in the woods, when we started for Strewberry Plaine.
Marched nearly all might. Stopped a short time in the
morning then came on 3 miles south of the Plains we are
now camped in the woods near Holston Siver.

Tues. Jan. 19

Lay still. It snowed about two inches last night.

Drow 2 days rations. 2/3 pint of flour for a man. Other things in proportions. Our stomachs do not feel full to bursting.

Pleasant day. Moved just afternoon about 2 miles toward Knoxville to where there is more wood. We are now on a hillside in a nice timber. Orew some rations--very short.

Thurs. Jan. 25

Reville at 45 5.7. Marched Ch --came to Knoxville on the P.R. tracks (12 miles). Came across the river. Free camped near where we were when we first wame to K. Marched about 14 miles. Had a little beef and rice for breakfast. Nothing since. No prespects of getting anything untill tomorrow morning.

Fri. Jen. 22
Tine day. Drew some flour and meat. Will traw some rations this evening.

Started from our camp east of X. 8 t.W. Po ced across the river and tarough town thence on our way to ards Loudon. Came about 10 miles. Cameed in a wools by a nice spring and near a mill. Some of the boys went out and not some potatoes. Je have 20 rounds extra of cartridges.

Reville 45 A.F. Farched at 65, came about 5 miles Campel in a large wools near a steam saumill, about a nalf mile north of R.R. Camped & P.M. I went out a couple miles got my supper and a quart of milk.

Reville 4. Marchel at 5. The 64th Squal and two Co's 65th, were train guards. Came to Loudon where we stooped. about noon and got some dinner. Our grub is corn meal, flour, pork and beaf, sugar and coffee. Last night Trank bakel a pone which we ate today for dinner. We lay until about 5 T.T. when we crossed the river. Are now campad near the river below town a short listance.

Beautiful day. Lay on south bank of Tennesces liver.

12 miles from Louison about 80 ris from the river on a high hill. 11 teams were foreging-not planty of corn. Formers across the are plowing and sowing some kind of grain. (sowing wheat, I think). Weather is as mild as April in Ohio.
