I was also at Betty's wake and was president of the Troy AOH for three years. My wife and I went in the late afternoon and knew Betty Bott and her kids but not the younger children.

But you are quite right about how little children and grandchildren know of thier ancestors. I was no different and when I finally started looking the ones who could have told me were dead. My maternal grandmother gave me some info but I was only somewhat interested and I presumed when she passed I would have her aunt's DAR application to fall back on. Unfortunately my maternal grandfather threw it and most of her possessions and papers away before the wake was over. On our Irish side everyone (both sides) were from County Cork. I have found Kerry, Mayo and Wexford but no Cork yet. Some were born in the U.S. not Ireland at all. Then there is the confusion of names and who relatives are talking about. My father talked about his grandfather (I don't know which one) being from Duncannon. I have yet to find a Duncannon in Ireland. I have found a Glencannon in Wexford where his grandmother is from but my guess now is his paternal grandfather who in probably referring to North or South Dunkerron in County Kerry. So you to tell the family not only where but who you are talking about. But if the family is not close or you grow up with few or no aunts and uncles it's a problem to search for the family. As you said write it down and put in on the computer.

I don't know if anyone knew Betty and Paddy Elligott who were members of the Troy AOH but Betty was from a small town in Co. Offaly called Clara. Clara is still a small town althovery congested now with traffic compounded by a new sewer line the County Council is installing.

There were several Offaly people in Troy (Brackens, Weirs, Robbins just to name a few). Betty had two sisters, Maisie Hayes (who lived in Albany with her husband Jimmy on Magnolia Terrace) and Bridie and Mike Robbins who were on Orr St. Much of my knowledge of the Troy AOH (and its people) is thru stories I've heard which originated with them.

Betty Elligott was the last of the three sisters and she died in January 2003 I believe. I happened to be in the area then doing some research and went to Betty's wake at the funeral home on Third St. at Washington Park.

Of course I was fully expecting her children and grandchildren to have indepth knowledge of not only Clara but the Offaly people in Troy they might have heard from her. I was hoping to make a few more Offaly connections for the Irish side (who of course have no clue either about where Troy might be -- they think it's New York City!).

I was very surprised to find that not only had Betty's children and grandchildren not heard anything about Clara (very disappointing because Clara just like most of Ireland has a very interesting history) but they actually thought Betty was from Co. Clare! I don't think they had even looked at an Irish map either (and sorry if this sounds like criticism but it's actually just an observation which could also be made about people in Ireland. They often never look at US maps either!).

So I would caution about what family might say regarding where your ancestors originated because it may very well send you looking in the wrong places!.

I would also recommend that you write down, computerize or make some other record of whatever information you learn about your family. Your children or others may not be interested at all at the time you want to tell them the detail but if you've written it down at least hopefully any of your descendents interested in their "Irish roots" will have some more more factual information about their Irish connections!

I knew there had to be a Washington County connection.

You wouldn't believe how many Troy people have relations there (Cambridge, Greenwich, Easton, White

Creek) as well as Hoosick Falls in Rensselaer County as well as over into Vermont including Bennington, Pownall and Rutland just to name a few places).

Not to worry about unnecessary effort. When I'm researching I just pick up all the names in addition to whatever other connections there may be so in reality it's only a few minutes time to add surname detail. I now bring my laptop with me as well as a digital camera so it's much more efficient and time saving than just a few years ago when I wrote everything and then had to decipher my handwriting in re-keying onto a desktop!

If you have the Vermont information let me know as well as the Washington County detail. The area there from Lansingburgh thru Schaghticoke, west in Rensselaer County to Buskirk's Bridge, north to Easton as well as west from there to Cambridge is full of Irish emigrants and connections so I've learned not to discount anything with them. I did in the beginning and then kicked myself because I didn't pick up the information when I could have and had to retrace my steps!

I've been thru the naturalisation records in Washington County (Ft. Edward) for many of them but have lots more to do at some point and I can just add Fallon to the list. I have to go to Bennington and Pownal at some point to look at the Town Clerks' records so it's no problem.

Many of them emigrated thru Canada and down the Champlain Canal, were in Vermont and Washington County and down the Hudson River to Troy.

Fallons are very common in Roscommon and on over into Westmeath and Offaly over the years. I think most of the families had trouble with the British at one time or another!

Thanks very much for the information and the offer.

I thought maybe St. Mary's would be a challenge! I'm looking for Conway, Walsh (spelled Welch, Welsh in earlier Troy records and later corrected to Walsh), Quinn, Flynn and Stanton. I believe Henley (Henly) may also be buried there.

Walsh, Quinn, Stanton, and Henley were from Mayo and Flynn from Cork. One of the Flynns was a police officer in Troy in the early twentieth century. Flynns were also connected to Kewleys (Kewly) in Troy.

