I HAVE REVIEWED YOUR 3 LETTERS TO ME, PARTICULARLY THE ONE FROM '91 CONCERNING YOUR WORK ON THE SHIRLEYS + YOUR THEORY CONCERNING THE LINE OF CLEMENT WARTHEN.

I HAVE NO INTENTION OF DOUBLE-CHECKING YOUR WORK ON THE SHIRLEYS AS WITH WHAT I ALREADY HAD PLUS YOUR GOOD WORK. THEN WHAT DO WE DO ABOUT ALL THESE OTHER 11-12 BOYS WHO SEEM TO BE CONNECTED? THE 1790 + 1800 CENSUSES + THE 2 RESPECTIVE WILLS HAVE TO BE THROWN OUT AS TOTAL FABRICATIONS.

LET ME BACK UP A LITTLE. MY GF RUSSELL (b. 1863 MONROE Co. MICH. - d. 1924 WEBB CITY, Mo.) WAS AN ILLEGITIMATE SON OF BURDETTE WARTHEN (b. 1815 HARRISON Co. VA. - d. 1908 BUNKER HILL, Ks.) AND MISSOURI SWEDE FREAS (b. 1838 PHILADELPHIA - d. 1927 ALBA, Mo.)

BECAUSE OF THIS MY FATHER + AUNT LED ME A MERRY CHASE FROM 1951 - c. 1963 WHEN I GAVE IT ALL UP UNTIL EARLY 1976 (MY FATHER d. Nov. 1975)

DURING 1976 + EARLY '77 I FOUND OUT ABOUT MY DAD, RUSSELL + BURDETTE + PROVED THAT BURDETTE'S FATHER WAS THEODORICK WARTHEN (b. 1782 IN MD. - d. 1857 IN LICKING Co. OHIO) HE HAD ONE PROVEN 1/2 BROTHER, ALBAN (b. 1788 IN VA. OR MD. - d. 1834 IN LICKING Co. OHIO.

I TRACED ALBAN BACK TO HIS m. IN 1810 IN LICKING Co. + THEODORICK TO A TAX LIST IN FAUQUIER Co. VA. IN 1807 WHEN HE WAS STILL SINGLE - AND THEN THERE IT STAYED UNTIL LATER THAT YR. WHEN I WENT TO LICKING Co. + THE OHIO ST. LIBRARY IN COLUMBUS.

THERE I FOUND A NICHOLAS WARTHEN IN AN 1834 TAX CENSUS LIVING WITH MY GGGF ON HIS PROPERTY IN LICKING Co. I TRACKED NICH. TO PERRY Co. OHIO WHERE IN 1840 HE WAS LIVING NEXT DOOR TO THOMAS WARTHEN + THEN ON TO BLACKFORD Co. IND. IN 1850 + CHICKASAW Co. IOWA IN 1860 + 70. I SENT MY SISTER TO IND. THE 1880 CENSUS OF IND. SAID THAT JAMES FERRY (NICH'S SON) WAS b. IN OHIO THAT HIS FATHER WAS b. IN MD. A PEARL WARTHEN OF CALMAR, IOWA SENT ME A COPY OF NICH'S WAR OF 1812 PENSION APPLICATION + I KNEW FOR SURE THAT THE NICH. IN 1834 IN OHIO WAS THE SAME AS THE NICH. OF FRED. Co + THAT THE THOMAS OF FERRY Co. IN 1840 WAS NO DOUBT THE THOMAS OF FRED. Co. WHO DISAPPEARED FROM THERE AFTER 1830. TO DO RESEARCH

IN INVESTIGATING FERRY Co. OHIO, I FOUND A HENRY WARTHEN IN THE CENSUS FOR 1850 + 60. HE WAS b. IN MD. IN 1790 - 1 + WAS ALSO A SHOEMAKER IN CINCINNATI. DID HE GOE TO DAYTON WITH FRANCIS + THE DRILLS IN 1828 OR DID HE JOIN NICH. + THOMAS IN FERRY Co. IN THE 1840'S?

I ALREADY KNEW OF A WILLIAM WARTHEN WHO WAS NEAR THEODORICK IN THE 1810 CENSUS OF FAUQUIER Co. + IN 1820 IN HARRISON Co. VA.

