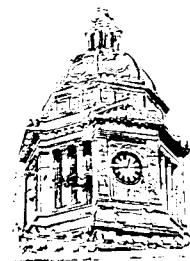

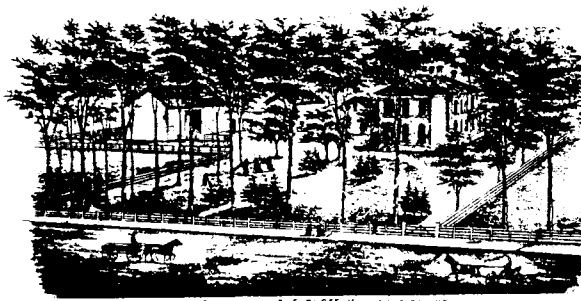
I hope you will send us copies of your records for our new Richland County Room. It is a good way to advertise the families you are researching and to find others interested in your families.

The Special Income Tax

The following is from a newspaper article dated 28 Dec. 1864 now in the Richland County Room at the OGS Library. It was donated by Mary Jane Henney.

A good deal of surprise is manifested by some persons at the exorbitant rates of the income tax of 1863. This is caused by the passage of a law by Congress, in July last, providing for a special levy of 5 percent in addition to the 3 percent, being a total tax on incomes over \$600.00 for the year 1863 of 8 percent. This only includes the year 1863, after which it will be 5 percent.

This special of 5 percent was intended for the payment of military bounties, thereby stimulating enlistments and thus reducing local bounties and avoiding drafts altogether.

If any men should think that the tax is rather "rough" on them, they will bear in mind that it is not so rough as it would be to shoulder a musket and discharge the duties of a soldier in the field.

Published below is a list of the persons who have incomes in the excess of \$600.00 per annum and the amount of this tax.

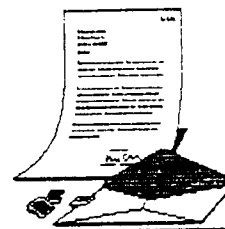

### German Colony From Hamburg is Established in Mansfield

Mansfield News - early in the year, 1923.

"Mansfield has a Hamburg colony which will soon number 33 people, when the ones now on the Atlantic Ocean arrive.

"The nucleus for this Hamburg colony was due to Jacob L. Wolf, 33 Cedar Street who died a few months ago. Mr Wolf had come to America from Wandsbeck, near Hamburg, Germany. He settled in Mansfield and through his thriftiness, he accumulated property. Wishing to give other people an opportunity to enjoy the opportunities he experienced in America, Mr. Wolf bought 18 prepaid tickets and sent them to relatives and friends in Hamburg.

"Mr. Wolf did not live to see all these people arrive in America. The people whom he brought over, have made it possible for others to come. Soon the colony will number 53 people, all from Hamburg.

"Daniel Simon, steamship agent, says these new citizens are well educated people. He predicted they will make good citizens and will be a credit to Mansfield. The Hamburg colony will be a memorial to Jacob L. Wolf." We have a request for info about this colony. Send info to The PASTFINDER.

### The Adams - Bodley and the Pioneer's Rest Cemeteries

In 1976 a letter came to my attention about the above cemetery. Since we have persons who have recently written about some of the persons buried there - it is pertinent today. The letter is dated August 17, 1976 and was written by a Mrs. Donald R. Wilson. In it she made some corrections and additions to the Pioneer Rest Cemetery.

" The name should read SHAVER instead of Haver. On the stone the names Maud and Shaver are very clear, but I am still not sure after a number of readings, of the initial for the mother or the year of death. However, I think it may be G. Maud, daughter of J. and G. Shaver, and that the G may stand for Gennett, wife of John Shaver. She d. 2 Sep 1867, aged 30 years, and may have died in childbirth, the baby dying five months later. The given times would be about right.

"The graves of two Bodley girls - whom I have not yet identified - are to the left of Maud's grave, and, still farther, in the same row, are the graves of Charlotte Shaver and Hannah Shaver. I do not yet have the Shaver family completely clear, but John and Hannah, each of whom died at age 91, were related to the Bodley family, Hannah being a sister of my husband's forebear, Levi, and of William, the Revolutionary soldier buried in Adams-Bodley.

