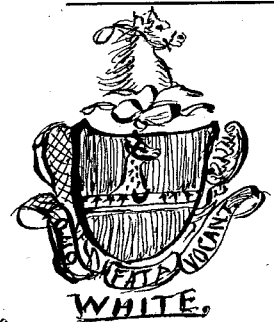

OBITUARY

Col. John Hitchins

On Thursday, 17th ult., Col. John Hitchins of Amherst Island, passed peacefully away at the ripe age of 84 years. After a painless illness of two weeks, faithfully attended by his two sons and daughter, the end came as a quiet sleep, fitting close to a calm and earnest life. The deceased was born of English parentage on Amherst Island and remained a resident throughout his whole life, dying on the same farm on which he was born. He was educated at Bath academy, then one of the leading institutions of learning in the province of Upper Canada. In the troubles of 1837-38 he was one of the first to come to his country's aid and was instrumental in organizing a company of militia as a home guard in defense of the island. For many years he was postmaster of Emerald P. O. and also a justice of the peace, in which capacities he performed his duties in a faithful and obliging manner. As an authority on the early history of Amherst Island and surrounding district he was unsurpassed, being a careful compiler of all that occurred in the way of important events. In his demise a landmark has been removed, in that he was one of the oldest native born residents of the island, one who knew and had experienced all the trials and hardships of life in a new settlement. With a life rounded out to beyond even the Psalmist's ultra limit he has been gathered to his fathers, leaving as a monument to his fellow citizens a life of spotless integrity.

