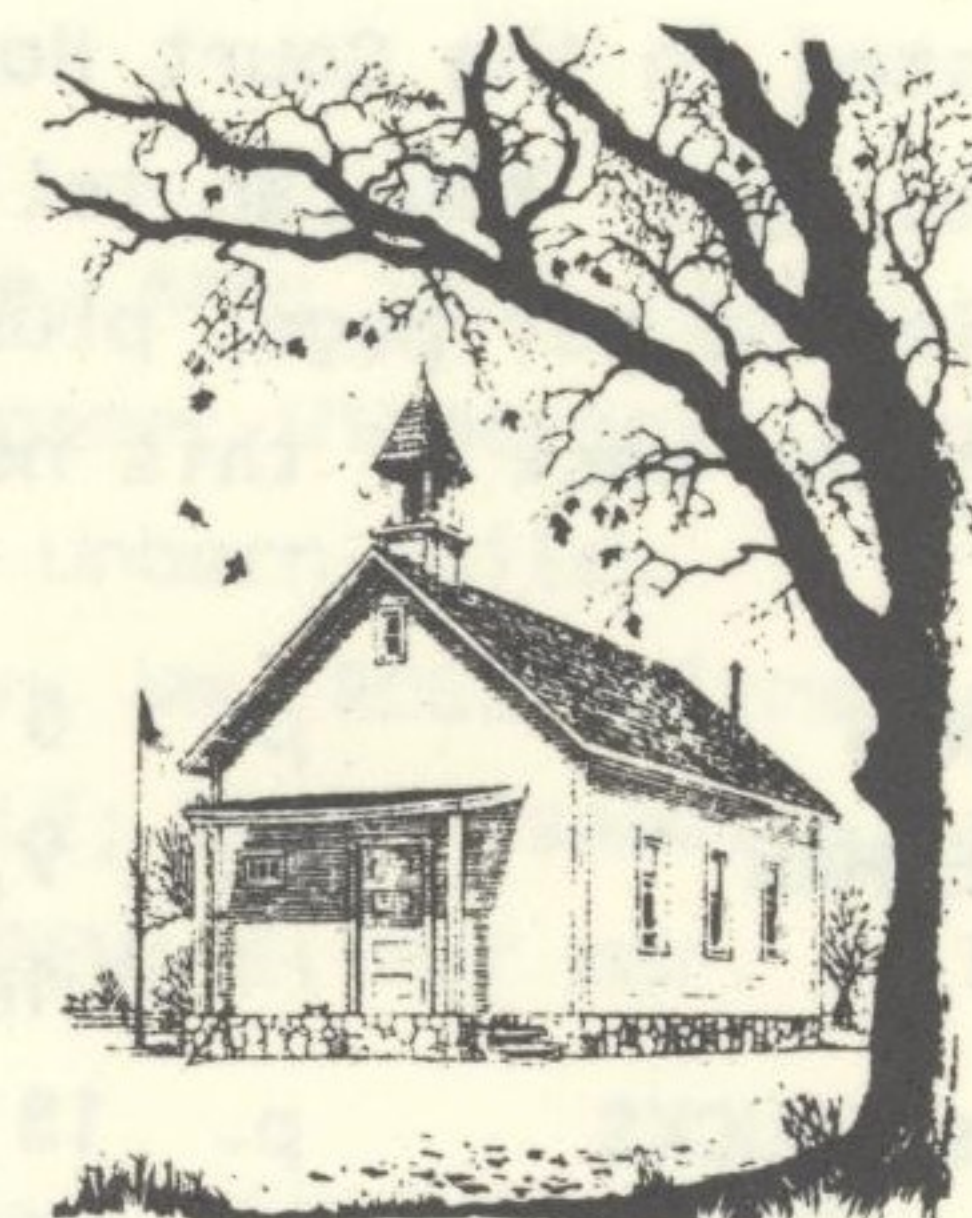

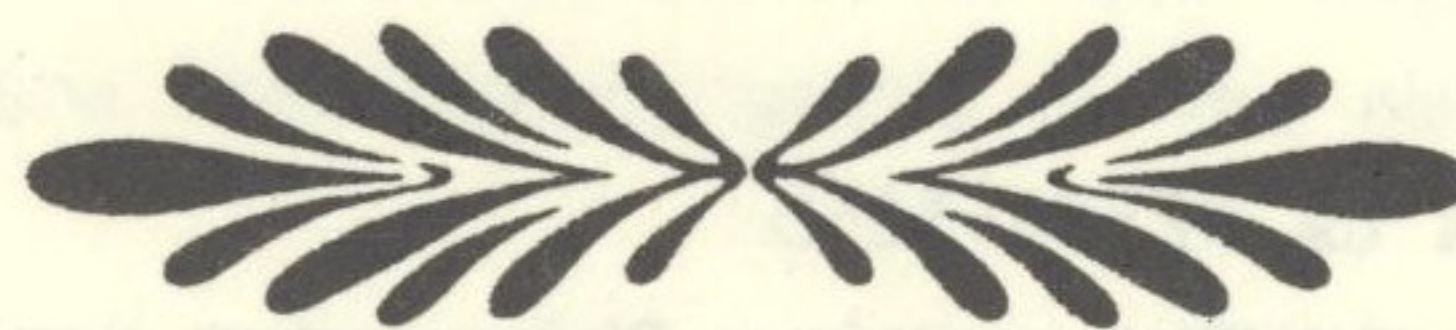

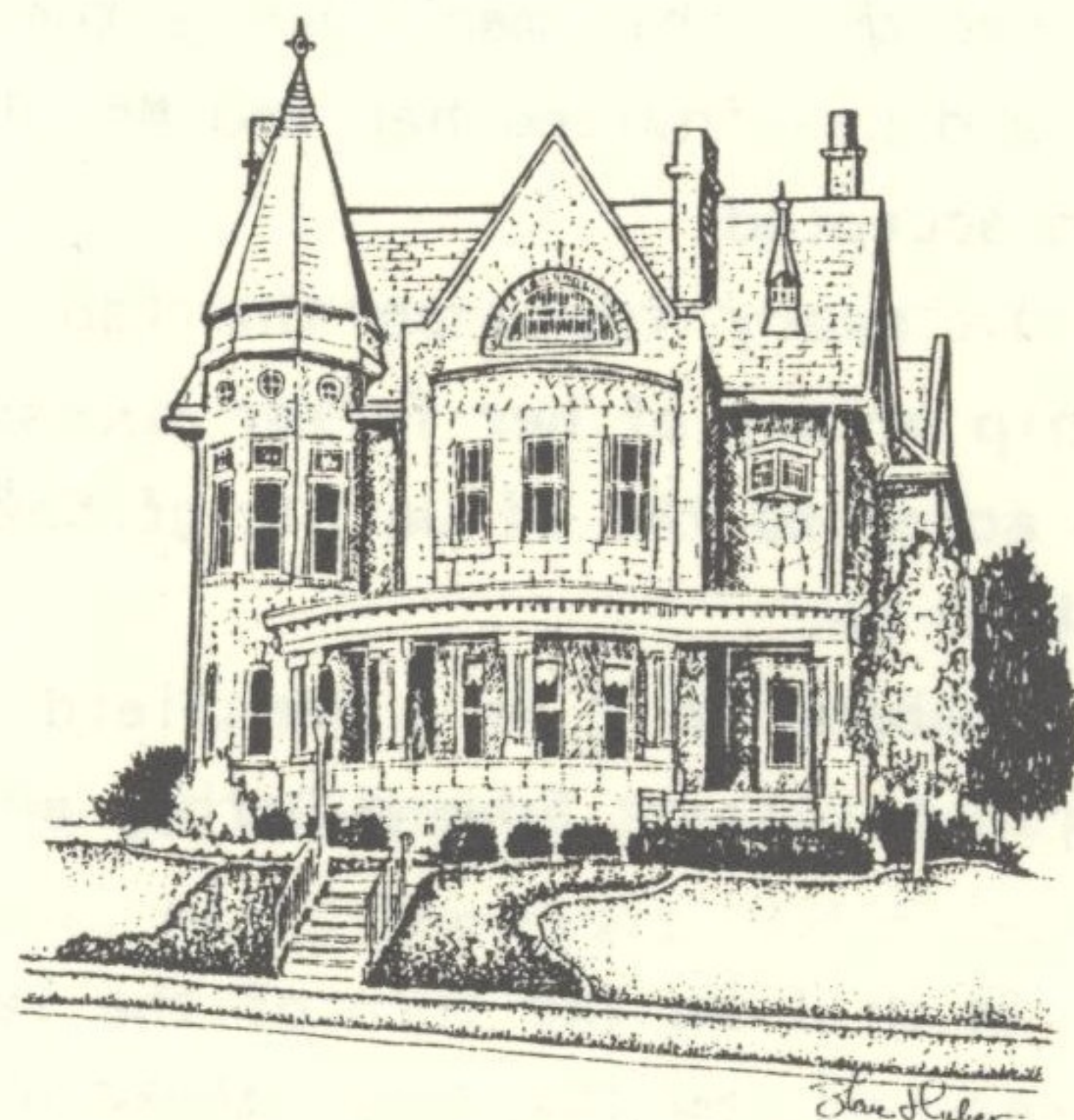
THE FUQUA FOUNDATION NEWS

MULTIPLE MARRIAGES - Her Sixth Husband

Semi-Weekly News - Mansfield, December 29, 1896

A New York special under date of December 27, gives the following rather unusual story:

The marriage of Mrs. Eleanor B. Linter to her sixth husband will occur Tuesday at the Church of the Emanuel in Providence, Rhode Island, and four of her ex-husbands will act as ushers. The entire martial batch would have been present, but the fifth man met with an accident last week and is confined to his bed.

Contrary to the ordinary run of such affairs, the lady and all her former husbands are on excellent terms. They are also great friends of Augustus Thistlewood, who is to be the abundantly married lady's sixth husband. The future Mrs. Thistlewood was Miss Eleanor Riblet