The Huntington Church Records are of the Methodist Episcopal, Baptist and the Congregational Churches. These churches joined together and in 1932 became the United Church of Huntington.

There were two other churches in the early history of Huntington but not much is known about them except what is written in the "Lorain County History" by Williams 1879, and from family members of the latter church.

Wesleyan Methodist, located in the southeast part of the township, was organized in 1844 but only lasted a few years. The building was converted into a cheese factory.

The Universalist Church was built in the southwest portion of the township on Baker Road just north of New London Eastern Road. It was organized in 1877 and lasted into the late 1950's. Among ministers were: Rev. Abel, Rev. William P. Burnell, and two pioneer ministers, Rev. Harlow P. Sage and Daniel Tillotson.

These records were copied by Anne Glendening in 1969 with the intention of helping others with research in this area.

We would like to thank the late Rev. Dale Clark for his help and permission in doing the records.

At a later date it is our intention to update this work to the 1930's. All people who purchase the records will be notified so they can acquire the additions.

RECORD OF THE FIRST REGULAR BAPTIST CHURCH  
of  
HUNTINGTON, OHIO  
1858

December 12, 1833

We were constituted the First Regular Baptist Church of Huntington by the united voice of a council; and received the right hand of Fellowship from Elder James Newton. The number of names constituting the Church are ten: Namely--Abner Chapman, Olive Chapman, Jonathan Niles, Esther Niles, Jesse Johnson, Abner Chapman Jr., William F. Chapman, Eunice Chapman, Huldah Chapman and Rubin T. Pierce.

Jonathan Niles was chosen Deacon and Abner Chapman Jr. clerk. The Church was admitted into the Rocky River Association at their session in 1834. June 26, 1839 the Church became connected with the Lorain Baptist Association.

ARTICLES OF FAITH AND PRACTICE

To maintain inviolably this important doctrine--Namely: Of three that bear record in Heaven--the Father, the Word, and the Holy Ghost; and these three are one--Justification by the righteousness of Christ imputed--the absolute necessity of the Spirit's operation--efficacious grace in regeneration--the obligation of believers to attend to all the precepts of Scripture--the final perseverance of the Saints of God in grace to the last day--the eternal happiness of the righteous--and the everlasting misery of those that die impenitent--the burying of believers in water--the only gospel baptism--and the independence of the respective Churches.

HISTORICAL SKETCHES

December 12, 1833 to January 1, 1858

The Church was constituted with ten members and recognized as the First Regular Baptist Church of Huntington by a council convened December 12, 1833. The first year of its existence the membership increased to twenty. The succeeding year 1835 was one of trial and deep affliction--four were added--four were excluded--and one dismissed--leaving the number one less than the year previous. During 1836 three were added and three dismissed. In 1837 six were added and one died. In 1838 two were added. During 1839 six were received by letter and one by baptism. The country was new, worldly goods they possessed but little. The Church had no regular or convenient place of worship. Assembled part of the time at the center schoolhouse which stood where the Baptist meeting house now stands and part of the time at the dwelling of Jesse Johnson. Preaching one fourth and one half of the time by ministers living at a distance. Sometimes dependent upon occasional supplies. The faith of God's people in his promises and their settled purpose to maintain the standard of truth was often brought to the test. But united in sympathy and harmony of action their trials and discouragements seemed like an outward pressure uniting them more perfectly in one body.

During these six years the acting membership increased to thirty-two. In the month of January 1840 the Church and community were greatly blessed with a revival of religion through the preaching and labors of Revs. Simmons and Mathews sent out by the Misdsionary Board of the Lorain Baptist Association. It is thought to be the most thorough and effective revival experienced in the town either before or since. The Church strengthened and encouraged, secured and continued a pastor, two years, one half the time. By a vigorous united effort the present meeting house was erected during the year 1842. During the winter of 1843 a second revival was enjoyed through the labors of Rev. Levi Farnsworth. Twenty-two were added by baptism.

December 1843, ten years consitituted as a Church and eight-eight names were enrolled upon the record. From this time forward the Church enjoyed the labors of a settled pastor most of the time and walked more certainly being increased in numbers and worldly goods.

In January 1851, a third revival was experienced through the instrumentality of Rev. M.W. Alfred. Fourteen were received by baptism.

December 1853, organized twenty years and one hundred and fifty-three names stand upon the record. For several years previous to 1858 differences and dissensions seriously disturbed the harmony of the body and it was long feared its dissolution was fast drawing nigh. But from those trials the Church it is beleived has come fourth purified and fitted to accomplish its mission of mercy and goodwill in redemption and salvation of men.

The Lord will be a shield to those who trust in him.

The year 1857 was greatly blest in reviving the Church and bringing it to a state of peace and harmony through the faithful and long continued labors of our pastor, Rev. James Goodrich and later through the preaching and instrumentality of Rev. L. Wadsworth. Twenty-three were recieved to membership. January 1, 1858 the Church has been organized twenty-four years and nineteen days and has received to membership one hundred and eighty-five names, classed as follows:

#### PASTORS OF THE CHURCH

The Rev. James Newton was the first pastor. He commenced in the spring of 1834 and preached one fourth of the time for fifty dollars. He lived in Milton, Wayne County, a distance of near forty miles. Died several years since.

The summer of 1835, Rev. Mr. Mack engaged with the Church one year one fourth of the time for fifty dollars. He lived in Norton, Summit County, moved to Bath and died a few years ago.

Rev. Mr. Weight moved into town and preached one half of the time for about one hundred dollars. He moved west and has not been heard of.