ONE OF THEM HAD A SON NATHAN. LEONARD WATHEN  
HAD A SON ~~E~~ WILLIAM. WILLIAM NAMED A SON NATHAN  
AND, IN THE 1850 CENSUS WILLIAM WATHEN HAD A  
WILLIAM BURDETT, SON OF NATHAN BURDETT, LIVING IN  
HIS HOUSEHOLD WHILE THEODORICK & MARTHA (HUSBAND  
& WIFE) WERE LIVING IN OHIO.

NOW, I CANNOT GIVE A DAY BY DAY ACCOUNTING  
OF HOW ALL OF THIS CAME ABOUT BUT THERE WAS  
A BURDETT/WATHEN CONNECTION GOING BACK IN  
FAUQUIER Co. TO AT LEAST 1799 & PROBABLY TO  
1786-7 & SOMEHOW LEON. & ELIAS GOT INVOLVED.

10. HENRY WARTHAN. (DIFFERENT / MUCH OLDER THAN  
#5). THE ONLY PERSON LISTED IN MONT. Co. IN  
1790 USING THE "R" SPELLING IS HENRY WARTHAN  
WHO IS LISTED AS A MOVER 16 LIVING WITH  
ANOTHER MOVER 16 & 2 FEMALES. THEY LIVE A  
GOOD DISTANCE FROM THE WATHENS WHO ARE  
UP AROUND CLARKSBURG IN THE NW PART OF COUNTY.  
HENRY LIVES BELOW ROCKVILLE ALONG THE RIVER.  
I CANNOT PROVE THIS, BUT I'VE ALWAYS FELT THAT

THIS IS THE SAME HENRY + HIS BROTHER EDWARD + THEIR WIVES WHO ACTUALLY LIVED ACROSS THE RIVER IN FAIRFAX CO. BUT WHO MAY HAVE HAD LAND IN MONT. CO. THE 2 IN FAIRFAX CO. IN 1790, WERE MATURE MEN WITH GROWN FAMILIES. EDW. d. PRIOR TO 1810 + HENRY c. 1813. THERE IS A HENRY WARRING IN THE SAME DISTRICT IN MONT. CO. IN 1810 LISTED AS A SINGLE M OVER 45. THE FAIRFAX HENRY WAS ALMOST 80 AT THE TIME.

BECAUSE OF THEIR BIRTH DATES (c. 1730), I'VE ALWAYS FELT THEY MIGHT BE 2 OF HENRY'S SONS. BUT - THAT IS ANOTHER MATTER. NEITHER CAN I CONNECT THIS HENRY WITH ANYONE ELSE ON THIS LIST. I ONLY INCLUDE HIM BECAUSE OF THE SPELLING OF HIS NAME + BECAUSE NO ONE ELSE CLAIMS HIM + BECAUSE I WANT HIM OUT OF THE WAY BEFORE I GET TO #'S 11, 12 + 13 AND THEN ON TO A 3RD HENRY

AM I WEARING YOU OUT?

I'LL TAKE FRANCIS FIRST SINCE IT'S MOST DIFFICULT TO SEPERATE HIM FROM THE OTHER 2. ALSO, HE SEEMS TO DISAPPEAR AFTER HIS M. TO E. DRILL IN 1807 UNTIL 1830 WHEN HE APPEARS IN 1830 IN MONTGOMERY CO. OHIO LIVING NEAR ANDREW + GEO. DRILL WHO WERE LIVING NEXT DOOR TO NICHOLAS (#3) IN FRED. CO. MD. IN 1820. HE COULD (WITH HIS WIFE) HAVE BEEN LIVING WITH CHRISTIAN DRILL IN 1820 OR HE COULD BE THE FRANCIS WATHAN LISTED IN MONT. CO. IN 1820 - AND AS FOR 1810, PERHAPS HE + ELIZ. ARE LIVING WITH MARTIN. IN ANY CASE FRANCIS, b. c. 1787 WAS YOUNGER BY 10 YRS. THAN U. F. + WAS LIVING IN OHIO IN 1830 WHEN U. F. WAS IN FRED. CO. + 5 YRS. AFTER JOHN II HAD DIED.

