

FIRST CAR MOTORMAN IS TAKEN BY DEATH

**Jeremiah Bohlen Drove Horse
Car in Columbus Before
Electricity Was Used.**

The death of Jeremiah Bohlen, aged 70, who was said to be motor-man on the first electric street car in Columbus, occurred at his home in Grove City Wednesday after a long illness from a complication of diseases.

The deceased was in the employ of the street railway company for 30 years and 5 months. Before operating the electric car he was driver of a horse car. About five years ago he was pensioned by the company, and after that he moved from Columbus to Grove City.

Surviving him are his wife; three sons, Elmer, Wilmer and James; a daughter, Mrs. Henry Licher; two brothers and ten grandchildren. Funeral arrangements are in charge of the Edward E. Fisher company.
