

William and Mary Ely Johnson

William Anson Johnson b. 23 November 1837 Portage Co., Ohio. He married Mary Ely b. 13 Sept 1843 in Morrow Co., Ohio the daughter of Robert and Harriet Stout Ely in Bryan, Williams Co., Ohio in 1862. He died in Tedrow, Fulton Co., Ohio in 2 October 1918. My undestanding is that they lived for many years in Tedrow. He and his wife are buried in the Tedrow Cem. Mary died on 26 Sept. 1928 in Tedrow Fulton Co., Ohio William's parents were Bennett B. Johnsonb. 1803 Bridgeport, Conn. and his wife Nancy Bailey according to William A. Johnson's Bible. Bennett died in Ohio in 1870

Mary Ely's family

Her father, **Robert Ely**, was born 16 May 1805ca in Northumberland Co., PA, He died on Feb. 17th 1865. On his tombstone it has

"They that sleep in Jesus will God bring with him".

Her mother, **Harriet Stout**, was born 10 Sept 1807ca in New York or New Jersey. She died on 19 July 1853. On her tombstone it has "Blessed are the dead that die in the Lord".

Robert and Harriet were married 26 January 1831.





He was of the 6th generation of our Van Possen lineage in America. He was born Jan. 12, 1817 at Dearborn, Michigan. He was a son of William Van Possen and Mary Ann (Sloss) V.F. He married Clarissa Ely on Pob. 18, 1869 in Williams Co., Ohio. She was born April 21, 1851 in Morrow Co., Ohio. She was daughter of Robert Ely (who died Pob. 17, 1865) and Harriet (Stout) Ely (who died July 19, 1863).

William Abner and Clarissa had four children: Harriet Janc(b.Nov. 26, 1869) Alvin Ulysses(b. Mar. 27, 1872) Mary(b.Apr. 8, 1874) Iva I.(b. Feb.11, 1876)

William Abner was engaged in farming in Lagrange Co., Indiana, from which place he enlisted on July 4, 1862 as a private in Co. G, 88th Ind.V.I. 2nd Brigade, 3rd Div., 14th A.C. On April 30,1865 he was promoted to rank of corporal. Dec.9, 1863 he was confined to hospital in Chatanonga, Tenn. He was in different hospitals at various times during his service career.

He took part in the battle of Perrysville and Stone Mountain, Clarissa (ELY) Van Fossen picture taken in 1916

and numerous other engagements. He participated in 44 battles and skirmishes; received many special honors for unusual bravery; and was awarded the Congressional Medal of Honor "for extraordinary bravery and gallantry above" and beyond the call of duty."



He was with General Sherman, on his raid from Atlanta to the sea. When he died at his home in Williams Co., Ohio the cause was stated to be "consumption caused by exposure while in the Army". He had two brothers who also were in the Union forces during the Civil Wax (John Wilson V.P. was with the 5th Independent Co., Ohio Volunteer Sharpshooters and Thomas S.V.P. was with the 195th Regiment, Chio Volunteer Infantry).

Clarissa (1v) V.F. also had two brothers who served in the Union forces (have not identified their units at this time): Ezra R. died in hospital in Raleigh on Jan. 10,1862 from measles, and Joseph returned home after the war. A grandfather of Clarissa served as a Colonel in War of1812.

William Abner and Clarissa were both interned in the cometary at Edon, Ohio. William Abner died Sept. 14, 1877.

Clarissa died Feb. 13, 1923.