Julitta Nial who died in January 2003 was one of the Walsh group (large family in Mayo several of whom went to Troy). It appears from the surname her husband may have been a relation of Lorette Nial? I believe Julitta lived in Brunswick when she died and she was a sister of one of the Stantons who is (was?) in Green Island I believe at that time. (I'll have to check her obituary).

They're also connected (by marriage)to Stapletons in Albia (i.e. Maureen Stapleton). Walshs and Quinns are connected and one of the Quinns too went to Green Island from Troy. As an aside, I believe three of the Quinns wound up in the Boston area -- Jamaica Plain and Charleston.

John Quinn was married to Mollie Rowland Quinn from Mayo. She died in 1999 in Troy and they had no children. She lived on Fifth Avenue. One of the Quinns also returned to Ireland and married a Leydon

(Lydon) from Tuam in Galway where he owned a bicycle shop.

Padraig and Mary Quinn are currently on the Quinn Family farm in Ballyheragh (Cloghans Hill), Mayo with their small children. They went to Boston a few years ago to try to trace the Quinns but had no luck. They had heard about the Troy connection but either didn't know where Troy was or didn't have time to do research there. It seems more likely they didn't know where Troy was located.

I can give you more specific Quinn names and dates.

If you ran across any of them at any time in the future that would be great but there's no rush!

I went to St. Peter's Cemetery a few times but think whoever might be buried there didn't have a headstone.

There's also a connection between Quinns and Quirks (from Ardane in Tipperary) and one of the Quirk's is buried in St. Peter's. There's a very small grave marker I found which can be easily missed.

I did contact the Albany Diocesan Cemetery Office and there's a search fee for each name and with so many of them I thought it best to do my own search!

Ryan and he was a Second Lieutenant, Co. H., 166th Infantry, 42nd (or Rainbow) Division. He was 27 years old when he died. His parents were Mary Frances McAuliffe Ryan and James H. The "Irish naming pattern" is a guide but not a hard and fast rule for all the generations. I would caution against using its literal interpretation because there were people who didn't follow it. It also included the wife's family so the absence of a Nicholas isn't a guarantee it's not the same person or family.

Because of the Irish accent too Nicholas could have been that given name or possibly another. The enumerators would often translate unfamiliar-sounding Irish-pronounced names into something recognisable to them.

In the same 1850 Schaghticoke census there's also a John Phalin as well as John's children children (not with Michael and Nicholas but separate) named James and Patrick.

There was a Michael Phalin (Fallon?) age 30 with the Thomas Butler family in the 1850 Schaghticoke census with Nicholas Phalin (Fallon?) age 24 there too.

Now ages in the census can vary greatly so he's a possibility. The Irish surnames listed in that first 1850 census (and sometimes even the later ones) can be mystifying as to what the surnames might really have been.

Several families from Lansingburgh are included in Town of Schaghticoke information because they share a border and part of Schaghticoke later became incorporated into Lansingburgh. Schaghticoke is just north of Lansingburgh (if you do a mapquest search you'll see it). There's information for quite a few of them in Holy Trinity Church registers(formerly St. John's?).

I've copied many of the vital records at the Schaghticoke Town Clerk's Office and I'll check to see if there's any marriage or birth notation for Phalin. Some of those earlier records didn't survive. I don't have the records with me at the moment but I'll check and let you know.

Thanks for your comforting words Mike. Flying was bad enough. To stay with you and a little humor, her cat was the worst. It's a feral cat, and the only person the cat will go to is my mother. You should have seen me. I had the cat trapped in an upstairs bedroom and had the furniture all upended or topsy turvy trying to trap her to get her into the kennel. I finally gave up and called the local Animal Control Officer to help. He caught the cat with a snare after about 15 minutes. We got to the Vet for the exam and shots, and then I left her there overnight so I wouldn't have the same problem on Friday when we left to pick up Mom at the hospital and go to the airport. The Vet gave the cat a shot which would keep her lethargic for anywhere from 2 hours to 48 hours - time is unpredictable. The attendees were welcomed and the meeting was called to order by the Co-Chairs; Donna Vaughn and Lizette Strait. Donna had prepared and printed for each attendee an agenda for the meeting.

The records contain; pay date, name, occupation and a remarks column (eg. discharged, work notice, gone to NYC, dead, etc.). The project will be termed a Finding Aide and researchers will be referred to the original document.

St. Peters Church Records (Jeanne Keefe) - tabled until next meeting.

Website Update - We now have word from Jeanne Keefe that she will be able to manage our site, so member projects should be forwarded to her.

Speakers - Tabled until the August meeting

Tours - RCHS (Lynn) Members agreed the goal would be to visit the Library and explore the holdings. Since the transcription project is in process we will delay until further notice. Watervliet Arsenal (Bill) tours are available Sunday through Thursday from 10am till 3pm for the Museum on the grounds. There is no heat or airconditioning so it was recommended that we look towards a Sunday in September.

