see if they knew each other before emigrating. John arrived in New York in October 1855 but I can't find out where he came from in Ireland.

I have yet to do any more research on the Butlers.

As an interesting aside, both John's brother-in-law, Frank McCabe, and his sister-in-law's husband, Robert Truland, were carriage makers in Troy.

Trulan was a first generation Irish-American and I am sure all these people knew each other.

The NYS Dept of Health began its collection of vital records -- births, marriages and deaths -- in 1880. The City of Albany was one of four cities that did not comply until 1914, but a marriage or birth in Troy should be in the indexes.

The cost of a vital records copy is \$22, but I consider it well worth the fee, because it is a photocopy of the original instead of a modern typed form, as often dispensed by local clerks.

Marriage certificates, for example, typically include the names of all parents, as well as the ages, occupations and birthplaces of the marrying couple.

Birth records typically give the names of parents, including the mother's maiden name, as well as the child's full legal name and the number of children the mother has already had. John Quigley's marriage in 1892 or so and the births of their children ought to be in the state's files.

How many people out there continue that yearly ritual of making chili sauce? A year did not go by that our mother's and grandmothers did not do this chore. And chore it was as it took an entire day from early morning to night to complete. Not sure where the practice came from but most of the Irish families we knew followed it. You knew which house it was being made in as the aroma spread through the neighborhood.

I can still recall the spicy smell that lingered for weeks in our house on Burden Avenue long after the cooking and canning was done. My mother, (Mary Elizabeth O'Connor - 1901-1981), labored all day, while we were in school, washing and grinding bushels of tomatoes and peppers and then standing at the stove stirring the mixture for hours while it cooked down. As hot as the chili sauce was from the long red hot finger peppers, my father's, (James Joseph McGrath - 1900-1974), standard comment was "it's not hot enough!". Tell that to my mother who for days afterwards had burning hands and arms from handling the hot peppers and standing over the steamy pot that made sure the burning feeling entered your pores.

My family still makes the chili sauce according to my mother's recipe which most likely came down from her mother. I consider the recipe to be "McGrath's 100 Year Old Chili Sauce Recipe" and I do SHARE it. Two of my siblings, Peg and Bud, make the "recipe" this past week and yesterday it was our turn at our house.

I spent Thursday in the Engel farms field (near Albany Airport) picking a bushel of tomatoes, a bushel of sweet red peppers and a few dozen of the hot finger peppers. The last time I was in that particular field was on September 11, 2001 and the farmer came out to tell me the World Trade Center just collapsed. I was a frequent visitor to the World Trade Center when I worked since the Department of Labor had it's New York City offices there. Being in that same field Thursday brought back memories to me of that tragic day.

I will bring a jar of chili sauce to the next TIGS meeting so attendees can try a taste.

Cod Fish Cakes Recipe

Cod fish cakes are a great duo with beans. Also, a little brown bread would be yummy.

1 lb. of salt cod

4 large potatoes peeled and cut in quarters

3 eggs

1/3 cup of parsley finely chopped

1 tbsp. of onion finely chopped

1/2 tsp. black pepper

Soak cod fish overnight. The next day pour off old water and add new enough to cover the fish. Bring fish to a boil. This reduces the amount of salt in the fish. If after the water boils the fish is still salty change the water and boil again.

Meanwhile cook the potatoes until tender. Mash the cod and the potatoes together. Add the eggs, parsley, onion, and pepper mix this well.

Shape into balls and flatten out to the shape of a patty. Fry them in oil

until golden brown all over. Drain on paper towels.

P.S. If the mix is to moist use flour to dry it up but to much you want them a little moist. If the mix is to dry use another egg to add moisture.