JOHN FRANCIS WAS b. c. 1777 IN MD. HIS DEATH RECORD + 2 OTHER DOCUMENTS LIST HIM AS FRANK AND THE 1820 CENSUS AS FRANCIS. HE APPARENTLY HAD AN EARLY M. AS THE 1810 CENSUS HAS HIM AS U. WARTON, A M 26-45 LIVING WITH A FEMALE 26-45 AND 2 MALES, ONE 10-16

WHO I ASSUME IS JOHN JR. (1795-1825) + HENRY  
B. c. 1797-1802. IN 1814 JOHN JR. AGE 19 GOES  
OFF TO THE ARMY WITH (UNCLE?) NICHOLAS,  
AGE 29, HE M. IN 1817 + IN 1820 IS LIVING 2  
DOORS FROM (HIS FATHER?) JOHN FRANCIS.

IN 1820 J.F. IS WITH KEARNEY ADKINS +  
LISTS HIS FIRST SON WITH HER IN ADDITION TO 2  
MALES 16-26, ONE OF WHOM WOULD BE HENRY.  
THE OTHER COULD BE THE MALE LISTED IN 1810  
AS 10-16 BUT IF THIS WAS JOHN HE'S NOW LISTED  
SEPERATELY, LIVING 2 DOORS AWAY. SO EITHER  
THE 10-16 YR OLD IN 1810 WAS NOT JOHN OR HE GOT  
LISTED TWICE IN 1820 OR ELSE THE 2ND MALE  
IN 1820 IS SOMEONE ELSE (SUCH AS A BROTHER  
OF KEARNEY.)

I FEEL AS YOU - THAT HAD U.F. BEEN ABLE TO  
M. KEARNEY - HE WOULD HAVE DONE SO - BUT I FEEL  
HIS FIRST WIFE WAS STILL AROUND, MAYBE - LIKE MY  
GREAT GRANDMOTHER, SHE RAN LEFT HER FIRST  
FAMILY OR PERHAPS WAS INSTITUTIONALIZED, EITHER  
AS INSANE, OR, AS RAPHEAL WARTHEN, PERHAPS  
SHE WAS A SURVIVOR OF THE 1798 SMALLPOX  
EPIDEMIC - BUT, LIKE A LEPPER, WAS CONFINED

SHOWN. HE WAS ALIVE + WELL IN 1830 WHILE JOHN  
WAS DEAD + FRANCIS IN OHIO. IN 1840, KEARNEY  
ADKINS IS STILL LIVING IN FRED. CO. + EVIDENTLY  
CARING FOR THE YOUNGEST OF HER CHILDREN BY J.F.  
BUT BY 1850 SHE IS GONE, WHETHER SHE DIED OR  
JUST GOT SICK OF LONG COURT BATTLE WITH SEVERAL  
OF THE CHILDREN OF J.F.'S WILL + WALKED AWAY  
FROM IT ALL, I DON'T KNOW BUT I FIND NO RECORD OF  
HER AFTER 1840

AFTER ALL, SHE GAVE BIRTH TO THEM + RAISED  
THEM + EVEN WHILE THEY WERE STILL LIVING, HER  
SUED HER TO TAKE AWAY EVERYTHING J.F. HAD LEFT



HER, TRYING TO TAKE ADVANTAGE OF THE FACT THEIR FATHER NEVER m. HER.

ANYWAY, IN 1850 THE 3 YOUNGEST KIDS OF J.F. ARE LIVING WITH A HENRY WARTHEN WHO SAYS HE WAS b. IN MD. IN 1797. NOW - ASSUMING HENRY (#5), WHO SAYS HE WAS b. IN MD. IN 1790, IS A BROTHER OF J.F. - THIS WOULD GIVE J.F. TWO BROTHERS NAMED HENRY + IF JOHN (1795-1825) IS NOT THE SON OF J.F. THEN WE HAVE THE POSSIBILITY OF J.F. HAVING ANOTHER BROTHER NAMED JOHN.

NO. I THINK JOHN WAS THE SON OF J.F. + IS LISTED LIVING WITH HIM IN 1810 + 2 DOORS AWAY IN 1820 + THAT HENRY IS ANOTHER SON OF J.F. - LISTED WITH HIM IN 1810, 20 + 30, LIVING BY HIMSELF IN 1840 + CARING FOR HIS 3 YOUNG 1/2 BROTHERS + SISTER, IN 1850.

OH - ANOTHER THING I FORGOT, JOHN (1795-1825) + NICHOLAS (#3) m. SISTERS + NICH. (#3) OTHER WIFE WAS A SISTER OF THOMAS (#4) - OTHER CONNECTIONS.

