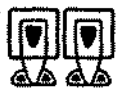


Hauling Loads of Peas to Waukesha Canning Co., to be Threshed by Viners. A Daily Scene During Season

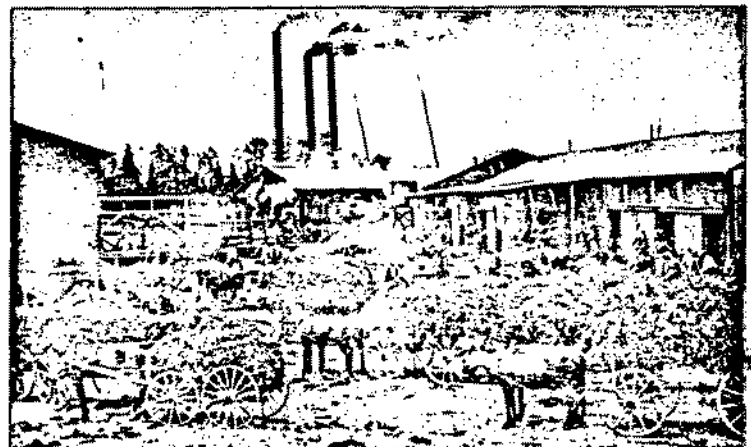

Scott, the latter now decreed by the Smithsonian Institute in Washington one of the one hundred most remarkable inventions in the history of the world. The viner and separator makes possible the cultivation and harvesting of a pea patch of 500 to 600 acres, something unheard of a few years ago. Pea culture today in certain sections of the United States is becoming the chief business of the farmer. He drills in anywhere from 100 to 600 acres. When ma-



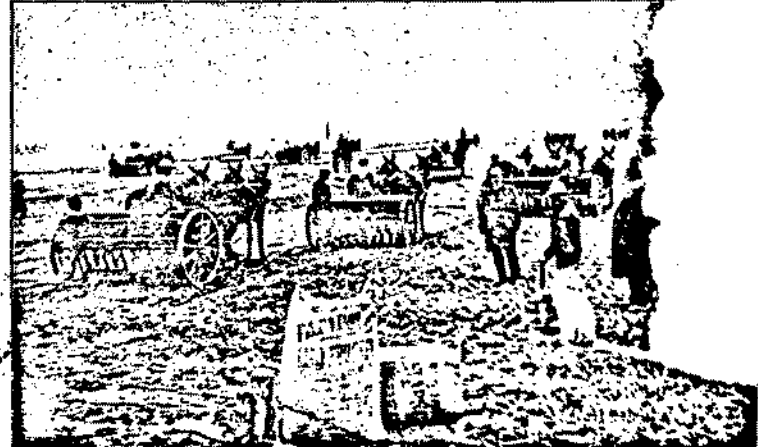
tured he mows them as he does his clover, hauls pod a vine to the canning factory as he would haul hay. Two or three men with forks feed them into the Scott viner a separator; and lo! they are hulled, sorted and the pea hay is at the growers' disposal.

The man who has wrought this miracle in the field of agriculture and made a new world of commerce in Harrison County and resides in Cadiz, Ohio. His factories are at Niagara Falls and Baltimore, Md. alone, however, as inventor rests the fame on R. P. Scott. Though his inventions are many, his interest his talents extend to other things. He manufactures automobiles in Baltimore. He is a stockholder in four national banks of Cadiz, and a director is the owner of the Cadiz Manufacturing Company plant is in Cadiz. For a number of years president of the Canning Machinery and Equipment Association. He also finds time to encourage improvement, to travel and to investigate. His name is well known and his recent gift of \$10,000 to Ohio State University is only one generous act many with which his name is linked.