"We revisited the Adams-Bodley Cemetery this month, and I confirmed my previous reading of a stone there. Joseph Wilson, b. 10 Apr 1795, d. 13 Aug 1842, aged 47-4-3. He mar. Blandinah Brink, daughter of Jacob and Elizabeth Brink, bur. near by. Three Wilson children are buried there, also. In your transcription they are given as ch. of Joseph and Blanche. However, three of us studied the stones carefully. Two the children are given as 'the child of J. and B. Wilson.' On the other one - very clear and unmistakable - 'Sally Jane child of Joseph and Blandinah.'....

"Blanche was another daughter of Jacob and Elizabeth Brink, and she married Henry Bodley. In the Owasoo Church records, which I called to your attention, she is given as 'Baucha' which I have concluded from

other records is the Dutch form of Blanche.

"According to Jacob Brink's will (Rich. Co. OH AR11 p. 64), Henry Bodley and Joseph Wilson were named executors.

"Now, a couple of questions: Can you give me the name of someone in the SAR in Ohio to whom I might write for further information regarding the grave of a John Henry Bodley located immediately beside that of William Bodley in the Adams-Bodley Cemetery? Both graves have the bronze marker of the SAR and they look as though they had been placed there a number of years ago. Miss Florence Danner of Plymouth who has made quite an extensive research in the area (she is related to most of the old families) believes that this is the grave of John Henry Bodley, brother of William. However, any inscription on the stone itself has been entirely eroded, and the only possible identification lies with the records made when the SAR placed the marker on both graves.

## THE FORD FAMILY

One of the earlier families in Richland County, Ohio was the Ford family. The family held reunions and the Ashland Times Gazette gave an excellent account of one of them. The date of this article is unknown but it is probable that the year is that of the dated letter that follows.

In an early letter from a J. W. Ford, he states: "Stephen Ford was born in the year 1764 or '65; married Ruth Stevenson and located in Jefferson County, Ohio, raised a large family of children of whom Thomas and Joshua came to Richland County in the year 1829 (both Knapp's and Hill's History of Ashland Co. OH say they came in 1819.) Thomas located at Savannah, building a horse mill with which he ground the grain for the neighborhood, and some years later removed to Auburn, Indiana.

"Joshua located one mile east of Adario, then an unbroken forest. To them were born fourteen children, eleven reaching man and woman's estate and ten living at this date with a host of children and grandchildren."

John Cusey wrote:

Farm City, Illinois

June 15, 1896

"There were three Ford brothers, Thomas, Stephen and Benjamin, who started out from Virginia to grow up with the west. Thomas and Stephen drifted into the North West Territory and settled in Jefferson and Belmont counties. The reunion is...almost all of Thomas and Ellenor Holland Ford's family.

"There were born to them ten children whom I knew personally.

Elijah, who lived to be a good old bachelor and then married a lady whose name I fail to remember.

Elias who married Elizabeth Parks for his first wife and Miss Sarah McClintic for his second. Mary who married Thomas McConnell.

Sarah, my mother, who married Job Cusey. She raised fifteen children to man and woman estate. She, with Father and family, moved to New London in the spring of 1832. From there they moved to McLean County, Illinois, where five of her children were born. In the spring of 1856, they went to Humboldt, Iowa and from there to bloody Kansas to assist in making it a free state. She died in bloody Kansas, Oct. 11, 1895, aged 92-6-11.

Belinda married George Beemer. Good soul who waked up the children in the middle of the night to feed them. (He was a great feeder.) (sic).

Elizabeth married one of Alexander Campbell's first apostles, my school teacher, John Bryte. Rebecca married Joseph Bailey. She, with her husband, moved to Kansas and died there.

Susannah married John Bailey, a twin brother to Rebecca's husband. She moved to Indiana and died there.

Thomas U. Ford married a Miss Hill for his first wife. His second was Miss Anderson, a schoolmate of mine, and his third wife was Mariah Paultin.

The youngest child was John who married Wesley Barnes daughter, Harriet.

"Grandfather and Grandmother Ford, besides raising their own children raised two boys, Samuel and Eph Cole. Samuel married a cousin, a Miss Ross.