ANYWAY, I KNOW YOU WILL NOT WANT TO AGREE WITH MY ANALYSIS OF THE J.F. + JOHN JR. SITUATION BUT - IT'S RIGHT THERE. EXCEPT JRS. SHORT TOUR OF DUTY IN THE ARMY IN 1814 WITH NICH. (2), HE APPARENTLY <sup>WAS</sup> NEVER MORE THAN A COUPLE 100 YDS. FROM J.F. SO - IF HE WASN'T HIS SON - I DON'T <sup>KNOW</sup> WHAT HE WAS - A COUSIN? - HIS FATHER HAD TO BE SOMEWHERE CLOSE BY AS JOHN WAS QUITE YOUNG WHEN HE JOINED THE ARMY IN 1814 - 18 OR 19 - AND STILL QUITE YOUNG WHEN HE m. I THINK HE HAD SERIOUS TIES + SUPPORT NEAR BY.

BUT - LET'S DROP THAT + GET ON TO THE LARGER QUESTION OF WHERE THESE 12 OR SO BOYS CAME FROM + ASSUMING ROUGHLY THE SAME # OF GIRLS - WE ARE LOOKING AT 20+ CHILDREN ALL b.c. 1772-1793.

So - RIGHT AWAY WE ARE PROBABLY NOT LOOKING AT JUST ONE FATHER. ALTHO IGNATIUS (1679-1757) WAS m. 3 TIMES + HAD 24 CHILDREN, THAT WAS EVEN BY 18TH CENT. STANDARDS, A LITTLE EXCESSIVE + BY c. 1775 DEFINATELY EXCESSIVE.

I WOULD THINK MAYBE 1 OR 2 (MARTIN?) OF THESE MIGHT BE PART OF THE MONT. Co. BUNCH - GRANDSONS

THE OTHER 2 ARE MY 'BACKWARDS' CHARTS ON WHICH I'VE TAKEN EVERY WARTHEN / WARTHEN, ETC I'VE FOUND b. BEFORE 1850 + TRIED TO TRACE THEM BACK TO JOHN.

MY 'FORWARD' CHART HAS PRECIOUS FEW OPENINGS. I'M STILL A LITTLE CONCERNED OVER I.G.N. (1679-1757). A COUPLE OF HIS SONS HAVE LEFT NO TRAIL + I FEAR THERE MAY HAVE BEEN 1-2 OTHERS UNAMED IN HIS WILL - BUT - BY + LARGE I AGREE WITH THE WORK DONE BY JOHNSON, COLLINS, BELLIS, ETC + AM WILLING TO HAND OVER MAYBE 15-20 PEOPLE ON MY 'BACKWARD' CHART AS MISSING LINKS DESCENDING FROM I.G.N. JOHN OR HUDSON + THEN CLOSE THEIR CASES.

LETS ALSO ADMIT THAT I'M OFF 'BASE' ON ANOTHER 15 OR SO - THAT THEY <sup>ARE</sup> WARTHONS, WATKINS, HORTONS, MORTONS OR WHATEVER.

I'VE STILL GOT 40-50 PEOPLE ON MY CHARTS WHO GO BACK TO MD. WHO DON'T BELONG TO ANY OF THOSE 3 OF JOHNS' BOYS.

I'M ELIMINATING THE 4TH - JAMES. I WAS CONCERNED ABOUT JAMES, AS I FOUND LAND BEING SOLD IN HIS NAME IN CHAS. CO. IN THE LATE 1750'S EVEN THO HE'D

LISTS A SON HENRY HIS 1751 WHO WAS PROBABLY BY HIS 1ST WIFE (— WARRING?) (c. 1710-20?) WHO IS NOT LISTED IN ANY FAMILY RECORD BUT IF HE WAS b. THAT EARLY HE'D HAVE BEEN AT LEAST 90 IN 1813 + SINCE IEN. DOES NOT LIST AN EDWARD, I STILL FAVOR HENRY AS THE FATHER

So - AS FAR AS PG + HENRY GO - THERE IS A JOHN WARTHEN WHO APPEARS 3 TIMES IN PG RECORDS BETWEEN 1772-6 BUT THERE IS NOTHING VERY REVEALING EXCEPT THAT HE'S OBVIOUSLY OF AGE BY 1772.

