Papal bull to the abbot and convent of Hales [Halesowen], giving them license to impropriate the churches of Hales and Waleshale [Wassall], in the dioceses of Worcester and Lichfield. Dated at Orvieto, the 12th of the Kalends of October, in the first year of Pope Martin's pontificate.

Papal bull on behalf of Reymond Aggerii, dean of le Puy (?) (Anycien' 1), the pope's chaplain, for his safe conduct and maintenance while in England. Dated at Orvieto, the Ides of October, in the first year of Pope Martin's pontificate.

Fol. 124d. Letter from the said Reymond to the Bishop of Worcester, touching the liberation of Almaric de Montfort. Dated at Worcester, Friday after the Epiphany, 1281.

Papal bull touching the liberation of Almaric de Montfort. Dated at Orvieto, the 12th of the Kalends of October, in the first year of Pope Martin's pontificate <sup>2</sup>.

Fol. 125d. Memorandum, that on the 5th of the Ides of January, at Alnynech' [Alvechurch], Henry, rector of the church of Langeberg [Longborough], confessed before the bishop and other clerks that he had knowingly communicated with those excommunicated persons who disturbed Adam de Avebury, chaplain, rector of the church of Campeden, in the possession of his church, and nevertheless afterwards performed divine service. On account of which irregularity he was suspended until he should merit absolution.

Fol. 126 (cxxv). Appointment by Adam de Avebury, rector of Campeden, of John de Staneweye, rector of the church of Mathine [Mathon], in the suit between the same Adam and Edmund de Mortimer, who asserts he is rector of the same church. The Ides of January.