when she was first married. Her husband was a Cleveland, Ohio man. He is the one who is unable to attend the wedding, but he has sent her a wedding present and has invited her and Mr. Thistlewood to spend their honeymoon at his place, an invitation which has been accepted.

In every instance the lady has obtained a divorce without opposition and without losing the friendship of any of her former spouses. She convinced them all that they were not well mated and every one of them accepted the situation gracefully and retired respectfully with proffers of assistance at the time when called on.

Husband No 2 is a Mansfield man, Arthur K. Singleton; No. 3 is Hiram E. Krimp, of Rochester, N.Y. The fourth is Albert Edward Derby, an Englishman, and the fifth is Walter E. Devenish Linter, of Newcastle, Penna.

It will be the turn of the last to take office as president of the Eleanor Club which was organized a few years ago by the first three ex-husbands, each of whom has served a term as presiding officer. None but men who have been husbands of the lady are eligible for membership. They dine once a year and their ex-wife is never absent from the annual dinner in her honor. The dinner for 1896 would have taken place earlier, but was deferred until Monday next before the wedding.

The bridegroom-elect would like to be present, but the iron clad rules of the society bar him out until he becomes an ex-husband, and when that will be is not now known. The average term of Mr. Thistlewood's predecessors was 10 months. There are no children. None of the ex-husbands has married again.

They will act as ushers at her wedding, and at the meeting tomorrow night it will be moved and voted that at all future weddings of this lady the club will act as ushers; also, as pallbearers in the event of her death. ■