So - IF HENRY OF FAIRFAX IS HENRY'S SON + THE SAME AS HENRY OF LOWER MONT. Co. + IF JOHN OF PG Co. IS HENRY'S SON + IF LEONARD + ELIAS ARE HIS SONS,

THEODORICK MAKES HIS 1ST APPEARANCE IN ANY RECORDS IN A FAUQUIER Co. TAX LIST IN 1807 + IS THERE EVERY YR. THRU 1813 (INCLUDING THE 1810 CENSUS) WHEN HE M. JAMES BURDETTS' DAUGHTER, MARTHA + MOVES TO HARRISON Co. VA.

I THINK THIS SHOWS THAT AT LEAST PART OF THIS FAMILY WAS IN VA. BY 1799 (MY GUESS IS 1786-7) — BUT — WHO IS MARY?

TO APPEAR AS A WITNESS IN 1799, ONE WOULD ASSUME A BIRTH DATE OF 1781 OR SO — OR BEFORE. WAS THIS ONE OF THE OLDER SISTERS OF THIS FAMILY OR WAS SHE THE LAST WIFE OF THE FATHER?

IN AN 1827 TRIAL IN LICKING CO. THEO. APPEARS AS A WITNESS FOR ALBAN + WHEN ASKED HIS RELATIONSHIP TO THE DEFENDANT, HE SAYS "HE IS MY 1/2 BROTHER — NO, HE IS MY BROTHER!"

J.F. THEO. + NICH. WERE B. IN MD. IN 1777, 1782 + 1785 RESPECTIVELY BUT THERE IS CONTROVERSY OVER HENRY (1790), WM. (1792-3) + PARTICULARLY ALBAN (1788). SEVERAL OF HIS CHILDREN INSIST ALBAN WAS B. IN VA.

SO — HERE IS WHAT I THINK:

THIS FAMILY BEGAN ABOUT 1773 IN CHAS. PG. OR AA CO. IN MD. + ALL THE CHILDREN THRU NICH. WERE B. THERE TO THE 1ST WIFE.

IN 1786-7 THIS FAMILY CROSSED THE RIVER INTO VA. + MOST OF THE REST OF THE CHILDREN STARTING WITH MAYBE ALBAN WERE B. THERE.

THE FATHER D. C. 1793 + SEVERAL THE OLDER CHILDREN (MARTIN - J.F.) TRAVELLED WEST TO FRED. CO. MD. WHILE PART OF THE FAMILY STAYED IN VA.

THIS PARTY WHICH WENT TO MD. MAY HAVE INCLUDED BURDETT'S + SHIRLEY'S AS THERE WAS AT LEAST 1 m. BETWEEN THEM IN VA. + BOTH SHOW UP IN W. MD. ABOUT THE SAME TIME.

EVENTUALLY, THEO, ALBAN, NICH, THOMAS + HENRY ALL MET UP AGAIN IN LICKING + PERRY CO. OHIO. FRANCIS + MAYBE MARTIN OR ANOTHER BROTHER WENT TO MONT. CO. OHIO. JOHN D. YOUNG + J.F. STAYED IN MD.

ONE OR 2 OTHERS MAY HAVE GONE TO PA. HAD JOHN LIVED TO WITNESS THIS EXODUS TO OHIO BEGINNING IN 1828 I THINK HE WOULD HAVE STAYED AS HIS FATHER WAS STILL LIVING NEARBY AS WAS HENRIETTA'S FAMILY

AND SHE, I BELIEVE WAS VERY CATHOLIC + PROBABLY DID NOT APPROVE OF MANY OF THE WARTHENS, PARTICULARLY NICH. + J.F. + (IF SHE KNEW HIM) ALBAN. I THINK SHE TOOK THE BOYS + MOVED N. TO EMMITSBURG TO THE CATHOLIC SETTLEMENT THERE TO AVOID THE INFLUENCE THEIR GRANDFATHER + UNCLE WOULD HAVE ON THEM. (J.F. OWNED A TAVERN + HAD A COMMON-LAW WIFE + NICH. WORKED AS LITTLE AS POSSIBLE + STOLE WHAT HE COULD + ALBAN SPENT MOST OF HIS ADULT LIFE IN A COURT ROOM - WHEN HE WASN'T TENDING BAR OR GAMBLING OR RUNNING HIS STILL).

