HUSBAND - Moses Sanders

In order to understand my research concerning 'Rev. Moses Sanders' it is necessary to understand the purpose of life as practiced by the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints, commonly referred to as 'Mormon Church.'

Genesis Ch.1 Verse 27 states:"So God created man in his own image, in the image of God created he him; male and female created he them." As God said of our first parents: Genesis 3:22: "Behold, the man is become as one of us, to know good and evil."

In answer to a lawyers question, Matthew 22:36-40: "Jesus said unto him, Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind. This is the first and great commandment. And the second is like unto it, Thou shalt love thy neighbor as thyself. On these two commandments hang all the laws and the prophets."

As Apostle Paul wrote to the Philippians 2:12: "Work out his own salvation with fear and trembling." Man's activities in this life will influence him in his life to come, as Jesus said to his apostles in John 14:2: "In my father's house are many mansions...I go to prepare a place for you."

Knowing why we are here, let us examine the nature of the steps we must take to obtain salvation. Paul, writing to the Hebrews (6:1-2) says: "Therefore leaving the principles of the doctrine of Christ, let us go on to perfection; not laying again the foundation of repentance from dead works, and of faith toward God, of the doctrine of baptisms, and of laying on of hands."

You may recall from reading Luke 23:42-43 the conversation between Jesus and the thief as they hung on the crosses. The thief: "said unto Jesus. Lord remember me when thou comest into thy kingdom. And Jesus said unto him, Verily I say unto thee, Today shalt thou be with me in paradise." Many interpret this to mean that Christ granted the thief the privilege of entering into his kingdom, when he already expained to Nicodemus (John 3:5) "except a man be born of water (baptized) and of the spirit(receive the laying on of hands for the gift of the Holy Ghost) he cannot enter into the Kingdom of God." The thief not having received these ordinances, could lay no claim to that privilege.

After the body of Jesus had lain in the tomb for three days, the spirit again entered his body and he walked forth clothed with an immortal body of flesh and bones. Jesus said to Mary Magdalene (John 20:16-17):"Touch me not: for I am not yet ascended to my father: but go to my brethren and say unto them, I ascend unto my Father, and your Father; and to my God and your God." Here Jesus declared that during the three days immediately subsequent to his crucifixion, while his body lay in the tomb, his spirit did not go into heaven or the presence of his Father. Logically then - neither did the thief's spirit. Where had he been during these three days? He had transferred the keys of the kingdom of heaven to Peter (Matthew 16:19) who stood at the head of the twelve apostles. I Peter 3:18-20 provides an answer. "For Christ also hath once suffered for sins, the just for the unjust, that he might bring us to God, being put to death in the flesh, but quickened by the spirit: By which also he went and preached unto the spirits in prison: which sometime were disobedient, when once the long suffering of God waited in the days of Noah. . ." Here we have an account of what Christ was doing during his three days absence from his body - preaching in the spirit world. We also have a clear explanation where the thief went - to a spirit prison where he would have an opportunity to hear the gospel of deliverance preached to the captive spirits.

Just previous to his death, Jesus said to his apostles as recorded in John 5:25,28: "Verily, verily, I say unto you, the hour is coming, and now is, when the dead shall hear the voice of the Son of God: and they that hear shall live....Marvel not at this: for the hour is coming, in the which all that are in the graves shall hear his voice."

Turning again to the Epistle of Peter (I Peter 4:5-6) we find this assertion: "Who shall give account to him that is ready to judge the quick and the dead. For for this cause was the gospel preached also to them that are dead, that they might be judged according to men in the flesh, but live according to God in the spirit." And thus people who lived and died and did not have a chance to receive the Gospel of Jesus Christ and be baptized while in the flesh are having another opportunity by being taught in the spirit world.

The word of the Lord through the prophet Malachi (4:5-6) was: "Behold, I will send you Elijah the prophet before the coming of the

great and dreadful day of the Lord; And he shall turn the heart of the fathers to the children, and the heart of the children to their fathers, lest I come and smite the earth with a curse."

Remember that Jesus told Nicodemus (John 3:5): "except a man be born of water and of the spirit, he cannot enter into the Kingdom of God." But how can a spirit be born of water, or be baptized in the water? Great numbers of those who have gone into the spirit world have never submitted to the ordinance of baptism, while vast numbers of those who were baptized had the ordinances administered by one who held no rightful authority.

By turning to another of Paul's epistles (1 Corinthians 15:29) we learn how we may be instruments in the hands of a wise creator in doing a work for the dead: "Else what shall they do which are baptized for the dead, if the dead rise not at all? Why are they then baptized for the dead?"

This is an explanation of how the prisoners may be set free: by the ordinance of baptism for the dead. Those who are in the flesh do vicarious work for their dead and become "Saviours on Mount Zion."

