Column 2 - Location State/County - List the State and County where the families resided, if known also list immigrant's country of origin

Column 3 - Times Span - Merely approximate the time period they lived in these areas.

MISS GENIE AND THE CASE STUDY "The Problem With Pauline" - Part Three

Let's see....where did I leave you hanging in the last issue? Oh, I remember. I was telling you about all the property Mrs. Helen Hunt had purchased in downtown Boise, Idaho.

Our mysterious Helen shelled out over \$750,000 during a 10 year period (1905-1915) to purchase prime lots in downtown Boise, Idaho.

The death certificate for Helen Hunt finally arrives and are you ready for this? Helen Hunt and Pauline Sanford are one and the same person.

The death certificate names her parents as J. P. Sharon and Mary Brice. I immediately contacted the clerk of the probate court in Ada County and requested the probate file for Helen Hunt. The death certificate gave the name of the funeral home: Summers Funeral Home, Boise, Idaho. There is film for this funeral home's records from the FHL, but I could not, I would not wait 4-6 weeks to look at it. A quick look in the yellow pages informed me that Summers Funeral Home was still in business. One phone call and one email later and I had the file they had on Helen Hunt.

Name of deceased: Helen Hunt

Charge to: John Sharon

Address: c/o Mrs. A. C. Prouty Order given by: Dick Childs Name of father: J.P. Sharon Name of mother: Mary Brice

Total Cost: \$58 (Note: John Sharon had to pay the \$58 in 3 payments over 1

years time)

The name Dick Childs should ring a bell. In the article about the death of Helen Hunt (part 1), it mentions that a neighbor had noticed the fire and called for help. Only a surname was given - Childs. The John Sharon who is responsible for paying the bill must be Pauline's brother John because her father John had died 11 years previously. Mrs. C. A. Prouty? Well that is Pauline's niece Frieda, the daughter of her sister Ada.

The funeral home record gave me the name of the cemetery - Morris Hill Cemetery in Boise. Another phone call and another email later and I had all the proof I needed. The record at Morris Hill Cemetery named the person in question exactly like this:

HELEN (PAULINE SHARON SANFORD) HUNT

The woman in the cemetery office also told me that no headstone had ever been purchased and to this day there is no marker.

The probate file arrives and it includes the Last Will and Testement of Helen Hunt. In it she leaves \$500 to each of her 4 nieces: Frieda Markgraf, Marie Markgraf, Helen Markgraf and Kathryn Markgraf. The rest of her property - real and personal she leaves to her two sisters: Ada Markgraf and Minnie Herhold to share and share alike. Ada is named executor. There are a few other papers, but not what I am looking for - the inventory of her estate and how it was dispersed.

Well all this wonderful documentation only leads to more questions: If Helen/Pauline was as wealthy as it appears, why did her poor brother have to pay the \$58 for her funeral? Her will specifies that those costs be paid from her estate.

It most certainly appears that her friends in Boise and her family in Kansas City were fully aware that Pauline Sharon Sanford was Helen Hunt. Why on earth did she use both names?

All this detective work has been great and most useful, but I have certainly strayed from the original goal - Where is Pauline from 1885 to 1905? The new questions that have come about as a result of the investigation are much more interesting. Did Pauline and George ever divorce? Why was George such a close friend of the family when she was no where to be found?

I'll leave you with one more newspaper article I found. It is dated 13 June 1908 and it is in the society column of the Idaho Statesman.

"Mrs. Mary Sharon and Mrs. Minnie Vestal are guests of Helen Hunt"

Mrs. Mary Sharon is Pauline/Helen's mother and Minnie Vestal is her youngest sister. Her family knew what was going on with Pauline/Helen.

I could close the case at this point, we know that Pauline is Helen, but I just can't do that. Could you?

In the next issue - George's story, wait until you see what I found out about him!