NOW - AS TO WHERE THIS FAMILY CAME FROM. I'VE PRETTY MUCH COVERED HENRY + THE PG GROUP, NICHOLAS + THE AA GROUP + THE POSSIBILITY OF A SON OF I.G.N. (BOTH LISTED + UNLISTED). BUT THERE IS ONE MORE POSSIBILITY + IT CONCERNS THIS WILLIAM THE MARINER WHO WAS IN VA. + THE WILLIAM WHO IS IN CHAS. CO. MD.

I WAS IN RICHMOND, VA. FOR A WEEK IN 1981, ANOTHER WEEK IN 1987 + SEVERAL DAYS IN 1991 + EACH TIME READ + RE-READ ALL OF THE CHAS. CITY / CO. + PRINCE GEORGE CO. VA. RECORDS. I XEROXED ALL OF THEM AND HAVE STUDIED THEM MANY TIMES AT HOME.

BUT EVEN PRIOR TO THIS I WAS CONCERNED AS TO WHY JOHN WATHEN FROM BRISTOL (THO HE WAS THE ONLY <sup>ONE</sup> DESTINED FOR MD. WAS ON A SHIP GOING TO VA.

I EVENTUALLY CONCLUDED THAT JOHN WAS FIRST GOING TO VISIT HIS (UNCLE? GRANDFATHER?) WM. IN VA. PERHAPS TO GET HIM TO BUY HIM OUT OF HIS SERVITUDE + WORK FOR HIM INSTEAD OF GOING TO MD.

(JOHN WAS A CARPENTER + FARMER + WM. OWNED A MILL + 1600 ACRES OR SO.)

BUT WHEN JOHN ARRIVED, HE FOUND WM. HAD DIED (OR AS CAROL COLLINS SAYS) OR RETURNED TO ENGLAND + RICHARD (WHO WAS NOT EVEN RELATED) WAS RUNNING THE ESTATE - + WANTED NOTHING TO DO WITH JOHN + SENT HIM ON HIS WAY.

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Now - to those records; in Chas. City Co. Va. + Henrico Co. Va. starting about 1638 there is a ship captain named Wm. from "Bristow". His name is spelled Worsnam, Worsuham, Wortham, Worthumy (once) Wathen. He had 3 natural sons - John Worthem, and Will + Geo. Worsnam and an adopted son Richard (Holmes) Warthen. Around 1670, Will + Geo + their father all die + the estate in PG Co. is left to Richard + the other property to John + the orphans of Will + Geo. In 1665, this Wm. is ordered by the court to pay the burial costs of James Wathen.

At the same time - starting about 1665 in Northumberland Co. Va. there are about 5 listings for a Wm. Wathen, a ship capt. from Bristol who is m. to an Ellen Lindsey, adopts a daughter Eliz. Roberts (1665) and also "disappears" c. 1670. (His widow remarries a Wm. Orie in England in 1671).

Carol Collins says this Wm. arrived in Va. in 1667-8 + returned to England + d. there. I think he d. in Va. but that isn't what's important.

What is important is that I am certain these "2" Wms. were one in the same and that:

- A. THE PGEO. Co. WARTHENS + THEIR DESCENDANTS (INCLUDING THE WARTHEN, GA. CLAN COME THRU RICHARD HOLMES WARTHEN.
- B. THAT MOST OF THE SOUTHERN "WORTHAMS" DESCEND FROM WMS. SON JOHN + WMS GRANDSONS CHARLES, GEORGE + PERHAPS A FURTHER JOHN.
- C. THAT THE N.C. Wm. WARTHEN + JAMES WORTHAM ARE SONS OF AN EDW. WARTHEN WHO LEAVES A WILL IN WARREN Co. N.C. IN 1767 + IS SELLING LAND IN VA. DURING THE 60's + WAS b. IN 1705 JUST ACROSS THE BORDER FROM WARREN Co. IN BRUNSWICK Co. VA. + WHO'S FATHER WAS GEO. THE GRANDSON OF Wm. THE MARINER.
- D. THAT THE Wm. IN CHAS. Co. MD. WHO D. THERE IN 1724 IS ANOTHER GRANDSON OF THIS Wm. WHO WENT N. TO CHAS. Co. c. 1710 TO VISIT HIS MD. COUSINS AND THAT -
- E. BECAUSE OF ALL THESE "UNCLAIMED" WATHEN/WARTHENS WHO BEGIN APPEARING IN MD. RECORDS c. 1750 - THAT THIS Wm.

