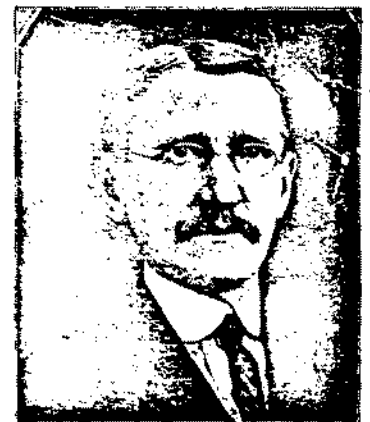
Proprietors of the Popular Restaurant on Market Street
