I am fearful the enclosed are not quite sufficient to obtain a pension; but I wish to draw to the Paymaster General that Blakelee's regiment was composed entirely of volunteers suddenly assembled, who fought bravely, and were as suddenly dispersed when the emergency was over. If possible they were never mustered or paid. I would solicit an inspection of the papers, as favorable a view of them as is consistent with duty, and as speedy information as possible, of what further will be required.

I certify that the signature of General Blake to the within affidavits is genuine, that he was a Justice of the Peace for the county of Ontario in the State of New York at the time they were dated, and was lawfully authorized to administer oaths.

And I further certify that Blake's regiment of volunteers was called into the service of the United States under the authority of the act of Congress; that it was suddenly assembled, fought with distinguished bravery, and was dispersed when the emergency was over; and that I believe it never was mustered or paid.

That I have detained pensions for soldiers disabled in that regiment in the action at Wade's Wade on the 29th December 1813, and that it has uniformly been considered as having been in the service of the United States, by the officers of ~~the~~ different departments.