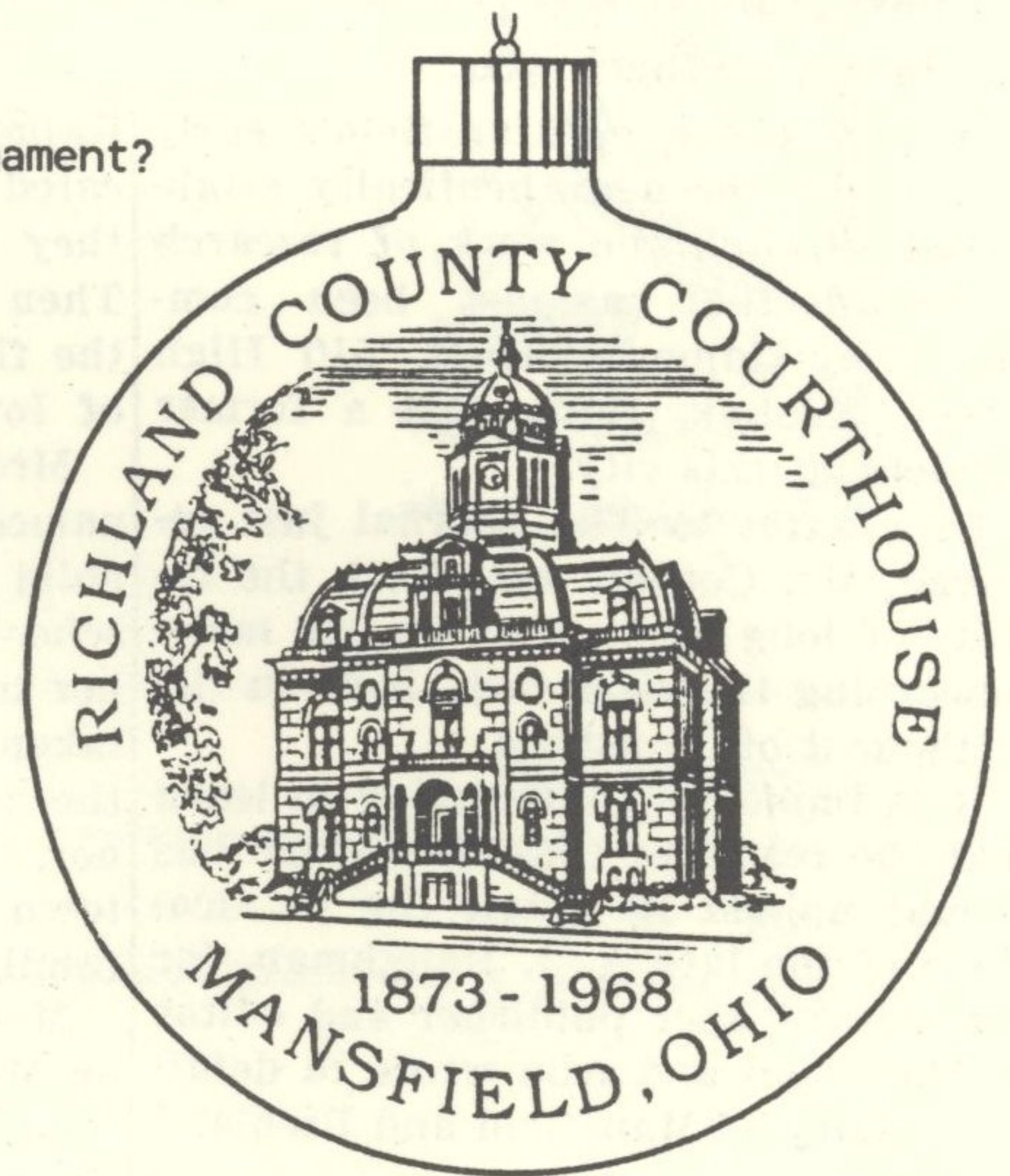

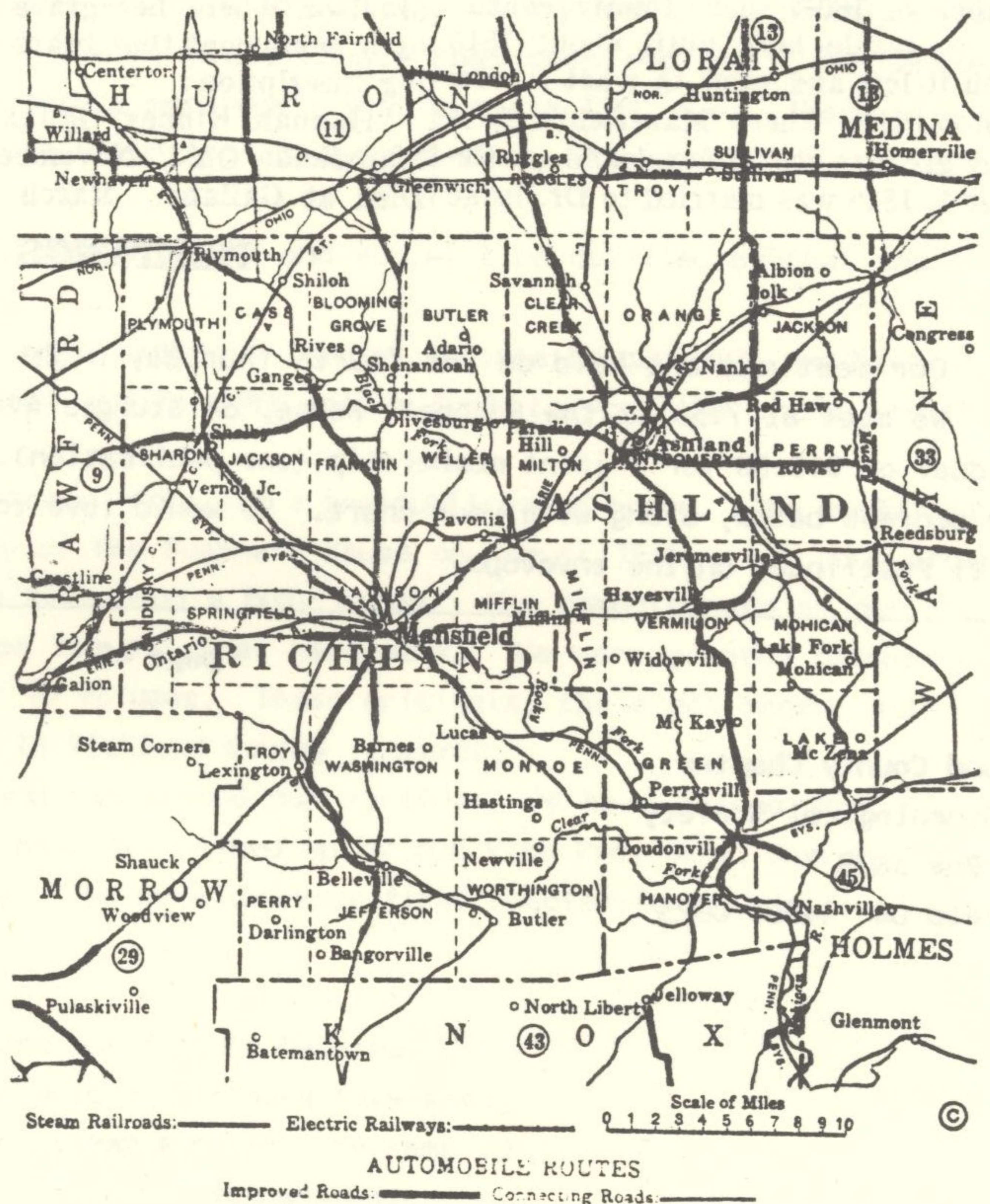

A new phase of Mansfield's early history has been authentically established through the work of research of records that has just been completed by James Corbett, 510 High street, Keokuk, Iowa, and a former resident of this city.

In a letter to The Journal just received, Mr. Corbett sets forth the results of long study that he has made concerning the first child born in the settlement of Mansfield.

It is immensely interesting to learn that the result of these investigations should uphold in detail the publications of the late A. J. Baughman, for years newspaper publisher and editor in Mansfield and who wrote in detail the history of Mansfield and Richland county.

In his letter to The Journal, Mr. Corbett asserts that the first child to be born in Mansfield was Hannah Kinney, daughter of Peter and Eleanor Pierce Kinney who was born November 5, 1807. The family continued to reside here until about 1815 when it left and went to what is now Canton, Ill. There Mansfield's first child grew to womanhood and on October 5, 1826 was married to Dr. Isaac

Galland. This young couple first located in Henderson county, Ill., where they remained for about one year. Then they crossed the river and was the first family to settle in the state of Iowa.

Mrs. Galland's daughter, who was named Eleanor, was the first white child to be born in Iowa. The first school house in the state was built by her husband on the land that he had taken up. Dr. and Mrs. Galland were the parents of three children, Eleanor, Washington and Hannah. The town of Galland was named after the family.

