## Stockton and The Civil War

We are pleased to have the opportunity to welcome local author **Delmar McComb** as the featured speaker for our monthly meeting for **February**.

Mr. McComb, a former history instructor at Delta College, recently published a new volume on the aspects of life in Stockton during this nation's Civil War. The book, ***Blow! Bugles! Blow!: A History of Stockton During the Civil War, The Final Phase***, takes up the narrative following his previously published volume, ***Beat! Beat! Drums!***

The new publication was mentioned in conjunction with the recent film about Abraham Lincoln in an article in [The Record](#). This book is the product of painstakingly detailed research, combing through microfilmed Stockton area newspapers during the last phase of the Civil War, from 1863 to 1865. The resulting narrative helps you place yourself in those times in a very familiar place: our own town. As far removed as the conflict may have seemed from our Stockton locale, Delmar McComb's research gives that sense of how the struggle did, indeed, touch home.

Join us on February 28 at 6:00 p.m. at our **new meeting location**, the **Margaret Troke** branch of the public library. In addition to his presentation to the Society, Mr. McComb will be on hand for a book signing, with copies of his book available for purchase.
