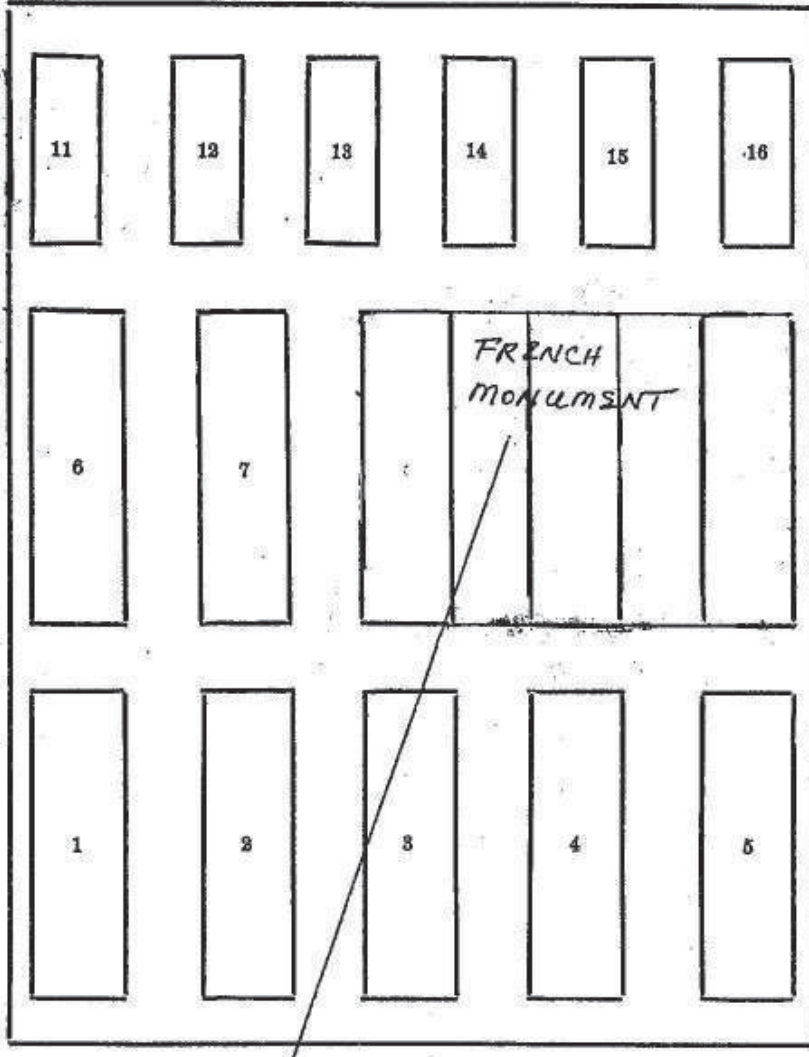

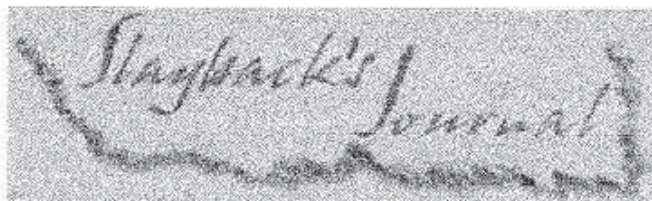

Descendants of Johannes Schlabbach

Generation No. 1

Johannes¹ Schlabbach was born Abt. 1695. He lived in Cleeburg, and died in Trenton, Middlesex, New Jersey. He married **Maria Elizabeth** Abt. 1719 in Zweibroucken, Alsace.

Notes for Johannes Schlabbach:

Johannes Schlabbach arrived with his family in 1733 on the Pink Mary from Rotterdam. They traveled there from Alsace, Lorraine in France. They were Palatinates who left because of religious persecution. They settled in Trenton, New Jersey. Other spellings: Schlappach, Schlapbach. They originated in Switzerland and Alsace.

Michael Hammer of Huntingdon County New Jersey was in the four man party which was naturalized April 7, 1761 with David Slayback--2nd. generation.

Eventually third generation, Solomon Slayback migrated with his brothers Abel and William to Fayette County, Kentucky.