"Stephen Ford's children that I remember were:

Thomas, who lived near Savannah on the old Dick Freeborn farm just west of Savannah, and Joshua. Their home was one in which the preaching was done by James Hanney and Zephaniah Bell, who spoke of his experiences in verse -

'Come all ye that wonder at me and my ways,  
And with much astonishment on me do gaze.'

"I am in my 75th year and Hannah in her 71st year. Our makeup is western and we are known here as pioneers. There are but few left. My last visit to Ohio was in 1855 and there were living of the Ford family, Belinda, Elijah, Elias, Rebecca, Elizabeth, Thomas and John.

"With pleasant memories and love for all, I am yours.

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**MRS. MATHIAS DAY**

**Semi Weekly Herald** - September 21, 1861

"We learn that Mrs. Day, wife of Mathias Day, sen., of this city, while on her way to Vermont, met with a serious accident. It appears that her husband and herself had taken passage on a boat at Cleveland for Buffalo, and that while going to the dining saloon, Mrs. Day fell down stairs, injuring herself severely. An examination by a physician resulted in the discovery that the neck of the thigh bone had been fractured. Mrs. Day is quite an aged lady. She remains at Cleveland up to the time we write, her situation being so precarious that it is feared to remove her."

## THE INDIANS OF RICHLAND COUNTY

- and their connection with Lucy Bigelow Armstrong

From the Life and Letters of Judge Thomas J. Anderson and Wife - James H. Anderson , L.L. B. 1904.

The last Indian Reservation in Ohio was that in Wyandotte County, near Upper Sandusky. The Indians of Richland County, particularly the ones east of the small village of Mansfield, had been sent to Upper Sandusky during the War of 1812. In the early 1840's the last remnants of the once proud tribes marched south to the Ohio River, where they embarked on boats to take them to the Reservation that had been assigned to them. This story tells a bit about what happened to some of them - especially one heroic woman, Lucy Bigelow Armstrong. Lucy, daughter of a Methodist minister, married John McIntire Armstrong, one of the Indians who had lived at Greentown, Richland County, Ohio. John was an educated man who became a lawyer after studying in Mansfield with other young lawyers, among whom was John Sherman.

John and Lucy had played together as children and both attended the Seminary at Norwalk where they realized their attraction to one another. From then on, they were inseparable.

Beyond the Missouri, the Delaware Indians had a good opportunity to reciprocate the kindness shown them in Ohio by the Wyandotte. When the latter reached the Indian Territory in July 1843, the civilized members of the tribe were dissatisfied - not with their Reservation of 148,000 acres of choice land, but with its remoteness, savage conditions and wild warlike neighbors.\* So the once poor, despised Delaware, came to their rescue and sold them a part of their own valuable Reservation, 24,960 acres of fine, rolling land, at the confluence of the Missouri and Kaw rivers, near Kansas City, on a part of which Wyandotte City now stands. But Warpole, the celebrated "War Chief" after whom the Masonic Lodge in Upper Sandusky, Ohio, was named, and those who shared his views, and adhered to the ancient customs of the nation, settled on the Wyandotte Reservation in the Indian Territory. Warpole, an honest man, and an eloquent speaker had great influence with the "unconverted" and all who stood by the traditions of his race.

When in Kansas, in 1857, I called to see a Miss Sallie Driver, who lived in Wyandotte City, a beautiful Indian girl 19 or 20 years old, to whom my wife had given me a letter of introduction. She had been educated in Ohio, where she had many prominent relatives, and was not only refined, but cordial in her manners, and a most winning personality. Together we made calls on several Wyandotte families who knew my father. While we were at the house of Mrs Nancy Garrett, a sister of Gov. William Walker, formerly of Upper Sandusky, and the widow of George Garrett, in came Miss Warpole, a young Wyandotte squaw of great size and stature. She arrested my attention immediately, for she was the daughter of Warpole, the noted chief, fully six feet tall, and her toggery and appearance unusual and striking. Her garments were made of nicely tanned, soft, yellowish doeskins, that resembled chamois, embroidered and loudly decorated with tassels, beads, ribbons, the plumage of birds, and with pearls, silver and gold. She was no doubt dressed in the height of Indian fashion; and to me her unlooked-for apparel, including head and foot gear, was altogether gay and stunning. She had just arrived from the Wyandotte Reservation in the Indian Territory, then considered a place for savages, and when introduced by Mrs. Garrett she scarcely condescended to notice me. "She is proud as Lucifer," said Miss Sallie, "and as foolish." I shall never forget Miss Warpole, her picturesque appearance, in the Indian cabin, in the Wyandotte forest, near the Missouri River, on that bright summer morning in 1857....