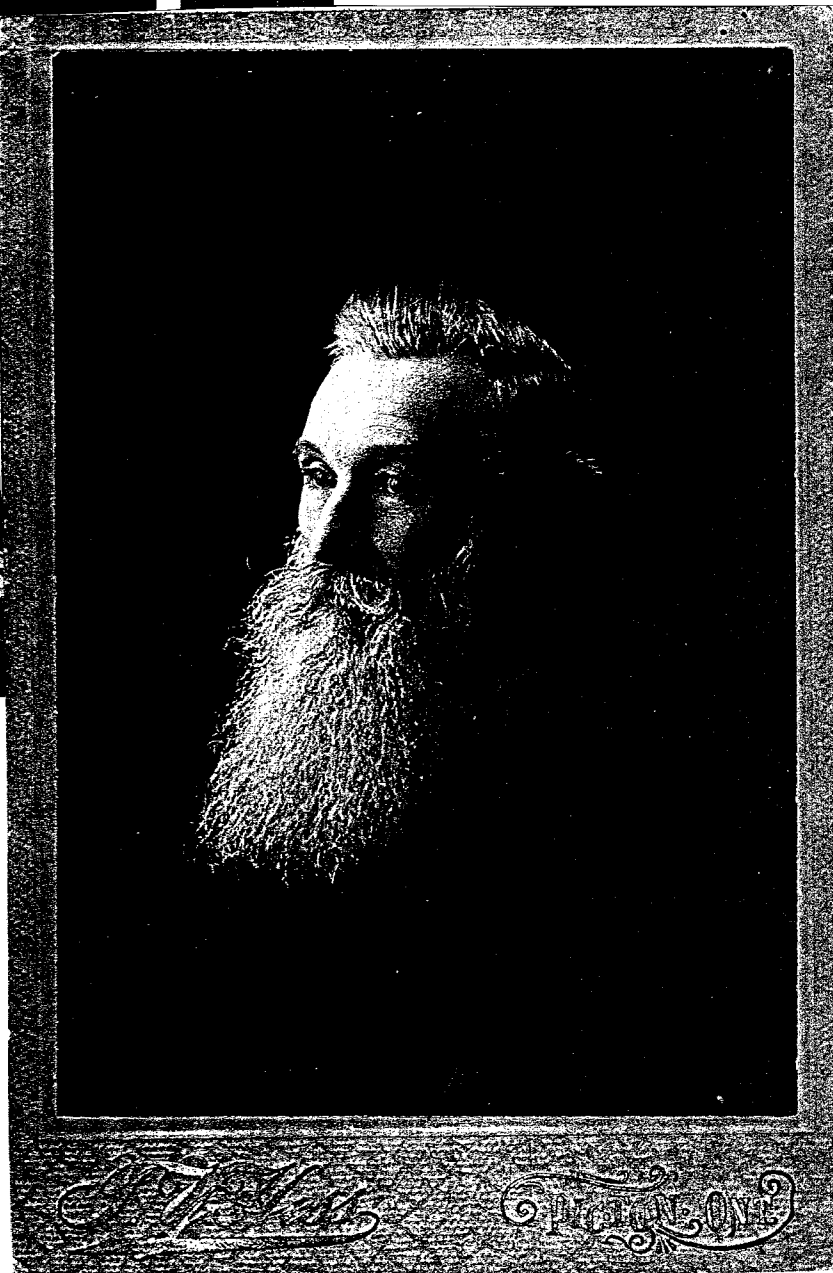

Obituary
ROBERT McCAY.
The citizens of Napanee were greatly surprised when the intelligence passed through
afternoon last, that Robert McCay was dead.
His friends could scarcely realize the fact,
in e he was seen on the streets in the fact,
tomed good health but a few days before.
In company with three other townsmen he
drove out in the country on Thursday, 15th
inst., to attend an auction sale of farm prop-
erty, but finding the roads impassable, on
account of the snow blockade, were forced to
turn back. On the way home Mr. McCay
received a severe chill. He took his bed im-
mediately upon his arrival home. Medical
aid was at once procured, and every possible
effort made to arrest the development of
pneumonia, that somewhat prevalent and
terribly dangerous outgrowth of severe colds.
All efforts proved useless, however, pleurisy
assisted in the destruction of his vital forces,
and on Sunday afternoon at 2 o'clock he
passed peacefully away, after an exceedingly
painful illness.

Robert McCay second son of the late Ash-
ael E. McCay, was born on the old homestead
in North Fredericksburgh, in the year 1835.
There were four children—three sons and
one daughter. The daughter, Mrs. Charles
Algure, died some five years ago. The two
sons—Jas. M. and E. Murney—still survive,
the former, the eldest, a well-known resident
of Napanee; the latter a resident of Lindsay.
Some thirty years ago, when O. T. Pruyn,
Esq., was appointed sheriff for this county,
Robert McCay was appointed sheriff's bailliff.
This position he held, with a few months'
exception, until the hour of his death. It
will be extremely difficult to replace him.
Notwithstanding the unpleasant duties de-
ceased was frequently called upon to perform
in the discharge of his lawful work, he always
fearlessly but cautiously performed those
duties to the sheriff's entire satisfaction, at
the same time retaining the friendship and
good-will of the parties with whom he was
called upon to deal. For many years he has
been known as a successful auctioneer. His
well-known voice and oft-repeated expression
—Going! going! gone!—familiar in every
section of this county, shall now be heard
no more. The auctioneer himself has gone,
after sixty years of active life in our midst.
In 1859 Mr. McCay married Maria Aishton,
daughter of Dr. Aishton, of Bath, who with
two sons, Will and Fred (supposed to be in
South America), survive him. His grand-
son, Frankie McCay, a bright little fellow
now thirteen years of age, has been a great
favorite with his grandfather for some years,
and though young, keenly feels the loss of
his best friend.

For more than thirty years Mr. McCay has
been a member of the School Trustee Board
of our town, and has always manifested a
deep interest in the schools. He has been in
the past chairman of the board, and its at-
tendance at the funeral in a body, as
well as the closing of all the schools and
attendance of teachers and scholars, attest
the sincere desire of all connected with our
town schools to pay the departed their last
tribute of respect for his excellent services.
The funeral took place on Tuesday at 10
o'clock from his late residence, Piety Hill,
where a brief, impressive service was con-
ducted by Rev. S. J. Shorey, assisted by
Rev. J. J. Rae, after which the remains were
conveyed to the vault of the Napanee cem-
tery. Nearly all citizens attended, and
formed one of the largest funeral processions
witnessed in many years. THE BEAVER
joins with the citizens of both town and
country in extending heartfelt sympathy to
the widow and family in their extremely
sudden and sad bereavement.