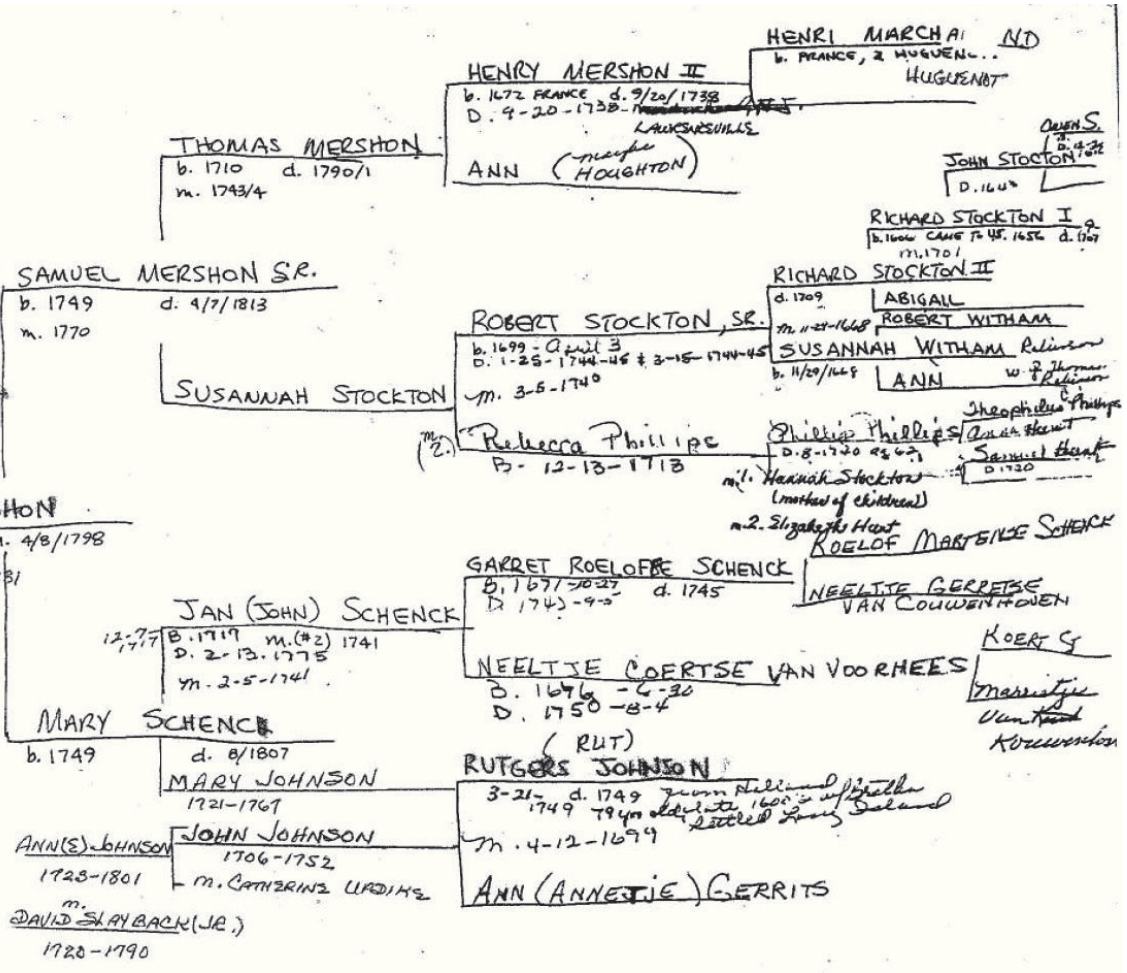
Generation No. 2

born Dec. 27, 1831 at Plainsboro, N.J. died March 27, 1908, buried ^{at 164 Nassau St., Princeton, N.J.} in Princeton Cemetary, March 30, 1908. Memorial stained glass window of married April 13, 1853, Susan Parker Provost, by Rev. Dr. John Maclean of Princeton, President of the College of New Jersey (later Princeton University) at the house of John Conover, Princeton, N.J. Susan Parker Provost was born in Kingston, N.J., Sept. 26, 1833. To them were born 5 children:

JOHN ROSCOE SLAYBACK married a second time on Oct. 14, 1866 to Sarah Jane Tooker, the niece of Susan Parker Provost Slayback, who was born 1840 at Port Jefferson, Long Island. She was a teacher in Kingston, N.J. They were married at the house of John Roscoe Slayback, 164 Nassau Street., Princeton, N.J. by Rev. Dr. Henry C. Westwood, pastor of the Methodist Episcopal Church of Princeton. To them was born one son:

JOHN ROSCOE SLAYBACK married a third time on July 14, 1870 to Caroline Heath Blackwell at ^{dec house} "Evergreen", ^(still Slayback) Aqueduct Mills, near Princeton, N.J. ^(near Cambridge lower Harrison St. in Penn.) They were married by Rev. J. Bailie Adams, husband of Caroline H. Blackwell's first cousin, Margaret Blackwell Adams (daughter of Austin Blackwell) and Rev. Ananias Lawrence, pastor of the Methodist Episcopal Church of Princeton, N.J. Caroline Heath Blackwell was b. Jan. 31, 1840, d. at 164 Nassau St., Princeton on July 15, 1924, buried July 18, 1924 in Kingston, N.J. cemetery in the Blackwell plot ^{with her parents}. To John Roscoe and Caroline Heath Blackwell were born two children:
