






Samuel Edward Hutton.



The subject of this sketch is the eldest son of William Hutton and Bridget McGowan. He was born in this city June 25, 1855. With the exception of the interval between 1876 and 1881, when Mr. Hutton resided in New York, he has always made Troy his home. He secured his education at the Christian Brothers' Academy. After leaving school he worked for three years in the foundry of William P. Kellogg & Co. Then he entered his father's employ as bookkeeper and general manager of his large livery establishment. Until recently, when he retired, Mr. Hutton was the senior member of the firm of Hutton & Fennell, cigar manufacturers. The only political office he has ever held was that of Registrar of Vital Statistics, from May 1885, to May, 1888. At present he is president of the Debating Society of the Y. M. C. L. A., trustee of the F. W. Farnam Steamer Company and recording secretary of the Edward Murphy, Jr., Association.
