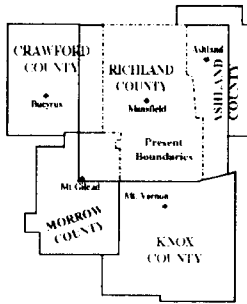

The Richland County Genealogical Society was organized in 1959 as The Ohio Genealogical Society. Members had been meeting for some five years. In 1964 it was reorganized as the Richland County Genealogical Society, the first chapter of The Ohio Genealogical Society.

Meetings are normally held on the fourth Thursday of the month at 7:30 p.m. There is no July meeting. The August meeting is usually a picnic on a date to be set. The November and December meetings are combined on an evening early in December.

Any member of the Richland County Genealogical Society who is a direct descendant of an individual who lived before 1840 in the area which was at that time encompassed by Richland County, may become a member of the First Families of Richland County upon the acceptance of an application with proof of such descent and the payment of a fee as set by the Board of Trustees.

The Pastfinder is published four times a year (February, May, August, and November). Members and non-members are encouraged to submit a five generation chart and other family information, specifying their permission for the information to be published in the Pastfinder. Queries in the Pastfinder are free to both members and non-members.

## Doubtful Bonds

### List of Persons Whose Marriage Certificates Have Never Been Returned

When a Probate Court grants licenses to marry, a blank is given to the person procuring such a license, which is to be filled out by the minister or official who performs the marriage ceremony, and returned, with his signature affixed, in three months time. If it is not so returned a penalty of \$50 is what the law says shall be the offender's punishment. The object of having this return made is to make the contract more sure and certain, and to put it beyond the possibility of a doubt. Such things should be attended to very closely by those who are interested, for in after years the settlement of marriage contracts might involve the legitimacy of children or the possession of large estates. Below is presented a list, extending from February 6<sup>th</sup>, 1878, to September 25, 1882, of those whose certificates have not been returned. Source: Mansfield Newspaper. ### **Thursday, October 16, 1823**

Died on the 16<sup>th</sup> inst. At his residence in the vicinity of Mansfield, Alexander Curran, Esq. In the 50<sup>th</sup> year of his age, after a lingering illness. He was born in Winchester, Va.

Died after a very short illness near Mansfield, on the 15<sup>th</sup> inst. Mrs. Eleanor Reed, consort of Mr. John Reed formerly of Pittsburgh.

### **Thursday, October 9, 1823**

Died on the 25<sup>th</sup> ult., after a short illness, John Edgar Esq., in the 63d year of his age. He was a native of Cumberland Co., Penna. And settled in Westmoreland, before emigrating to Ohio.

### **Thursday, December 18, 1823**

Died in Madison Township, on the 5<sup>th</sup> inst., Addison, son of Solomon Cook, aged about 4 years. The death was occasioned by falling into a kettle of boiling fat.

On the 13<sup>th</sup> inst. James Huntsman, Esq. A respectable citizen of Perry Township.

**Thursday, January 1, 1824**

Died in this place on the 18<sup>th</sup> ult., Irwin, son of Mr. David Maginnis, aged 1 yr. 11 mo. 8 da. This child's death was occasioned by its clothes taking fire while standing near the fireplace. He was almost immediately discovered, but the flames had ascended instantaneously to the child's head. He languished 6 days in excruciating pain and then expired.

Died on the 24<sup>th</sup> ult., Michael Houser was found dead in the road 3 miles N.E. from this place. A coroner's inquest was held upon the dead body, and from their verdict it appears that he came to his death by a limb of a dry tree falling down upon him while in the act of driving his team along the road.

**Thursday, January 15, 1824**

Died on the 11<sup>th</sup> inst. At his late residence in Washington Township, John Mann, Sen. Aged 77 years and 2 days.

Died of inflammation in the head in this place, on the 9<sup>th</sup> inst. Betsey, daughter of T.C. Terry, aged 7 years.

Died also on the 11<sup>th</sup> inst., Harriet, daughter of the same, aged 5 months.

**Thursday, March 25, 1824**

Died on Friday last Mrs. M. Keith, in the 84<sup>th</sup> year of her age. She lived in wedlock 61 years, and has left an offspring of 13 children, 70 grandchildren and 50 great grandchildren.

Died in this place on Tuesday last, of the jaundice, Mr. James Russel in the 33<sup>d</sup> year of his age.

**Thursday, April 1, 1824**

Died in this village on the 28<sup>th</sup> inst., David Felton, a son of John Felton of Huron County after a severe illness of 24 hours, at aged 17 years.

**Thursday, April 22, 1824**

Died in this place on Wednesday the 14<sup>th</sup> inst., an infant son of Mr. James Smart, aged three months and nine days.

**Thursday, May 6, 1824**

Deported this life at his late residence in Monroe Township, on the 17<sup>th</sup> ult., after an illness of six days, Mr. Thomas McBride, aged about 54 years.

**Thursday, May 13, 1824**

Died at his late residence in Mifflin Township on Tuesday last, Capt. David Newell, a respectable and worthy citizen, after an illness of two weeks.

**Thursday, May 30, 1824**

Died at his late residence in the vicinity of this place on Sunday evening last, Mr. Calvin Clark, after an illness of three days.

**Thursday, August 5, 1824**

Died in Auburn Township on Friday and Saturday the 23 & 24 ult., William and Samuel Cuykendoll. William was about 27 and Samuel 22 years of age, and were both interred in the same grave on the Sabbath following.

**Thursday, August 5, 1824 continued**

Died on Thursday the 31<sup>st</sup> ult., after a lingering illness, Mrs. Margaret Welch in the 50<sup>th</sup> year of her age.

Died on the same day, Garrett, a son of Mr. Joseph Brown of Washington Township.

Died on Friday, the 23<sup>d</sup> ult., the daughter of Jeremiah Post aged about 4 years.

Died on the 24<sup>th</sup> ult., Daniel Devlin of Worthington Township of a short and painful illness.

Died on the 4<sup>th</sup> inst., Mrs. Elizabeth Oldfield, consort of Mr. Johnathan Oldfield, of Washington Township after a lingering and painful illness aged 27 years.

**Thursday, September 2, 1824**

Died in Madison Township, on the 21<sup>st</sup> ult., Mr. Francis Morrison, aged about 45 years.

Died on the 14<sup>th</sup>, Mr. Abraham Williams, a resident of this township.

Died on Monday the 23<sup>rd</sup> ult., Miss Martha, daughter of Mr. Robert Finney of this township, aged about 21 years.

Died on the 18<sup>th</sup>, Miss Nancy, daughter of Mr. John Finney, of Washington Township, aged about 18 years.

Died at Chillicothe not long since, Allison C. Looker, Esq. in the 33<sup>d</sup> year of his age.

**Thursday, September 9, 1824**

Died in Washington Township on the 6<sup>th</sup> inst. An infant son of Mr. John M<sup>c</sup>Collum. aged about 9 months.

Died in the same township. on the 2<sup>nd</sup> inst., Mr. Shay. aged about 40 years.

Died in the same township. on the 3<sup>rd</sup> inst., Mr. Peter Manes. aged about 60 years.

Died in this place on Saturday last. Miss Sarah Crossthwaite. aged about 15 years.

Died in Springfield Township. on the 6<sup>th</sup> inst., Miss Doty.