October 1837, Rev. Frederick Freeman became pastor and continued with the Church till January 1840, a little more than two years. He lived on his farm in Spencer about seven miles distant and preached one half the time for about one hundred dollars a year. He is now living in Jackson, Wayne County and is above eighty years of age.

August 1840 Rev. B. Hill was invited to become pastor of this and Sullivan Church. Continued two years and received one hundred and fifty dollars for one half of the time each year. Moved west.

April 1843, James Bicknell, a licentiate supplied till January 1844 at the rate of seventy-five dollars. During the spring and first part of the summer of 1844, the Rev. Mr. Skinner was employed. Went to the western part of the State.

August 1844, Rev. S. Dimick became pastor and continued with the Church till January 1848. He preached a year and a few months one half of the time at one hundred dollars a year. The last two years he preached all the time for one hundred dollars, house, rent and firewood. He resided in town and is the first pastor who united with the Church. He is now living in Olmsted and is above seventy-five years of age.

May 1st, 1848, Rev. Levi Farnsworth was employed as pastor one third of the time till January 1849 for fifty-eight dollars. During the year 1849 he preached one half of the time for fifty-six dollars. He connected himself with the Church while pastor and resided on his farm in Sullivan where he resides at the present time.

May 1850, M.W. Alfred, a licentiate, was employed one half of the time till January 1851. February 1851 he was ordained and retained as pastor till April 1853. The last two years he preached all of the time and received a salary of from two to two hundred and fifty dollars a year. He resided in town and united with the Church. Removed to Michigan and has preached very little since. The succeeding year had no pastor and very little preaching.

April 1854, Rev. James Goodrich became pastor and continued his labors till April 1857, a period of three years and received a salary of three hundred dollars a year. Spent his whole time with the Church. He removed to Avon and is now living in Sheffield. During the summer of 1857 Rev. L. Wadsworth and others supplied the Church.

#### DEACONS OF THE CHURCH

Jonathan Niles was chosen December 12, 1833. Dismissed and moved from town, August 1836. For more than three years were without a regularly appointed Deacon.

William F. Chapman was chosen April 1840. Resigned June 1846.

Barlow G. Carpenter was chosen June 1846. Dismissed and removed from town in the fall of 1856. The Church has since been without a regularly constituted Deacon.

## CLERKS OF THE CHURCH

Abner Chapman Jr. was elected December 1833. Resigned March 1845. Served 11 years and three months.

B.G. Carpenter was elected March 1845. Resigned July 1851. Served six years four months.

W.A. Johnson was chosen July 1851. Resigned June 1858. Served seven years eleven months.

N.B. Griggs was chosen July 1858. Resigned July 1880. Served twenty-two years.

## MEETING HOUSE

January 1st, 1842

Having met in the Congregational House more than three years one half of the time and being notified to leave-resorted to the center schoolhouse. At a special meeting held at the house of Jesse Johnsons, January 17, 1842 the Church resolved to build a house of worship provided a sufficient amount could be raised by subscription. A building committee was chosen consisting of Jesse Johnson, Abner Chapman Jr., L.C. Hawley and William F. Chapman, treasurer.

By presevering and determined effort and much sacrifice of the time and money on the part of few brethren between seven and eight hundred dollars were raised and the house erected and enclosed in the fall of 1842. The floor was soon after put down and a stove and temporary seat being procured-it was thus for worship till the fall of 1846- when it was seated and plastered at an expense of two hundred and ninety-four dollars. In the fall of 1851 the houses was painted outside and at a cost of about ninety dollars and in the fall of 1856 was reshingled and well painted at an expense of one hundred and sixty-eight dollars and is now in good repair.

## INCORPORATION

February 14th, 1842

The legislature passed an act incorporating the First Regular Baptist Society of Huntington. During the Legislative Session of 1843 agreeable to a petition of the Church, the Act of 1842 was repealed and an act passed incorporating the First Regular Baptist Church of Huntington. February 24, 1844 the act of incorporation of 1843 was accepted by the church and Nahum Clark, William F. Chapman and James Rogers were chosen trustees, and Abner Chapman Jr., clerk.

A committee consisting of Whitney Clark and Abner Chapman Jr. was appointed to draft a constitution which was reported and adopted March 23, 1844 and is on file in the hands of the clerk.

Whitney Clark is and has been for several years the clerk.

Meeting house ground deeded by Jesse Johnson to Abner and William F. Chapman in trust and accepted by the Church October 5, 1844.

February 1853, bought a strip of land two rods by ten, adjoining the meeting house ground on the east, exchanged a part of it for land with

Messenger. The land and recording deeds cost twenty-one dollars. February 19, 1853, the Church voted to accept two dollars of Jesse Johnson as satisfaction for land deeded by said Johnson to the trustees of the Baptist Church. Said deed over reaching land formerly deeded to the Methodist Society of three feet more or less but now owned by said Baptist Church. Said money given to satisfy in full the claim of the deed of the Baptist Meeting house ground given by said Johnson.

#### MISCELLANEOUS

Sabbath School first organized and library secured April 1842, since which time a Sabbath school has been opened nearly every spring. First average made and recorded September 1843.

March 3rd, 1848 the Church voted to hold the Regular Covenant meeting the first Saturday before the first Sunday of the month.

Two sessions of the Lorain Baptist Association have been held with the Church as follows. June 1848 and June 1852.

Two members of the Church have been licensed to preach and one ordained as follows: C.R. Sage Jr., licensed October 1848; John Sweet licensed 1855 and M.W. Alfred ordained Feb. 1851. C.R. Sage moved to the State of Illinios and died there a few years since. John Sweet is living in Spencer and exercises the privelege granted by the Church.
