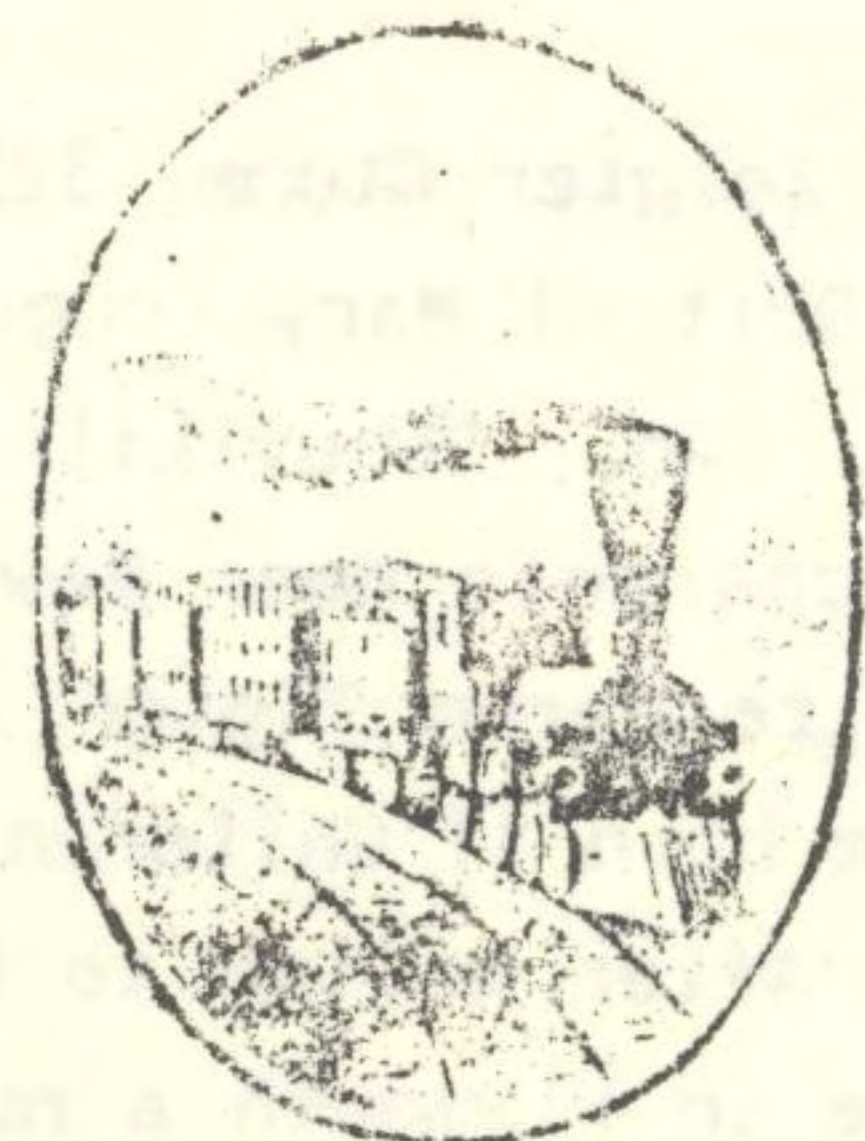

Obit of Mary Longenberger Shiery (from an unknown newspaper dated 1900) - "Mary Shiery was born in West Pen. Twp., Schuylkill Co. PA on the 16th day of March 1836, when 5 yrs of age she moved with her mother and grandparents near Newton Falls, Trumbull Co. OH. She remained there until 1848, when she united in marriage to Aaron Zigler, and then came to Richland Co. where they have remained for over 50 years . To them were born 11 Children, nine of whom are living, six sons and three daughters....

"After moving to Richland Co. she joined the United Brethren Church of Shelby OH. Taking up her residence in Plymouth a number of years later, she brought her letter and united with the M. E. Church at this place....until her death on Sunday August 26, 1900....Interment being made in Greenlawn Cemetery."

Also another clipping from her father's Family Bible - "Miss Sadie D. Cristee born Greenwich OH, mar Mr. Benjamin Zigler, Plymouth OH. at Shiloh OH March 5, 1884 by Rev. Garing."

She continues in her letter - "Dad says the Zigler Bible was not his fathers, so at this time I can only guess it was Ben and Sarah's, since, the Bible is always given to the youngest son,. I have a lot of history and some old pictures from this family. I remember another person was researching the family in 1960, but no one seems to know who."

Shelia has sent to our librarian, Ruth Hostetter, a most interesting **Merged Group Report** from their Computer program Family History System, on the RORICK family, the John George RORICK family in particular. "Name located in deed between J. G. RORACK and Lewis RORACK made 14 Aug 1819, LDS call #0380681. It is believed by some family members that the father of Lewis RORICK was Johan Junger ROHIG who emigrated from Waurbeck, Germany 17 Apr 1802, left Bramen, Ger. 20 Apr 1802, arrived in PA 26 Apr 1802 on Brig Urania. This needs to be checked further. Court records on file at the OGS Library, (code: 1819-8-41 a-k) involve a suit between Michael Hensel and John George RORICK. Suit about debt occurred in 1813-14 by John George who made his mark on a note over the name Gorg RORIG; note written in German....

We have received some of the Civil War papers of Conrad CLEVER, a soldier of the Civil War. A page is taken from CLEVER CONNECTIONS, Vol. 2, p 22, plus a copy of the original of the letter published there.... Feb. 2, 1862 - Dear Friends, I take my pen in hand to in form yours that I em well at this time....we have a chapline in our regiment. he gits one hundard and forty six dolars and fifty cents a month and he hant prechet one time yet cince we left mansfild. we only see hime wan we ar on a march he is a lon and wen he sees a nice looking hous he stops and by pies and caks and that is all we git to see of him. he nether goes to visit the sik nor priches and i think that if the goverment wold dispence of all such men we wold get a long gest as well and no more go to hell then gos this way. he is not her to ceep (keep) men from hell but to git his packet full of mony and that is wat he is doing. anuf of that now....we hav to bak the best way that we can. we git poark and some times bef rice humny cofy and crakers and that is what we live on. you art to be her a will (a while) to see us bak and eat. THE CHILDREN'S AID SOCIETY

Have you ever heard of the "orphan trains" that brought children from the large cities on the eastern coast of the United States, to the Midwest for adoption by families who would accept them and raise them as their children? Here is an article found in the Semi-Weekly Herald Mansfield, July 24, 1861 -

"We noticed that Mr. C. C. Tracy has arrived with a parcel of children from New York, and that they have rapidly found protectors. We understand that those sent to Ashland also found homes. The Children's Aid Society is a most worthy and charitable one and is doing a blessed work for the Metropolis and the country. It is busily and systematically collecting the poor and neglected children of the city, and providing them with homes in the country where they will be trained to industry, and be under educational and religious influences. During the past year 167 boys and girls have found homes in Ohio.

"Mr. Tracy, the children's friend, came in yesterday with a company of twenty, bound to Mansfield. The party consisted of nineteen boys and one girl--healthy, intelligent, bright and happy--they were all dressed alike, had their small bibles and other books, were orderly as a Sunday school, and sang and chatted merrily. There were no downcast, stupid dunces, and a few years hence they will contribute a full share to the bone and muscle and mind of Old Richland.... and quite likely Mr. T. will yet hear that some of his proteges have been dubbed with military and civic titles."

QUESTION - Do any of our readers know of a person who came to be in this area of Richland County, Ohio, who came here on an "orphan train?" If you do, we would like to hear about them. We are wondering what sort of records have been kept on these children.

KINER, Mrs. Sarah GRUBAUGH, d. 3 Aug 1917 at home of dau., Mrs. John COWELL. b. 16 Apr 1822, mar. 20 Feb 1842 to Michael KINER. 12 children. Joined Wineberanian Church (later Brethren). Bur. Perrysville. Mansfield Shield 11 Aug 1917.

LINN, Samuel d. Franklin Twp. on 3 Jan 1865, from Rockbridge VA to Rich. Co. in 1812, "just after the Indian COPUS massacre, taking the one of the COPUS daughters that was wounded behind him on horseback to the blockhouse. Shield & Banner 18 Jan 1865.

NAIL, Henry d. 2 Jun 1867, ae 74 yrs. B. Somerset Co. PA 30 Sep 1793, to Fairfield Co. OH in 1806, to Madison Twp., Rich. Co. in 1810. Served in War of 1812. Helped build blockhouses on frontier in Richland & Huron Counties. Mansfield Herald 5 Jun 1867.

PALMER, Mrs. Ann, d. 16 Aug 1865, b. Repton, Derbyshire, Eng. on 15, Nov 1804 to Joseph & Elizabeth WARD, who came to Rich. Co. in 1818, mar. 10 Feb 1821 to Charles PALMER. Had 13 Ch. Mansfield Herald 30 Aug 1865.

POE, Rev. D. D. d. Mansfield at ae 64. b. Columbiana Co. OH on 12 Jul 1804. Was licensed to preach in June 1825; mar. 7 Apr 1825 to Eliza HOSFORD at Westfield, Medina Co. OH. Shield & Banner 1 Jul 1868.

POLLOCK, Samuel d. 3 Sep 1876, b Feb 1788 in Belfast Ireland, came to U. S. 1800 with father to Wash. Co. PA to Harrison Co. OH in 1811. Served in War of 1812 under General Harrison; mar. 1818 to Fanny WILKIN, who survives him. Had 13 ch. Shield & Banner 30 Sep 1876.

ROBERTS, T. J. b. N. J. on 8 Aug 1808. To PA with parents and later to Mansfield in 1836. mar. 11 Mar 1837 to Susan W. WISE. Shield & Banner 13 Feb 1875.

RORICK, William, Co. C 45th U. S. Inf d. of fever on 26 Nov 1867. Post of Jeffersonville IN, at ae 19. Mansfield Herald 25 Dec 1867.

RUCKMAN, Richard d. 8 Jul 1866, ae 91-4-26; b Huntingdon Co. N. J. on 12 Feb 1775. lived 50 yrs in PA & VA, balance with son-in-law, Mr. Pettit; lost eyesight ca 20 yrs ago; wife d. 30 yrs ago. Mansfield Herald 11 Jul 1866.

RUHL, Mrs Elizabeth wid/o George RUHL. b. MD. to Perry Twp. Rich. Co. OH in 1812. Moved to Holt Co. MO in 1868, where she still resided in her 97th year. Mother of 17 ch., 85 gr ch, 88 gt gr ch. All living except 22. She has been blind for 17 years. Shield & Banner 16 Jan 1875.

SCATTERGOOD. Mrs. Rachel d. 24 Sep 1895; b. Philadelphia PA on 1 Feb 1793. Shield & Banner 2 Oct 1875.

SELTZER, Mrs. Margaret d. 26 Feb 1866 in Crestline. b. Franklin Co. PA to Abraham & Susannah KOONS. Eldest of 27 ch. - 19 yet living; mar. David SELTER on 22 Apr 1833, 8 ch. survive. Shield & Banner 21 Mar 1866.

SHEA, James D. d. 14 Jan 1875, ae 84 yrs. b. York Co. PA and came to Mansfield in 1830, Wife d. 7 yrs. age. 7 ch born - 5 survive. Shield & Banner 23 Jan 1875.

SIMPSON, Samuel d. 28 Nov 1867, at ae 74, in Mifflin Twp. b. 1793 in Jefferson Co. OH. Father of John SIMPSON, Mrs. Wm. McCOLLY and Mrs. Alex C. Welch. Mansfield Herald 4 Dec 1867.

SMITH, Mrs. Elizabeth d. 27 Sep 1865 at home of dau., Sarah McFADDEN in Huntington Co. IN. wid/o Elias SMITH. b. 12 Apr 1790 in York Co. PA; moved with par. to VA where she lived until she mar., then moved in 1815 to Ohio with her husband. She is a maternal niece of Rev. Dr. STOUGH. Shield & Banner 11 Oct 1865.

STEWART, John, Esq. Washington Twp. d. 21 Mar 1866, ae 79. Settled on farm where he d. in 1815; came here from PA. Shield & Banner 28 Mar & 4 Apr 1866. Mansfield Herald 28 Mar 1866.

TAYLOR, Mrs. Abigail, w/o Samuel Taylor. b. 19 Apr 1802 in Waldo Co. Maine. to OH with par. in 1817, mar. Samuel TAYLOR on 25 Oct 1820. Mansfield Herald 22 Jan 1868.

WISE, Mrs. Barbara d. 25 Sep 1875 ae 81. b. Hagerstown, Washington Co. MD Shield & Banner 2 Oct 1875.

YEAMAN, Robert d. 10 Oct 1865, b. 7 Jul 1811 in Washington Co. PA. Mansfield Herald 11 Oct and 25 Oct 1865.

TYLER - POLLARD CEMETERY

The Tyler Pollard Cemetery is located on the J. Louis and Esther Lake property, just west of the garden by an old apple orchard, on the north side of Fleming falls Road, opposite Pennsylvania Ave., in Madison Twp., Richland Co., Ohio. These stones were copied by Tom Neel and Sunda Peters on July 2, 1993. We were told by neighbors that gravestones were used as stepping stones on the property years ago, and a more extensive probing of the property could very well uncover more tombstones.

1. TYLER, Timothy, died Feb. 10, 1842 aged 59 y 6m 13 d, (broken, fallen)
2. TYLER, Elizabeth, wife of Timothy TYLER, d. Sept. 6, 1854 aged 66 y 2 m 2 1 (broken, fallen)
3. _____ (no name) "9, -- y, __o, __ays" (broken piece)
4. _____ (unmarked base for stone)
5. POLLARD ?, Enos, _____s & _____ POLLAR, died _____ (broken segment)
6. _____ (footstone leaning against tree, no markings)
7. _____ (small piece by edge of woods, with a star, from a gravestone)
8. _____ (another piece by a tree on south side "___ of ___ of _____D, ___ 30," (fraction of a stone)

These inscriptions were not noted in previous Richland County cemetery publications. Because of the location description, it is possibly the one merely referred to as "Duffy Farm - Yearling Cemetery", although the current property owners were not familiar with those surnames. Timothy Tyler is listed in the 1840 Madison Twp. census, p. 146, with 1 male 5-10, 1 male 10-15, 1 male 60-70, 1 female 5-10, 1 female 10-15, 1 female 40-50, and 1 female 50-60. Neighbors were Isaac Bosler and Ephriam Tyler, with a Samuel Tyler two doors down. In 1850, Elizabeth Tyler, age 62, is noted in the Madison Twp. census, p. 299, with Elizabeth 26, John 24, Samuel 19, Lucy 17, and one John Gibbs 10. Neighbors were Julia Fite and Jacob Cole. We could not locate a POLLARD family in that immediate area, although the name Silas POLLARD is known in Richland County. Thanks to the Lake's for telling us about their little cemetery.