it was killed, the wants of a hungry family prompted him to call to mind the fact that the disciples plucked the ears of corn on the Sabbath, and he waived a critical scrutiny of the means through which the blessing came. He saw the ribs of the supposed mastadon taken from Major Robinson's mill-race in 1811. They were three in number and six feet long. Mr. Conard, before his death, to the best of his memory, placed the early settlers of this township about as follows: John Lee came in 1808, and during the years 1808-9-10, John Moore, William Blackburn, Patrick Moore, Nathaniel Kirkpatrick, William Robertson, Abel Wilson, Phillip Smoots, John Haas, John McKnaughton and wife, and perhaps others, came. William Robertson and his brother James came to the present site of Utica in 1810. In 1808 William came to Zanesville, purchased three lots and erected the first shingle-roofed house in that town. In 1810 the two brothers purchased the ground upon which Utica now stands, erected a cabin and log mill upon the site of the present mill, the millwright work being done by that well known and somewhat eccentric Irish pioneer, James King. In January, 1813, William returned to Franklin county, Pennsylvania, where he married in February, and he and his bride started on a bridal tour westward on horseback. They encountered swollen streams frequently, some of which they were compelled to cross in "dug-outs,"\* swimming their horses behind the craft. They arrived at Judge Wilson's, now East Newark, March 2d, and the ladies being acquainted, they remained over night and part of the following day, spending the following night with Moses Moore. On the morning of the fourth they set out for their home in the wilderness, swimming their horses across the streams that intervene. When they arrived in sight of their cabin the Licking was yet to be crossed, and in attempting this the lady's horse became entangled, either in flood-wood or floating ice, and in his efforts to disengage himself, threw his fair rider off. Fortunately she landed in an eddy at the foot of the tail race, and seizing a root, held on until her husband landed and fished her out with a long pole. What strength these pioneers must have had to endure a journey on horseback of three

hundred miles through such a wilderness as then existed. HER CHILD. IN 1812-13.

Isaac Vanousdall was among the earliest settlers in this section, but settled just over the line in Knox county; his history, however, is interwoven with that of the early pioneers of this township. He died February 28, 1873, in his eighty-sixth year.

Jacob Sperry first visited Utica (then Wilming ton), in 1811. In 1813 he returned to Virginia and married, returning and settling here permanently in 1815. He and his wife both died in the same week, in July, 1873, at the age of eighty-four and eighty-two respectively.

Mrs. Rachel Penn, who died in September 1874, came to this township in November, 1811. In the notice of the death of this lady the *Pioneer Record* says:

"She was, at the time of her death, the oldest member of the Methodist church, in Utica. She was born in Maryland March 16, 1788, and had, therefore, reached the age of eighty six years and six months. Mrs. Penn was the last survivor of twenty-five adult persons, who came to Ohio together from Maryland, sixty-three years ago."

Her brothers Erasmus and Lemuel Jones came in 1813. The house in which Mrs. Penn lived until her death was erected in that year.

The first wedding in the township was, probably that of Alban Warthen, and Elizabeth Vance, in February, 1811; the second was, probably the double wedding of Joshua Berry and Mary Penn, and Elijah Ryan and Margaret Penn in 1812. John Conard was, probably, the first child born in the township.

The first cabin school-house was erected about 1814, on Major Robertson's land near the Kirkpatrick line. Matthew Jamison taught the first school, followed by James Kirkland, William Cunningham, William Derbin, and a Mr. Jewett.

Mr. C. B. Giffin, in his paper on this township, thus describes a log school-house and school of his acquaintance. He says:

"I can describe a school of the date of 1820 to 1830 so accurately that my friends, Robertson, Penn, Moore, and others, will imagine themselves boys again, sitting in the shape of a figure four upon a backless bench, made by inserting round dog-wood poles in the rough sides of sawed or split slabs. The writing desks were of the same material, supported by the inevitable dog-wood pegs in the wall; and above these desks a log was cut out and the leaves of last year's copy book, well greased with lard, placed over the aperture for the admission of