....The most saintlike and eloquent (missionary) was Rev. Russell Bigelow+, appointed in 1827. He died in 1835, at the early age of 42, before his fame had attained its zenith, but was probably the most effective pulpit orator in the state (Ohio). Bigelow Chapel in Columbus was named for him. (As was the small Methodist church in Brown Twp., Knox County, Ohio. There was also a Bigelow Chapel west of Mansfield near Ontario. Editor)

"John McIntire Armstrong of the Wyandotte nation, who was educated at the Norwalk Seminary, and a member of the Ohio Bar, married Lucy, daughter of Russell Bigelow. Mrs. Lucy Bigelow Armstrong, in a letter to me dated June 1, 1889, says of her husband: "His mother named him after John McIntire, who married her cousin, Sarah Zane, of Wheeling. John McIntire and Jonathan Zane were the original proprietors of Zanesville, Ohio. My husband John McIntire Armstrong was born October 7, 1813, near Mansfield, Ohio. He was a lawyer, read law under Judge Stewart, at Mansfield and was admitted to the bar by Judge Burnett in April 1839, at Cincinnati. Was the nominee of the Whig party of Crawford Co., Ohio, in 1839, for prosecuting attorney, and ran ahead of his ticket. He was one-eighth Indian. His only ancestor who had Indian blood having been

his maternal grandmother who was one-half French and one-half Wyandotte....

The Wyandotte started from Upper Sandusky, for the west the 6th or 7th of July 1843. One boat arrived at the western line of the state of Missouri, the 28th day of July, the other, the one on which my husband and family traveled, the 31st, the day I was 25 years old. I was not with the nation when it started, but was at Bellefontaine, visiting Mr. Armstrong's sister, Mrs. Dawson, and other relatives. I joined the nation a few miles from Bellefontaine...." Mrs. Lucy B. Armstrong was born July 31, 1818 and died December 31, 1891.

In her letter to me of June 1, 1889, she says: "Irwin P. Long is the most prominent Wyandotte now living of those who were grown up when the Wyandotte moved to Indian Territory in 1843. He is now Head Chief: was 71 years old last December. Silas Armstrong, always prominent, died December 14, 1865, almost 56 years old. His son Silas Armstrong is counselor and is 47 years old. Francis A. Hicks, Tauroome or John Hat, James Bigtree, Sr., George I. Clark, Henry Jacques, James Washington, Rev. Squire Grayeyes, and his brother Doctor Grayeyes, Warpole, Matthew Peacock, Matthew Mudeater, Matthew and Joel Rebitaille, James T. Charles, John Summerfield, Bearskin, Sarrahas, Francis Driver, David and Jacob Young, John Hicks, Sr. and his sons Little Chief and John Hicks, Jr. and Little Thunder, were prominent men in the nation when the Wyandotte ceded their lands in Ohio and moved to the west. Lewis Lump-on-the-head, married Rebecca Peacock; both are dead." She says further that in Kansas, her husband was U.S. Interpreter, taught school, carried on farming and at the time of his death he was engaged in litigating Indian claims."

\* It was a mixture of tribes who lived at Greentown, Richland Co. OH. When the War of 1812 started the pioneers feared the Indians would help the British, so the militia moved them from Greentown to the Wyandotte Reservation northwest of Richland County. Since the majority of the local Indians were Delaware, they were grateful to be taken, accepted and assisted by the Wyandotte. Thus, when the Wyandotte did not like their newly assigned land in the Kansas Territory, the Delaware were happy to return the kindness shown them earlier.

+ Russell Bigelow was one of the early Chaplains at the Ohio State Penitentiary. After his death his wife and family lived northeast of Mansfield.