Moses Sanders' will was recorded 12 Jan 1847. (Film 361,854 page 118) It reads: "State of Georgia Franklin County 6 Feb 1844. In the name of God amen. I Moses Sanders Senr. of the State and County aforesaid being of sound mind and body do ordain and constitute this my last will and testament: 1st I resign my body to the dust & my Spirit to God who gave it. 2nd I give and bequeath to my son Johns Heirs Two Small negroes 3rd I give and bequeath unto my son Harris Sanders and 4th I give and bequeath unto my son Minyard Sanders and 5th I give and bequeath unto my son Stephen Sanders and 6th I give and bequeath unto my daughter Nancy and 7th I give and bequeath unto my daughter Sarah and 8th I give and bequeath unto my daughter Elizabeth and 9th I give and bequeath unto my daughter Martha and her heirs (at my decease), as severally, above named all my wordly goods and effects to be equally divided amongst my heirs as above named after the heirs of my son John receives their two small negroes as above named then said heirs to be equal heirs with the rest of my heirs as above named and 10th I further will and bequeath to my daughter Polly (Dec'd) heirs five dollars as their full share of my estate and also:

And I further constitute and appoint Richard Wilbanks and Minyard Sanders to execute this my last will and testament Hereby revoking all former wills and I do further ordain that my son Stephens property remain in the hands of Harris Sanders and Richard Wilbanks to be given him as they may think necessity requires. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the day and date above written. Moses Sanders, seal Signed and sealed in presence of us. Williamson Mize, William Perry, Donald McDonald Jr. Presented to court 8 Dec 1846. Recorded 12 Jan 1847" 8 Dec 1846 - Wm Mize & Donald McDonald appeared before William Turk & Isaac Aderhold, two of the Judges of the Court of Ordinary & said they saw Moses Sanders sign & seal this will. Jan Term 1847 The last will & testament of Moses Sanders dec'd. being presented to the court, and it appearing that said will was heretofore proved before William Turk & Isaac M Aderhold two of the judges of the court in vacation & no objections being now made at this term. It is ordered that the same be recorded & the executors therein named qualified as the law requires. Recorded 12 Jan 1847.

Film 0365926 page 137: 1 Sep 1851 Ordered by the court that Richard Wilbanks & Minyard Sanders, Executors of the estate of Moses Sanders Dec'd. have leave to sell all the lands belonging to said estate upon their giving legal notice of the same. 1 Mar 1852 Court of Ordinary March Term 1852 pages 148-149. "The petition of Minyard Sanders Executor of the Estate of Moses Sanders and sheweth that he has fully administered said estate and that he has paid over the distribution shares thereof and prays that he may be dismissed from the further administration thereof. Such prompts me to enclose a link in the chain of chronology that will hand down the unstained name of our family to the unknown ages of the future."

"Whilst my mind runs back along the family pathway through the lights and shades of several generations for nearly two hundred years I am delighted to find no dark lines recorded no traces that lead from the roll of honor no stains or disgrace to mar the bright heroism of the future generation of the family that will follow in our footprints."

"Our grandfather Moses Sanders was born in the early part of the 18th century. His life was spent in agriculture as a pursuit and theology as a profession being a baptist preacher. Our grandfather John Robins was a merchant in Virginia."

"John Sanders our father was born in North Carolina March 2nd A.D. 1787. Our mother Aby Richardson Sanders daughter of John Robins was born in Virginia Aug 18th 1796. Father and mother were married in North Carolina in A.D. 18__ (left blank-should read 1811). They lived together nearly long enough to celebrate their golden wedding - fifty years. Father lived the quiet life of an independent planter having owned slaves prior to the commencement of the late war. In the early days of his life he was a soldier being engaged in the Indian War of A.D. 1812."

"Our eldest sister Acenith married William Muckelroy. Sister Thursialou having married A.G. Pearson whose family is quite honorable. Our sister Jiney married Joseph Carter. Our sister Elizabeth married Henry Derryberry. Our eldest brother Lovel Dogaus never married. He was taken prisoner by the Federals in 1863 during the late war and never heard from. James Monroe gave most of his time to agriculture and politics he was quite a prominent member of the general assembly of the State of Arkansas in 1860. He was a brave captain in the war between the states. Josiah Hardin lived in Texas engaged in farming and stock raising was a brave soldier and lost his life in defense of his country 1863. Cardinal Walsey, lived in Tenn. engaged in planting was also a brave and generous soldier and officer in the late war and lost his life in service 1864. Simeon Lafayette the youngest son was born in Miss. 31st May A.D. 1839. He is more inclined to a mercantile and political life excels many of his fellows in many good and chivalrous deeds one who wins at will and holds his friends with a strengthened chain. During the war he was engaged for four years coming out with honors and scars having never missed an engagement unless brought down by the casualties of war. He married Miss Mary Pinnay Young daughter of I. P. Young of this city in the year 1867. Is a prominent citizen of this city and has made well merited reputation as a political officer and commercial tourist. This family consists of four members self wife & two bright intelligent & beautiful little girls Mattie & Mary. Now I have given a biographical sketch of each member of the family save one, the writer. Moses Marion Sanders."

"as a rule the family has an inclination to morality; and religion. The writer and next to the youngest and only son living except Fayette was born Jan A.D. 1838. During his early life he was engaged in agriculture and attending country schols in company with his brothers Walsey and Lafayette. He graduated in medicine in 1860 Joined the 1st Ark infantry in Feb 1861."

"Fayette and I soldiers together the entire war receiving three wounds each both alike held positions as officers in our command. The writer married Miss Cynthia C. Bruton daughter of Benjamin Bruton of this city Dec 19, 1865. We have a pleasant little family circle with only one we miss from home. Our first is in the grave. The oldest boy Simeon Alonzo a bright boy very sprightly and bids to be an elocutionist of note. 2nd boy Earl Bruton quick intelligent and much inclined to refinement 3rd boy Marcus Marion bright, joyous and happy more mischievous than ever was the "father of his country." 4th Edna our girl endowed with more spirit and will and equal mind to any of the boys. 5th Sweet Lena "our first" is in the cold silent tomb."
