tion to the museum. On hand for the ceremony will be several representatives of the Greenfields now living in Toronto: Archibald Macdonell, Allan Macdonell, and Peter Currer.

The collection, amassed by J.A. Macdonell, author of "Sketches Illustrating the Early Settlement and History of Glengarry in Canada," includes Glengarry portraits and items of military interest.

At the same time, Malcolm MacMillan will donate a musket "which represents a museum piece of considerable rarity and importance," according to the Glengarry Historical Society's most recent newsletter.
