

again because he wrote openly that he had done this to Peter de Pyriton, clerk of the chapter of Worcester, the abbot of Radyng granted commissions, with the consent of the clerks aforesaid, to the Archdeacon of Oxford and the dean of the monastery of Evesham jointly and severally.

1290. Fol. 312*d*. Commission by the abbot of Reading to the Archdeacon of Oxford, in the diocese of Lincoln, and to the dean of the monastery of Evesham, in accordance with the above. Dated at Radyng, the 16th of the Kalends of October, 1289.

Memorandum, that the Bishop of London gave a like commission, notwithstanding that he had before written to the prior of Worcester that he had given a commission to the Archdeacon of Barksir', at the instance of the Bishop of Worcester, and that the Archdeacon of Barksir' excused himself.

Letters certificatory reciting the above proceedings and the citation of John de Ebroyc', dwelling at Kemes', Walter de Berton', dwelling at Bredon, Ralph de Vasto Prato, dwelling at Wythindon, John de Staneweye, dwelling at Weston on Avon, and Peter de Leycestr', dwelling at Wodebroc'. Dated at Wych', on the vigil of the Apostles Simon and Jude.

Fol. 313*d*. Declaration by the Archbishop of Canterbury that William de Monte Caniso and Amy de Hull lawfully contracted matrimony in the diocese of Worcester, on Tuesday after the feast of St. Bartholomew the Apostle, 1279. Dated at Mortlake, the 10th of the Kalends of August, 1283.

Sentence of G., bishop of Worcester, in accordance with the above declaration¹.

Fol. 314 (cccxv). Commission to Gyffredus de Vezano to act as the Pope's proctor in England. Dated at Rieti, the Nones of June, in the first year of Pope Nicholas IV.