Mrs. Galland died at Galland, Iowa on March 17, 1832, and was buried at Commerce, Ill., just across the river. Commerce is the place that the Mormons came to eight years later and changed the name to Nauvoo.

In 1856 Mrs. Galland's body was disinterred and taken back to Iowa and placed in the cemetery at Fort Madison where her grave is marked by a monument that bears the following inscription:

"Hannah Kinney Galland, born in Mansfield, Ohio, November 5, 1807. Died at Galland, March 17, 1832.

Aged 24 years, four months and 12 days."

"This is the correct story of Hannah Kinney, the first white child born in Mansfield," says Mr. Corbett.

"When Mansfield Gilkinson died, A. J. Baughman in an article at the time said that Mansfield Gilkinson was not the first white child born in Mansfield, but the first white male child born there, as it was said that two years before there was a daughter born to a family by the name of Kinney but that little was known of them because they moved away shortly afterwards, but that it was learned she had died early in life.

"Now compare the records I am sending with what Mr. Baughman said and you will find that he was correct," Mr. Corbett said in closing.

The records that have been closely followed with a deal of effort and study, establish beyond the shadow of a doubt the name of the first white child to be born in Mansfield. It provides moreover another interesting detail of the early days of the community that were preserved in a most able fashion by the late historian, A. J. Baughman.