Chat Room - Pat Connors has told Donna that there is a site (bravenet.com) where arrangements can be made for a Chat by the group. Donna is asking anyone that would like to explore it further to do so and let the list know. The list can pick a topic for discussion outside of business and anyone that wants to participate can do so.

Solicitation of New Members (Donna, Lizette) - Notices were posted on several other lists and that is how Carol Waldron joined us. Hopefully others will inquire and attend a future meeting. Lizette will prepare a notice for the Advertiser (local weekly in the area). She will forward to Carol and Donna to proofread.

"History of Troy Police Benevolent Society" by Don Rittner (Marialice) - Tabled until August (Marialice is not in receipt of the book and has left several messages asking for its whereabouts.

TIGS Constitution and Mission Statement - Much conversation on the list preceding the meeting. At the meeting this writer voiced concern that the potential number of drafts

that could be received and need to be reviewed could be extremely time consuming and confusing. After much conversation and a show of hands (8 in favor, 6 abstaining) it was decided to look at the 2 that had been submitted and using one as a guide to form a Constitution. The majority of the group agreed that we will call the finished product a Charter rather than a Constitution. After further discussion the group agreed that the one previously submitted by Pat Connors was the simplier and more to the point. We thank Lizette Strait for the time she took to draw up a template and even she agreed that hers was more cumbersome. We will therefore work from what Pat submitted. A committee consisting of Rich Shea and Lizette Strait will review suggestions by attending members and incorporate the appropriate suggestions into Pats original draft. The completed draft will be presented at a future meeting for comment. That document will be posted to our website for review and comments by the list members.

#### NEW BUSINESS

The Mission Statement, election of Officers, dues, etc., all items discussed on the list recently will be incorporated into the Constitution.

Our new co-chairs for August and September are Jeanne Keefeand Ed Connolly.

Bill McGrath spoke of one of our goals that being to automate local records and get them on line. It appears we are finally headed in that direction with our Burden Iron Works project.

Marialice and Lynn reminded the group that the list is made up of many different people with different outlooks. Listers should be sensitive and thoughtful with messages posted to the list.

The group agreed to call for a roll call to get a better idea of how many participating members we had of the 54 on the list and also to put together a summary of surnames being researched by the list and the location of the list members to see how widespread we are. Frank Ryan came prepared with statistics.

He has saved every E-mail to the list outside of the first few weeks. He informed us that there were 49 people who had posted and out of them 2 had only 1 posting and 9 had 2-3 postings. The rest were actively participating. Those are good numbers and show we have strong participation and interest out there.

Donna had taken an informal survey of postings concerning the formation of the Constitution, role of list members, election of officers, dues, chat room and location of the meeting. These items have been addressed in these minutes except the location of the meeting. Obviously this is an issue better addressed by those that attend the meeting. The majority of the meeting attendees felt that we had progressed with more formalization of the meeting so that a change in location is not crucial to the group right now. We have access to a private room at Mahrs and will verify that we can reserve the room for future meetings. We will place our food order and ask not to be served until 7:15. That will give us an hour to conduct the meeting and we believe that is ample time.

However if an attending member can arrange for a more formal setting (library, meeting hall, etc.) we are more than willing to entertain a change in location. We are trying to balance the different wishes of the attendees, conduct business that will move us forward and still maintain a friendly "want to be there" attitude.

Genealogy Table - Donna Vaughn shared Surrogate Court Indice's that she purchased on E-bay. Donna has posted a description to the list and has offered look-ups. This writer asked Donna to bring the books again to the next meeting as time was short by this time in the evening. Donna also brought her mother's

1946 Bridal Book to share. The book is obviously a treasured momento for her but from a genealogy standpoint a crucial document listing wedding attendants and other vital information concerning her parents wedding. Frank Ryan brought a copy of the "Eastwick Press Newspaper" that contains excerpts from a 1839 diary. Bill McGrath brought a notebook containing his Family Tree Charts.

Bill was also asked to bring them to the next meeting again due to time constraints.

Open Genealogy Forum - Lizette Strait gave a 15 minute presentation. She introduced herself as a "Hobbyist Genealogist" and the ancestor of an immigrant. She had prepared well and had visuals to go with her talk. She described America as a melting pot containing many different make ups. Although her ancestors were not from Troy

she notes the similiarities between Worcester, MA to Troy. Worcester, like Troy, was an industrial city containing much cheap labor to keep the factories running. She has worked her genealogy from herself backwards and gets excited everytime she finds a "skeleton". Her talk was laced with seriousness and with humour and was much enjoyed by those that heard it.

Donna and Lizette both thanked the group for giving them the opportunity to co-chair the last few months and wished the incoming co-chairs luck.
