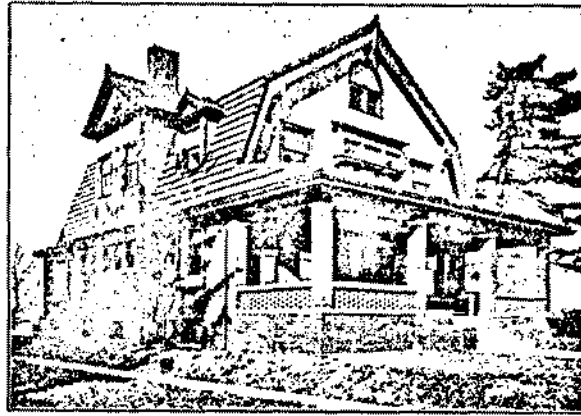




RESIDENCE OF EDWIN M. LONG, LINCOLN AVE.



RESIDENCE OF EMERSON W. LONG, DEWEY AVE.

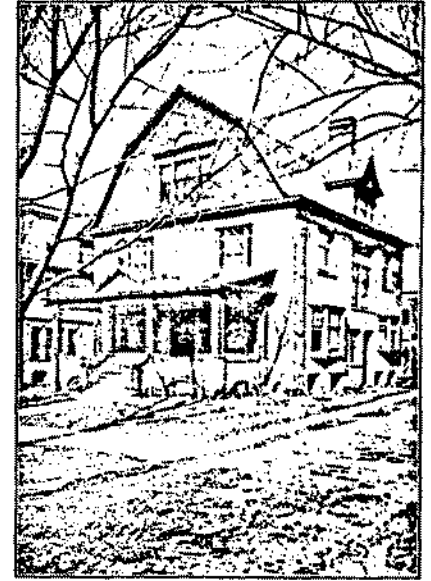

The well known lumber and builders' supply dealers of Cadiz and the enterprising, progressive builders and general contractors, whose work may be seen in all parts of Harrison county and elsewhere.

One of the most distinctive as well as the most important enterprises in Cadiz is that of E. M. Long & Sons, wholesale and retail dealers in lumber and builders supplies.

The founder and senior member of the firm, E. M. Long, was born in a log cabin in the western part of Harrison county; first began business in Bowerston as a carpenter and builder in a small way. Industry, enterprise and a natural ability for his work enabled him to forge to the front, building churches, business houses and some of the pretty homes of Bowerston and country around. In 1889 he was awarded the contract for building the Children's Home, which is the admiration of all who see it, and which did much to impress upon the people that Mr. Long was master of his art; again in 1893 was let to him the general con-

tract for the erection of the new Court House. He then located in Cadiz. In 1895 he purchased the business of Crew & Hanna, and engaged in the retail lumber business and supplies, in addition to contracting. At this time his son, E. W. Long, became a partner, and the firm of E. M. Long & Son was formed. In 1900 A. C. Long, a second son, was added to the partnership, and the firm then became E. M. Long & Sons, and has ever since continued.

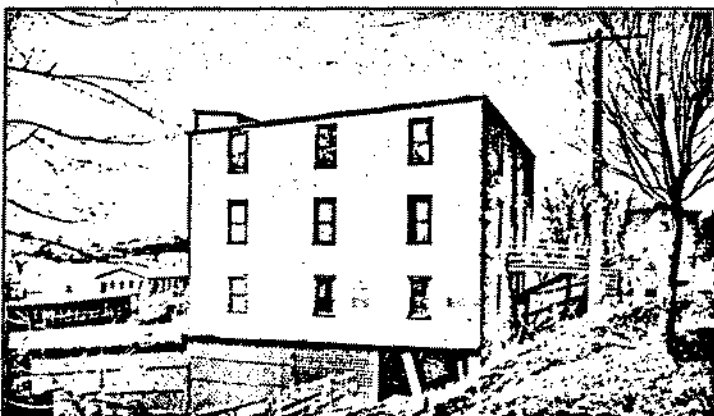
The wholesale business was established in 1902, catering to the wants of the retail lumber and supply dealers in Ohio, Pennsylvania and West Virginia, making a specialty of Pacific Coast products, such as Fir Gutter, Columns, Shingles, etc., distributing this from Cadiz. They also manufacture at Cadiz Colonial Columns, interior finish and a general line of mill work for the trade. Their jobbing line covers Dexter Portland Cement, Building Blocks, Roofings, Brick, Lath and Plaster, and shipping direct from the mills to the dealers. At present their wholesale trade extends as far west as Chicago, south to Tennessee, east to New York

and north to the lakes. Their territory is covered by competent salesmen working in direct connection with the Cadiz offices.

A great many of the pretty residences for which Cadiz is now famous were built by E. M. Long & Sons, as well as the Sheriff's house and jail, the Fourth National Bank building, Wood & Wrigat block, the Frank College building at New Athens, the Harrison County Infirmary and the Cadiz High School building.

The Messrs. Long are interested in the Hogg & Long addition, formerly belonging to the Chauncey Dewey estate, an attractive sub-division with paved streets, sewers, light and water including a residence park. They are also interested in many local enterprises, directors and stockholders of the Cadiz banks, and ever among the first to advance the interests of Cadiz and enhance her beauty.
