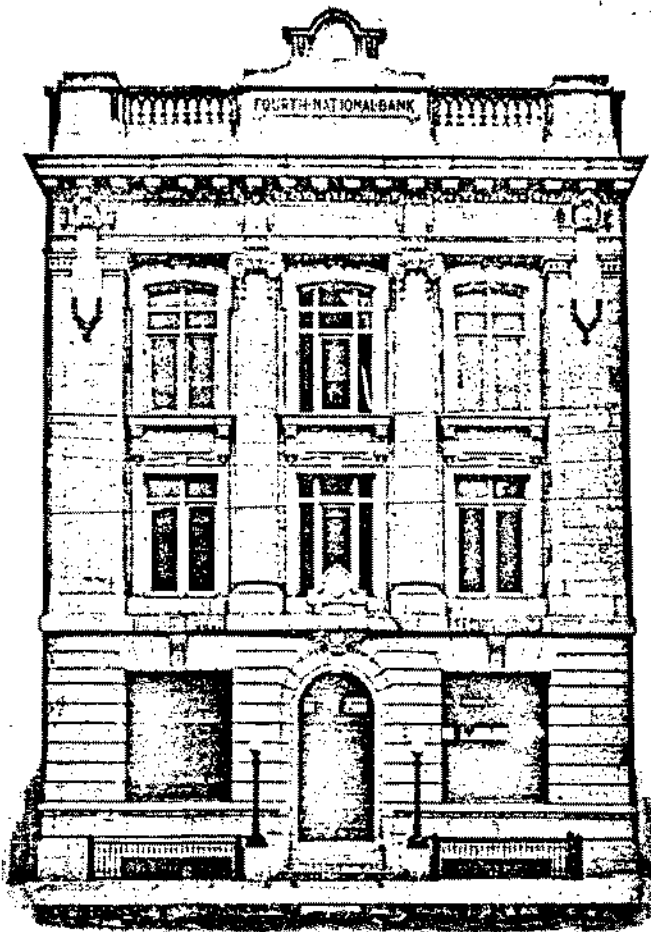

THOMAS A. SCOTT

The subject of this sketch is a native of the county and was born in Cadiz. He learned the jewelry trade under his father and conducted the jewelry store of J. W. Scott's Sons, which had been established by his grandfather in 1819. He also started a branch store in Uhrichsville, continuing in the business till 1901, when he closed the Uhrichsville store, retired from the business and accepted a position with the Chisholm-Scott Company. Soon after the death of Mr. Chisholm he was made manager of the company, and still holds this position. With the exception of six months in Baltimore he has always lived in Cadiz, and now with his wife and daughter resides in a handsome house at 210 West Market street. Mr. Scott has always taken an active interest in the affairs of Cadiz. Has served as Town Treasurer, as Chief of the Fire Department; started the second Building and Loan Association of Cadiz, and was secretary and manager of the gas company.
