

1292. Institution of Elias, called Golafre, clerk, to the church of Weston juxta Tettebur', at the presentation of John la Bret. The 10th of the Kalends of September.

On the same date the bishop committed the custody of the church of Hampton Moisi and of Nicholas de la Heose, clerk, presented to the same, to Nigel, called le Walleys, clerk.

John de Stratford, clerk, had on Tuesday before the feast of St. Michael possession of the church of Badmynton then vacant, by provision of the Pope.

Institution of John de Sancta Brigida, chaplain, to the church of St. John of Bristol, at the presentation of the abbot and convent of Theok' [Tewkesbury]. The 3rd of the Ides of October, 1292.

Institution of Adam de Moreton, chaplain, to the church of St. Owen of Bristol, at the presentation of the abbot and convent of Theok'. The same date.

On the Kalends of November, the bishop committed the custody of the church of Morton Bagot, to Henry de Lich', clerk, because the true rector of the same has given it over as derelict (*quia verus rector ejusdem habet eam pro derelicta*).

Institution of Walter de Sutton, priest, to the chapel of Walton de Eyvyll [Walton d'Eivile]. The 4th of the Nones of November.

On Wednesday before the feast of the Blessed Martin, at Bredon, the bishop conferred the church of Hembur' juxta Wich' [Hanbury], vacant by the death of Nicholas de Ayllesbur', made a prebend in the church of Westbur', on Peter de Escote, clerk, in the presence of John de Stanweya, and Robert de Dersete, in the chamber of the bishop at the third hour of the day.
